

FROM THE PASTOR



Today we celebrate the Third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday. "Gaudete" is a Latin word, meaning "rejoice." The Christian steward should be characterized by a spirit of rejoicing.

Our First Reading, from Isaiah, expresses a fitting motto for us. "I rejoice heartily in the Lord, in my God is the joy of my soul." It is God Who is the source of our joy and

contentment — not things or achievements or comfort, but our relationship with God.

This is why stewards can share so freely of their time, talents, and material possessions — because ultimately, we are not attached to these things. We recognize them as good gifts from our loving Father, but we are attached to the Giver of the gifts, not the gifts themselves. This allows for great freedom in life and the capacity for great joy in the Lord.

In fact, we can become like John the Baptist, in today's Gospel passage from the Book of John. We read this description of the prophet: "He came for testimony, to testify to the light... He was not the light but came to testify to the light." This is our calling too — to testify to the Light, our wonderful Savior — by the way we make use of the time, talent, and treasure He has entrusted to our care.

When God Himself is the source of our joy, it cannot be taken away from us. There is still time, this Advent season, to clear away any "clutter" in our lives that may take our focus away from Him. Let us strive to detach from any of these things so that we can be free to truly rejoice in God on Christmas Day. © Catholic Stewardship Consultants, 2023

Pastoral Pondering - Continuing with the discussion of *Offenses Against the Dignity of Marriage*, the Catechism next addresses the issue of divorce. Paragraph 2382 and 2384 state:

The Lord Jesus insisted on the original intention of the Creator who willed that marriage be indissoluble. He abrogates the accommodations that had slipped into the old Law. Between the baptized, "a ratified and consummated marriage cannot be dissolved by any human power or for any reason other than death."

Divorce is a grave offense against the natural law. It claims to break the contract, to which the spouses freely consented, to live with each other till death. Divorce does injury to the covenant of salvation, of which sacramental marriage is the sign. Contracting a new union, even if it is recognized by civil law, adds to the gravity of the rupture: the remarried spouse is then in a situation of public and permanent adultery:

If a husband, separated from his wife,

approaches another woman, he is an adulterer because he makes that woman commit adultery, and the woman who lives with him is an adulteress, because she has drawn another's husband to herself.

There has been a lot of ink spilled in the last ten years on the topic of the Church and divorce, especially in terms of the impact that divorce has on sacramental communion. This has led to confusion at times. We live at a time when the divorce rate among those who identify as Catholic is not significantly different from the general population. At the same time, a higher percentage of young people are simply choosing not to marry, which, as noted a couple of weeks ago, is problematic on many levels

It's important to remember that despite the best of intentions, human relationships fail at times. There are a whole host of factors that contribute to this, but all of them are rooted in the original fall of man. We are all sinners and without the help of God's grace, marriage is almost impossible. The Church recognizes this as well and, historically, has allowed in some situations spouses to separate while the bond of marriage remains. She also recognizes that at times, one party wanted divorce while the other spouse wanted to preserve the union. A misconception that I have encountered over the years are those who, even though they had not attempted a second marriage after divorce, believed themselves to be excommunicated or, at least, separated from the sacraments. This is not the case. As long as the person is single, they are free to receive the sacraments, assuming they are properly disposed otherwise.

If you are struggling in your marriage, there is help available. Retrouvaille is a wonderful option for those who want to work on their marriage and address problems and difficulties. We are also fortunate to have some wonderful counselors in our community dedicated to helping couples in crisis. Don't wait to reach out if you need help.



What is Gaudete Sunday?

This third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday, meaning "Rejoice!"

The first two weeks of advent were about the second coming of Christ. But this week the focus shifts to preparing for the joyful birth of Christ.

The priests and deacons wear rose-colored vestments, flowers return to the altar and it's time to light the pink candle on our Advent wreath.

If you come to the 9 am Mass, you will hear the choir sing the 16th century Christmas carol "Gaudete."

Gaudete, gaudete! Christus est natus Ex Maria virgine, gaudete!

Hoc quod optabamus,
Carmina lætitice
Devote reddamus.

Deus homo factus est Natura mirante, Mundus renovatus est A Christo regnante.

Therefore, let our assembly Now sing in brightness Let it bless the Lord: Salvation to our King.





ERO CRAS: Tomorrow, I Will Come

The O Antiphons: December 17-23

The Roman Catholic Church has something special for us this final week of Advent.

While we are all familiar with the final O Antiphon, "O Come, O Come Emmanuel," there is actually a verse for each of the days leading up to Christmas. They are a part of the sacred prayers known as the Liturgy of the Hours and have been prayed since the 4th century. Each antiphon is a reference to Jesus and contains one of His attributes noted in Scripture.

If you take the first letter of each antiphon name and write them backwards, you get "ERO CRAS." This means "Tomorrow, I will come" in Latin.

How to Pray the O Antiphons:

These short prayers are recited prior to praying the Magnificat (Canticle of Mary) during evening prayer (vespers) December 17-23. Each antiphon is addressed to God using a noble title for the Messiah, each antiphon petitions Him to come save His people, and each is tied to Mary because she is the vessel through which the Savior will be born.

Dec 17: O Sapientia (Wisdom)

O Wisdom of our God Most High, guiding creation with power and love: come to teach us the path of knowledge!

Dec 18: O Adonai (Lord)

O Leader of the House of Israel, giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai: come to rescue us with your mighty power!

Dec 19: O Radix Jesse (Root of Jesse)

O Root of Jesse's stem, sign of God's love for all his people; come to save us without delay!

Dec 20: O Clavis David (Key of David)

O Key of David, opening the gates of God's eternal Kingdom: come and free the prisoners of darkness!

Dec 21: O Oriens (Radiant Dawn)

O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

Dec 22: O Rex Gentium (King of all Nations)

O King of all nations and keystone of the Church: come and save man, whom you formed from the dust!

Dec 23: O Emmanuel (God With Us)

O Emmanuel, our King and Giver of Law: come to save us, Lord our God!

DEL PASTOR



Hoy celebramos el Tercer Domingo de Adviento, el Domingo de Gaudete. "Gaudete" es una palabra latina que significa "regocijarse". El mayordomo cristiano debe caracterizarse por un espíritu de regocijo.

Nuestra primera lectura, de Isaías, expresa un lema apropiado para nosotros. "Me regocijo de corazón en el Señor, en mi Dios está el gozo de mi alma". Es Dios quien es la fuente de nuestro gozo y contentamiento, no cosas,

logros o consuelo, sino nuestra relación con Dios.

Esta es la razón por la que los mayordomos pueden compartir tan libremente su tiempo, talentos y posesiones materiales, porque en última instancia, no estamos apegados a estas cosas. Los reconocemos como buenos regalos de nuestro amoroso Padre, pero estamos apegados al Dador de los dones, no a los dones mismos. Esto permite una gran libertad en la vida y la capacidad de un gran gozo en el Señor.

De hecho, podemos llegar a ser como Juan el Bautista, en el pasaje evangélico de hoy del libro de Juan. Leemos esta descripción del profeta: "Vino para dar testimonio, para dar testimonio de la luz... Él no era la luz, sino que vino a dar testimonio de la luz". Este es también nuestro llamado: dar testimonio de la Luz, nuestro maravilloso Salvador, por la forma en que hacemos uso del tiempo, el talento y el tesoro que El ha confiado a nuestro cuidado.

Cuando Dios mismo es la fuente de nuestro gozo, no nos lo pueden quitar. Todavía hay tiempo, en esta temporada de Adviento, para despejar cualquier "desorden" en nuestras vidas que pueda desviar nuestro enfoque de El. Esforcémonos por desprendernos de cualquiera de estas cosas para que podamos ser libres para regocijarnos verdaderamente en Dios el día de Navidad. © Consultores de Mayordomía Católica, 2023

Reflexiones pastorales - Continuando con la discusión de *las ofensas contra la dignidad del matrimonio*, el Catecismo aborda a continuación el tema del divorcio. Los párrafos 2382 y 2384 establecen:

El Señor Jesús insistió en la intención original del Creador, que quiso que el matrimonio fuera indisoluble. Abroga las acomodaciones que se habían deslizado en la antigua Ley. Entre los bautizados, "un matrimonio ratificado y consumado no puede ser disuelto por ningún poder humano ni por ninguna otra razón que no sea la muerte".

El divorcio es una grave ofensa contra la ley natural. Pretende romper el contrato, al que los cónyuges consintieron libremente, de vivir juntos hasta la muerte. El divorcio daña el pacto de salvación, del cual el matrimonio sacramental es la señal. La contratación de una nueva unión, aunque esté reconocida por el derecho civil, aumenta la gravedad de la ruptura: el cónyuge

que se ha vuelto a casar se encuentra entonces en una situación de adulterio público y permanente:

Si un marido, separado de su mujer, se acerca a otra mujer, es adúltero porque hace que esa mujer cometa adulterio, y la mujer que vive con él es adúltera, porque ha atraído hacia sí al marido de otro.

En los últimos diez años se ha derramado mucha tinta sobre el tema de la Iglesia y el divorcio, especialmente en términos del impacto que el divorcio tiene en la comunión sacramental. Esto ha llevado a la confusión en ocasiones. Vivimos en una época en la que la tasa de divorcio entre los que se identifican como católicos no es significativamente diferente de la de la población general. Al mismo tiempo, un mayor porcentaje de jóvenes simplemente opta por no casarse, lo que, como se señaló hace un par de semanas, es problemático en muchos niveles.

Es importante recordar que, a pesar de las mejores intenciones, las relaciones humanas a veces fracasan. Hay toda una serie de factores que contribuyen a esto, pero todos ellos tienen sus raíces en la caída original del hombre. Todos somos pecadores y sin la ayuda de la gracia de Dios, el matrimonio es casi imposible. La Iglesia también lo reconoce y, históricamente, ha permitido en algunas situaciones que los cónyuges se separen mientras se mantiene el vínculo del matrimonio. También reconoce que, a veces, una de las partes quería divorciarse mientras que el otro cónyuge quería preservar la unión. Un concepto erróneo que he encontrado a lo largo de los años son aquellos que, a pesar de que no habían intentado un segundo matrimonio después del divorcio, se creían excomulgados o, al menos, separados de los sacramentos. Este no es el caso. Mientras la persona sea soltera, es libre de recibir los sacramentos, siempre que esté debidamente dispuesta de otra manera.

Si está luchando en su matrimonio, hay ayuda disponible. Retrouvaille es una opción maravillosa para aquellos que quieren trabajar en su matrimonio y abordar problemas y dificultades. También tenemos la suerte de contar con algunos consejeros maravillosos en nuestra comunidad dedicados a ayudar a las parejas en crisis. No esperes más para comunicarte con nosotros si necesitas ayuda.
