



FROM THE PASTOR



On this fourth Sunday of Easter, we hear that Jesus is the Good Shepherd and we are His sheep. Our readings today call us to reflect inward — do we allow Jesus to shepherd our lives? In our Gospel Jesus reveals His radical love for us. He says, "I will lay down my life for the sheep." Jesus tells us that we are His. We can compare this relationship to that of a loving parent

to their child. The parent gives without much in return and if any evil came near the child, the parent would do anything, even lay down their life for their baby.

We are Christ's — even more so than a child is to a parent. He created us and sustains our lives each day. Evil persists in our world, so Jesus willingly laid down His life for us at Calvary for our salvation. He is our Good Shepherd, whether we remain in His flock or go astray.

But just as a baby is happiest in the arms of a parent, so too are we happiest in the flock of our Shepherd. And just as sheep go astray, we also stray from God, test our limits, and even follow false shepherds.

Thankfully our Shepherd is a Good Shepherd, and He laid down His life for us knowing every sin we will ever commit. Therefore, let us examine our hearts and return to our flock. We don't even need to find the way. He is right there always waiting to guide us home.

Let us look inward this week and ask ourselves, 'who is my Shepherd?' and 'have I gone astray?' Name the areas in your life that you have neglected. Ask Jesus to bring you home. Pray for His mercy, seek His forgiveness in the sacraments and begin again.

Pastoral Pondering - There has certainly been lots of news over the last couple of weeks. As you know on April 9 it was announced that the Holy Father accepted the resignation of Bishop Jugis for reasons of health and appointed Father Michael Martin, OFM Conv. as the fifth Bishop of Charlotte. The Bishop-Elect's ordination will take place here at St. Mark on Wednesday, May 29 and the new bishop will take possession of his Cathedral on May 30. Please keep Father Martin in your prayers as he prepares to become our new bishop.

On April 8 the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith issued a document which has been in development for the last five years entitled *Infinite Dignity*. The document deals with matters connected with human dignity that our current culture touches on directly. It is strongly rooted in the magisterium of Pope St. John Paul II, Pope Benedict XVI, and Pope Francis, especially *Fratelli tutti*.

Some of the specific issues that are addressed include: the drama of poverty, war, the travail of migrants, human trafficking, sexual abuse, violence against women, abortion, surrogacy, euthanasia and assisted suicide, the marginalization of people with disabilities, gender theory and sex change, and, finally, digital violence. This last topic is especially timely considering the widespread use of social media and the negative impact it has had on culture, especially our children and young people.

The document is not overly academic and is worth reading, especially for those who would like a better understanding of the Church's perennial teaching on the dignity of the human person and Her response to the cultural milieu. It can be found at this QR code.

On Thursday, April 25, we celebrate the feast of our patron saint the Gospel writer St. Mark.

About *The Good Shepherd* Stained Glass Window


On May 15, 2008, my husband Jim and I lost our middle child, Joshua, to an accident while home for a short break from serving as an army infantry soldier in the Iraq war. Joshua was 22. The devastation from losing him at such a young age was more than my husband and I could bear. We felt as if our hearts were ripped out and that we would never be able to heal and move forward with our lives. Our other two children, Hank and Rachael, no less felt the same. One minute Josh was there, and the next minute, he was gone. I have learned to live with a "little gray cloud" that hovers over my head every day of my life now. Sometimes it just hovers, while other times it bursts and pours down on me in a flood of deep and desperate emotions. At these moments, I think of the stained glass and the little lost lamb depicted as "my Joshua" being held close in the arms of Christ.

When the new Saint Mark Catholic Church was being built, my husband and I went to Monsignor Bellow and asked him specifically if we could do something in honor of our son for the church. We asked if it would be possible to memorialize the round-stained glass over the altar for Joshua. Father Richard looked me straight in the face and responded, "I have got an idea better than that, and I understand you're an art teacher, so why don't you just design it yourself?"

I was delighted to be given such a task. We asked our family and friends to make memorials to Saint Mark for the stained glass over the altar in honor of Joshua. With God's help we were able to raise enough funds to supplement our initial gift and create the large stained-glass window up over the altar, a memorial to my beautiful son, Joshua Manning Carter.

Father Richard and I discussed the theme for the window. He was quick to let me know of his love for the "Good Shepherd." That is all it took. I worked on the design during my summer break from teaching art at Hopewell High School as I also have always been comforted by thinking of the Good Shepherd. I wanted to paint Christ holding a little lamb. It brought comfort to me to think of the little lamb as my Josh. Not long after my painting was made into the large stained-glass window, it was installed up over the altar in this beautiful new Saint Mark Church. My husband and I were there with everyone else on the stained-glass window committee to see the stained glass being installed.

Finally, my Josh is at rest and my family draws a most amazing comfort knowing that Joshua is high above the altar looking down on us all. My Lord gave me an artistic gift that I never realized would help me create a long and lasting memorial for a soldier whose life ended way too soon.





DEL PASTOR



En este cuarto domingo de Pascua, escuchamos que Jesús es el Buen Pastor y nosotros somos sus ovejas. Nuestras lecturas de hoy nos llaman a reflexionar hacia adentro: ¿permitimos que Jesús pastoree nuestras vidas?

En nuestro Evangelio, Jesús revela su amor radical por nosotros. Él dice:

"Pondré mi vida por las ovejas". Jesús nos dice que somos Suyos. Podemos comparar esta relación con la de un padre amoroso con su hijo. El padre da sin mucho a cambio y si algún mal se acercaba al niño, el padre haría cualquier cosa, incluso daría su vida por su bebé.

Somos de Cristo, incluso más de lo que un hijo lo es para sus padres. Él nos creó y sostiene nuestras vidas cada día. El mal persiste en nuestro mundo, por lo que Jesús voluntariamente dio su vida por nosotros en el Calvario para nuestra salvación. Él es nuestro Buen Pastor, ya sea que permanezcamos en Su rebaño o nos descarriemos.

Pero, así como un bebé es más feliz en los brazos de un padre, así también nosotros somos más felices en el rebaño de nuestro Pastor. Y así como las ovejas se descarrían, nosotros también nos desviamos de Dios, probamos nuestros límites e incluso seguimos a falsos pastores.

Afortunadamente, nuestro Pastor es un Buen Pastor, y Él dio Su vida por nosotros sabiendo cada pecado que cometeremos. Por lo tanto, examinemos nuestros corazones y volvamos a nuestro rebaño. Ni siquiera necesitamos encontrar el camino. Él está ahí, siempre esperándonos para guiarnos a casa.

Miremos hacia adentro esta semana y preguntémonos: '¿Quién es mi Pastor?' y '¿Me he extraviado?' Nombra las áreas de tu vida que has descuidado. Pídele a Jesús que te lleve a casa. Ora por Su misericordia, busca Su perdón en los sacramentos y comienza de nuevo. © Consultores de Mayordomía Católica, 2024

Reflexión pastoral - Ciertamente ha habido muchas noticias en las últimas semanas. Como sabéis, el 9 de abril se anunció que el Santo Padre aceptó la renuncia de Mons. Jugis por motivos de salud y nombró al P. Michael Martin, OFM Conv, como quinto Obispo de Charlotte. La ordenación del Obispo electo tendrá lugar aquí en San Marcos el miércoles 29 de mayo y el nuevo obispo tomará posesión de su Catedral el 30 de mayo. Por favor, mantengan al Padre Martin en sus oraciones mientras se prepara para convertirse en nuestro nuevo obispo.

El 8 de abril, el Dicasterio para la Doctrina de la Fe publicó un documento que se ha estado elaborando durante los últimos cinco años titulado *Dignidad infinita*. El documento aborda cuestiones relacionadas con la dignidad humana que nuestra cultura actual toca directamente. Está fuertemente arraigada en el magisterio del Papa San Juan Pablo II, el Papa Benedicto XVI y el Papa Francisco, especialmente *Fratelli tutti*.

Algunos de los temas específicos que se abordan son: el drama de la pobreza, la guerra, las tribulaciones de los migrantes, la trata de personas, el abuso sexual, la violencia contra las mujeres, el aborto, la gestación subrogada, la eutanasia y el suicidio asistido, la marginación de las personas con discapacidad, la teoría de género y el cambio de sexo y, finalmente, la violencia digital. Este último tema es especialmente oportuno teniendo en cuenta el uso generalizado de las redes sociales y el impacto negativo que ha tenido en la cultura, especialmente en nuestros niños y jóvenes.

El documento no es excesivamente académico y vale la pena leerlo, especialmente para aquellos que deseen comprender mejor la enseñanza perenne de la Iglesia sobre la dignidad de la persona humana y su respuesta al medio cultural.






