BOOK STUDY AND MEET THE AUTHOR OF "HOMECOMING"

During the Lent book study, we had the privilege of inviting Rev. Dr. Gordon Smith to fly to Ontario from Calgary to meet us at the "Meet the Author" book study. This fall, we have another incredible opportunity to meet a profound artist and author, Heather Beamish. Her work is birthed out of the rich and intersectional lens of her Queer, Black, Indigenous, and female identities.

"Homecoming" is all about self-discovery and gaining confidence. After years of ministering in Evangelical churches, Heather reached a crossroads where she had to confront her queer identity. Faced with a difficult choice between living a lie or leaving the only place she had ever truly belonged, she bravely chose liberation. "Homecoming" is her story of finding her identity and summoning the courage to be herself. She discusses embracing our differences and the importance of standing up for who you are.

In "Homecoming," Heather beautifully articulates how a number of traumatic experiences from her childhood left her feeling helpless and vulnerable to the 'big bad monster' called life. It's a narrative many of us can relate to—how tragic moments can roll in, shatter everything that was safe and familiar, and leave us feeling powerless. Heather spent years taking a backseat to her own story, but she also recognized her own competence and capability. She reminds us that knowing the type of person you want to be and being that person are two different realities. Her therapy journey allowed her to bridge that gap.

As we embark on this book study, let's draw inspiration from Heather Beamish's story of healing, self-discovery, and the power of reflection. We hope you'll join us in this enriching journey as we engage with "Homecoming" by Heather Beamish. December 8th, 2:00 pm (online via Zoom). We'll conclude our study by exploring the final chapters and reflecting on the book's profound messages.


A NOTE FROM LEIGH



ASSETS AND ADMINISTRATION

Building Care and Use

The committee includes Chair, Dave Argue, members, Doug Alder, Bob Shortreed and Gary Montgomery and our Administrator Tanya Melbourne. They have been active in assisting with the preparation for the Montessori School, as well as looking after the routine day to day operational issues.

Items accomplished

In early 2023 the outdoor lighting around the building was upgraded for improved safety and security. Additional lighting will be added before the end of Daylight-Saving Time.

The Dream Tree Montessori (new name) nursery school received its final approval in the last week of June and commenced operations on July 1st. They completed many renovations to their space including painting, flooring, a fenced outdoor play area, repairs and new railing on the stairs leading to the lower yard, grading, re-sodding and a new walkway to the North Entrance. Most recently they installed air conditioning in their space.

Special thanks to volunteers: Diane McLeod and Lucina Fraser for planting and maintaining our beautiful gardens, Ian McLeod and Bob Campolin for mowing the lawns and, Nobue Khan for organizing the Community Garden again this year.

Renters

Our major users of space are now The Dream Tree Montessori School and The Tree of Life Korean Presbyterian Church. During the summer the Pedalheads Bicycle Day Camp used our parking lot and auditorium. We also provide space for The Boy Scouts, an outside meditation group, Gamblers Anonymous, Moderation Management, Opera York and, from time to time, other users of space.

Technology

Further upgrades have been implemented in the computer and A/V equipment in the sanctuary to improve the quality of live-streaming our services. Online attendance continues to be preferred by many members who are unable to attend worship in the sanctuary because of health or distance reasons. We are encouraged by the continuing increase of in-person attendance at worship.

We are working on improving our building security system with the addition of security cameras. After recent incidents of intruders causing nuisances and damage on our property, we had the underbrush and low branches removed at the top of the hill at Elgin Street. Since doing this there has been no recurrence of the problem.

The solar panels and related control equipment have been sold. The panels and attachment hardware have been removed from the auditorium.

We continue to enjoy our role as co-chairs of this pillar, and we appreciate the support that we receive from everyone.

- Click on the box to "accept terms" and then click "Support a Group". It will then tell you that your account has been set up and an email has been sent.
- Go to your email and click on the link to confirm your email.

- For shipping, select "direct shipping" and add your address. You will be charged postal rates.
- For payment "Online Bill Payment" is best for TUC (most donations) and there are instructions on how to set it up. This is like a regular bill payment from your bank account.
