

Guidelines for Communion For Catholics

- To be in a state of grace, that is to say, to be free from any unconfessed mortal sin.
- To abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from any food and drink, with the exception of water and medicine.
- To know what you are receiving and to approach the altar with devotion.
- St. Mark uses altar rails. Please go to the far end of the rail and either kneel to receive Holy Communion on the tongue or remain standing to receive in your hand. The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended.

For Non-Catholics: We welcome you to Holy Mass and are glad you are here. Please feel free to participate by singing, standing, kneeling, etc. However, the reception of Holy Communion is reserved for Catholics in a state of grace. At the time of Communion, please feel free to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest for a blessing or remain in your pew. (See page 1302 in the hymnal.)

FROM THE PASTOR.



Today, we celebrate the Epiphany of our Lord. The Gospel account of the three magi traveling to meet Baby Jesus is one that we know well. Yet, when we pause to reflect on this moment when these men met Christ for the first time, we recognize that there is much to be said for us still today.

When the magi entered the house, it says, "they saw the child with

Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage." Clearly these men knew that they were in the presence of their King. They also came bearing gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh, which symbolize Christ's kingship, divinity, and humanity.

Christ is still manifesting Himself to us today. We enter God's house weekly, and we are in His presence. When we meet Him, do we offer Him our gifts — our time, talent, and treasure? As Christian stewards, we are called to respond with love, reverence, and gratitude.

Let us prepare our hearts to receive Christ's many manifestations in our lives. We just need a grateful disposition to receive them. ©Catholic Stewardship Consultants, 2023

Pastoral Pondering

I want to wish everyone a very happy New Year. As we continue to celebrate our Lord's nativity, the Epiphany reminds us that Emmanuel came to save the world. He offers His gift of salvation to all who willingly hear His voice and open their hearts to His message of love. In this New Year, let us all seek to be ambassadors of that message so that the world may come to know Him more intensely by the way we live our Christian lives.

Today, I also wanted to say a bit more about *Fiducia supplicans*, the recent document from the Dicastery of the Doctrine of the Faith concerning blessings and those in irregular situations in terms of sacramental Communion. The document specifically addressed those with same sex attraction (SSA) living in a stable relationship as well as those who because of divorce or some other issue cannot participate in sacramental Communion.

Needless to say, the document has garnered lots of press coverage, thousands upon thousands of words of printed commentary, as well as any number of responses on social media. Our vicar general, Monsignor Patrick Winslow, wrote a concise response that was published on the Diocesan website and the *Catholic News Herald* which summarized the main points of the document. I won't repeat all of that here. The US bishops also have a statement on their website from Bishop Robert Barron that you might also find helpful.

The problem with the document, and to be honest, much of the magisterial utterances during this pontificate, is it leaves a great deal unsaid that should be said. Confusion and wonderment arise from such statements which is the exact opposite of what the Holy See is supposed to be promoting, unity. The faith is not something to be toyed with. It is a treasure that is to be handed down and preserved. When we see divergent responses from bodies

of bishops around the world, it again only raises questions of, "How is this Catholic? How is this promoting unity?" The only answer is that it is not.

Let me say clearly, there is no doubt that Jesus Christ came to save all. It is also true, however, that He never failed to unite that love with the revealed truth as He revealed it. I personally over the years have worked with countless people who have sincerely struggled with SSA as well as those who, sometimes through no fault of their own or simple ignorance, have ended up living in objectively sinful situations. Nonetheless, when presented with the truth, they have heroically tried to correct course and overcome whatever obstacles might be present. Jesus loved, and Jesus forgave. But He also, after telling the woman caught in adultery, "neither do I condemn you," reminded to go "and from now on avoid this sin."

Only Christ's truthful love can heal us. We cannot simply affirm people's sin in the name of being loving. Rather we are called to preach the truthfulness of the Gospel as the medicine for our sin. When we truthfully love someone in the name of Jesus then we are healed. When we try to separate the truth from love we only hurt those we try to love and ourselves. Christ loves the woman caught in adultery. That being said, He also calls her to a life with him and not the sin she is suffering.

Both the Diocese of Charlotte and our parish offer various supports for folks struggling with SSA, those dealing with the pain of divorce and those who are in need of help to regularize an irregular marriage situation. We are all sinners in need of God's love and mercy, but receiving that mercy requires true contrition and a desire to change. The difficulty with FS is that lip service is given to this while at the same time undermining this foundational truth. FS mentions blessing the couple but makes no mention of ongoing support. If we study the sad path taken by some of our Protestant brothers and sisters in this particular area, changes were made for the sake of pastoral concern and solicitude which eventually turned into a wholesale abandonment of Traditional Faith and a fracturing of the Anglican communion around the world. We already see that in the disparate responses to FS from Africa on the one hand and Western Europe on the other. Let us pray that God who is faithful will guard and protect us from following that same path of fracture and dissolution.



Epiphany: Bless Your Home for 2024

Place God at the entrance of your home and put your family under His protection.

There is a special blessing for water on the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord because of its connection to the baptism of Jesus, which we celebrate on Monday. This ancient rite of the blessing of waters by a priest, with its powerful prayers of exorcism, renders Epiphany water more spiritually potent than the holy water which is available in the Narthex.

There is also a long-standing tradition of marking churches, homes, schools or other buildings with a special marking using blessed chalk. You will see these markings above the doors of our parish buildings and schools.

Epiphany is the traditional time of the year to bless your home using Epiphany water and blessed chalk. Kits with blessing instructions, Epiphany water and blessed chalk are available after all Masses this weekend — there is enough in the kit to bless several homes or buildings.

The holy water container in the back of the church will also contain Epiphany water this week.

This is a reminder that the spiritual battle is always going on around us. Inviting the Lord to bless and protect our homes and our families, is an important defense as we strive to follow the Lord and fight the enemy. — Fr. John Putnam

"Besides the times of year that have their own distinctive character, there remain in the yearly cycle thirty-three or thirty-four weeks in which no particular



Padre Pio: Between Heaven and Earth



Exodus 90 helps you rule your passions.

What is Exodus 90?



Sin embargo, cuando nos detenemos a reflexionar sobre este momento en que estos hombres se encontraron con Cristo por primera vez, reconocemos que todavía hoy hay mucho que decir por nosotros. Cuando los magos entraron en la casa,

dice, "vieron al niño con María, su madre. Se postraron y le rindieron homenaje". Claramente, estos hombres sabían que estaban en presencia de su Rey. También vinieron con regalos de oro, incienso y mirra, que simbolizan la realeza, la divinidad y la humanidad de Cristo.

Reflexión pastoral

Quiero desearles a todos un muy feliz Año Nuevo. Mientras continuamos celebrando la natividad de nuestro Señor, la Epifanía nos recuerda que Emmanuel vino a salvar al mundo. Él ofrece Su regalo de salvación a todos los que voluntariamente escuchan Su voz y abren sus corazones a Su mensaje de amor. En este Año Nuevo, busquemos todos ser embajadores de ese mensaje para que el mundo pueda llegar a conocerlo más intensamente por la forma en que vivimos nuestras vidas cristianas.

Hoy también he querido decir un poco más sobre Fiducia supplicans, el reciente documento del Dicasterio para la Doctrina de la Fe sobre las bendiciones y las personas en situación irregular en cuanto a la comunión sacramental. El documento se dirigía específicamente a aquellos con atracción hacia el mismo sexo (AMS) que viven en una relación estable, así como a aquellos que debido a un divorcio o algún otro problema no pueden participar en la comunión sacramental.

No hace falta decir que el documento ha obtenido mucha cobertura de prensa, miles y miles de palabras de comentarios impresos, así como un gran número de respuestas en las redes sociales. Nuestro vicario general, Monseñor Patrick Winslow, escribió una respuesta concisa que fue publicada en el sitio web diocesano y en el *Catholic News Herald* que resumía los puntos principales del documento. No voy a repetir todo eso aquí. Los obispos de los Estados Unidos también tienen una declaración en su sitio web del obispo Robert Barron que también puede resultarle útil.

El problema con el documento, y para ser honesto, con gran parte de las declaraciones magistrales durante este pontificado, es que deja mucho sin decir que debería decirse. La confusión y el asombro surgen de tales declaraciones, que es exactamente lo contrario de lo que se supone que la Santa Sede está promoviendo, la unidad. La fe no es algo con lo que se pueda jugar. Es un tesoro que debe ser transmitido y preservado. Cuando vemos respuestas divergentes de los cuerpos de obispos de todo

el mundo, de nuevo solo surgen preguntas de: "¿Cómo es esto católico? ¿Cómo promueve esto la unidad? La única respuesta es que no lo es.

Permítanme decirlo claramente, no hay duda de que Jesucristo vino a salvar a todos. Sin embargo, también es cierto que nunca dejó de unir ese amor con la verdad revelada tal como la reveló. Personalmente, a lo largo de los años, he trabajado con innumerables personas que han luchado sinceramente con la AMS, así como con aquellos que, a veces sin culpa suya o por simple ignorancia, han terminado viviendo en situaciones objetivamente pecaminosas. Sin embargo, cuando se les ha presentado la verdad, han tratado heroicamente de corregir el rumbo y superar cualquier obstáculo que pudiera estar presente. Jesús amó y Jesús perdonó. Pero también, después de decirle a la mujer sorprendida en adulterio, "ni yo te condeno", le recordó que se fuera "y de ahora en adelante evite este pecado".


Solo el amor verdadero de Cristo puede sanarnos. No podemos simplemente afirmar el pecado de las personas en nombre de ser amorosos. Más bien, estamos llamados a predicar la veracidad del Evangelio como la medicina para nuestro pecado. Cuando amamos sinceramente a alguien en el nombre de Jesús, entonces somos sanados. Cuando tratamos de separar la verdad del amor, solo lastimamos a aquellos a quienes tratamos de amar y a nosotros mismos. Cristo ama a la mujer sorprendida en adulterio. Dicho esto, Él también la llama a una vida con él y no al pecado que ella está sufriendo.

Tanto la Diócesis de Charlotte como nuestra parroquia ofrecen varios apoyos para las personas que luchan con la atracción al mismo sexo, aquellos que lidian con el dolor del divorcio y aquellos que necesitan ayuda para regularizar una situación de matrimonio irregular. Todos somos pecadores que necesitan el amor y la misericordia de Dios, pero recibir esa misericordia requiere verdadera contrición y un deseo de cambiar. La dificultad con la FS es que se habla de esto de boquilla y, al mismo tiempo, se socava esta verdad fundamental. FS menciona la bendición de la pareja, pero no menciona el apoyo continuo. Si estudiamos el triste camino emprendido por algunos de nuestros hermanos y hermanas protestantes en esta área en particular, se hicieron cambios en aras de la preocupación y la solicitud pastoral, que finalmente se convirtieron en un abandono total de la Fe Tradicional y una fractura de la Comunión Anglicana en todo el mundo. Ya lo vemos en las respuestas dispares a los servicios financieros de África, por un lado, y de Europa occidental, por el otro. Oremos para que Dios, que es fiel, nos guarde y nos proteja de seguir ese mismo camino de fractura y disolución.


