Guidelines for Communion For Catholics

- 1. To be in a state of grace, that is to say, to be free from any unconfessed mortal sin.
- 2. To abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from any food and drink, with the exception of water and medicine.
- 3. To know what you are receiving and to approach the altar with devotion.
- 4. St. Mark uses altar rails. Please go to the far end of the rail and either kneel to receive Holy Communion on the tongue or remain standing to receive in your hand. The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended.
- 5. Please consume the Holy Eucharist in front of the minister of Holy Communion, before walking away.

For Non-Catholics: We welcome you to Holy Mass and are glad you are here. Please feel free to participate by singing, standing, kneeling, etc. However, the reception of Holy Communion is reserved for Catholics in a state of grace. At the time of Communion, please feel free to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest for a blessing or to remain in your pew.

FROM THE PASTOR



Today's Gospel passage comes as a pat on the back from Heaven for all of us striving to live a stewardship way of life. It reminds us why we live the way we do and why we make the choices we make. Let's face it, if we truly embrace this way of life, there will be people who find our choices — based on serving God and others — downright foolish. But let's see what God thinks. Spoiler alert:

turns out Christian stewards are not the fools!

In this passage, Jesus makes it clear that life is not about "stuff" as he tells the parable of the wealthy businessman who thought he had everything figured out. The man had such an abundance of stuff that he didn't have room to store it all. So, thinking of earthly things and not on what is above, he decided to build a bigger place to store all that stuff. Patting himself on the back, he thought about what good times he would have in the years ahead. But Jesus tells us that day would turn out to be the man's last day on the earth. And he had spent it thinking only of himself. How foolish!

Pastoral Pondering – With the election of Pope Leo XIV, many folks have expressed an interest in understanding the history of his most recent predecessor with the same name, Pope Leo XIII, who is considered a great proponent of Catholic Social teaching. His encyclical, Rerum Novarum, is the basis for our understanding of this important branch of Catholic theology, so I thought it might be useful to share a summary of that document.

Rerum Novarum, an encyclical issued by Pope Leo XIII in 1891, addresses the social and economic challenges of the modern world, emphasizing the Church's role in addressing injustices within the rapidly industrializing society. It marks the beginning of modern Catholic social teaching and sets a framework for dealing with issues related to labor, capital, and society.

Key Themes of Rerum Novarum:

- 1. Dignity of Labor: It affirms the dignity of work and the rights of workers, including just wages, the right to form unions, and decent working conditions. Work is not merely an economic activity but a means for the personal development of individuals.
- 2. Private Property: The encyclical upholds the right to private property, stating that it is natural and beneficial for individuals and families. However, this right carries with it the responsibility to use one's property for the common good.
- 3. Role of the State: It outlines the role of the state in promoting justice and protecting the rights of individuals, especially the poor and vulnerable. The state should act as an agent for social order and the common good but should not overreach into individual freedoms.

- 4. Class Cooperation: Pope Leo XIII advocates for the cooperative relationship between employees and employers, encouraging a spirit of mutual understanding and collaboration rather than conflict, aiming to harmonize interests for societal benefit.
- 5. Social Justice: The encyclical is concerned with the effects of unchecked capitalism and socialism, critiquing both extremes and emphasizing a balance that respects human dignity while promoting social justice and the well-being of all members of society.

Rerum Novarum serves as a cornerstone for subsequent Catholic social thought, inviting us to consider how we can address economic and social issues while respecting human dignity and the common good.

Annual Holy Hour of Reparation


When: Wed., Aug. 6, 6:30 pm Mass; Holy Hour 7:15 pm

ADORATION

One of the prayers that many of us pray in the Adoration Chapel is the Rosary.

An adorer sent me his thoughts on praying the Scriptural Rosary. I thought it would be good to share it with you. There are so many spiritual benefits from praying the Rosary. It is an opportunity to meditate on the life of Christ.

If you need more information on how to pray the Rosary, please let me know. We have plenty of resources and just in case you forget to bring a rosary to the chapel, we have them there for you to borrow.

Our Adorer writes...

The Scriptural Rosary Reciting the rosary is usually, if not always, a challenge, at least it is for me. Distractions come easily, and keeping my mind fully engaged in prayer is not easy. The rosary is meant to be a meditative prayer, combining reflection on the mysteries of Christ's life along with the recitation of the Our Fathers, Hail Marys, and Glory Be's.

In the rosary gatherings I've attended, the title of each decade is announced, followed by the recitation of ten Hail Marys in succession. I've often wondered: are my companions able to meditate while saying one Hail Mary after another? If so, that's wonderful. If not, then they may be missing out on one of the rosary's greatest benefits.

Edward Sri, in his book The New Rosary in Scripture, quotes Pope Paul VI: "Without contemplation, the rosary is a body without a soul, and its recitation runs the risk of becoming a mechanical repetition of formulas."

I've found that the best way to ensure contemplation is by praying the scriptural rosary. In the Scriptural Rosary, each of the ten Hail Marys in a decade is preceded by a Biblical verse or paraphrase related to that mystery. This helps to visualize the event and reflect on it while reciting the Hail Mary. In this way, the Hail Marys become a background rhythm, supporting rather than overshadowing the meditation.

Here is a portion of the scriptural rosary of the First Joyful Mystery, the Annunciation, taken from Edward Sri's book.

- 1. In the sixth month the Angel Gabriel was sent from God to ... a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph ... and the virgin's name was Mary (Luke 1:26-27) Hail Mary ...
- 2. And he came to her and said, "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you!" (Luke 1:28) Hail Mary ...
- 3. But she was greatly troubled at the saying and considered in her mind what sort of greeting this might be (Luke 1:29) Hail Mary ...
- 4. And the Angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God." (Luke 1:30) Hail Mary ...
- 5. "And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus" (Luke 1:31) Hail Mary

For me, praying the Scriptural Rosary is more enriching than saying rote prayers without meaningful contemplation. I highly recommend it to anyone seeking meditation on the life of our Lord. Praying all four sets of mysteries is like taking a short, thoughtful journey through the New Testament.



Why Not Just Private Instruction?

Before OCIA, many converts were instructed privately by a priest. While helpful, this approach often isolated new Catholics from the parish community. It didn't provide a lived experience of the Church's communal, liturgical, and charitable life. OCIA invites the whole parish to walk with those entering the Church.

How Does Our Parish Attract Inquirers?

The short answer is: you. Conversions happen through authentic relationships—conversations with friends, neighbors, co-workers, and family members. When you invite someone to "come and see," you become the hands and heart of Christ. "Go out into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature." (Mark 16:15)

How Long Does OCIA Take?

Every journey is different. Some may take six months, others up to three years. The Church respects the time each person needs for discernment and conversion. The typical journey takes about one year.

Are you, or someone you know, feeling drawn to the Catholic Church?

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) is the process through which individuals become Catholic and receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

What Is OCIA?

The OCIA is the official process established by the Universal Church for welcoming new members into the Catholic faith. It is a journey of conversion, centered on building a deep relationship with Jesus Christ and the Church He founded. This process unfolds over time and through distinct stages, offering thorough catechesis, participation in the life of the parish, and commitment to the moral and liturgical life of the Church. The modern OCIA process restores the ancient catechumenate—used by the early Church to evangelize and prepare individuals for baptism. Revived by the Second Vatican Council, this process fosters both individual transformation and parish renewal.

Holy Day of Obligation: The Assumption of Mary and Novena

When: Vigil Mass, Thurs. Aug. 14, 7 pm Feast Day Mass, Fri. Aug. 15, 7 am, 9 am, 12:10 pm, 7 pm Spanish
The Assumption of Mary is an important day in the Church and a Holy Day of Obligation. This event is celebrated every year on Aug. 15 and is the fourth Glorious Mystery. The Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary instructs us on one of the important Marian Dogmas: the death of the Blessed Virgin Mary and her assumption, body and soul, into Heaven.

To prepare for The Assumption, begin praying a nine-day novena on Aug. 6. In this novena, you pray the same words each day. You can also go to <u>praymorenovenas.com</u> and find a prayer with individual daily intentions.

Novena Prayer

Mary, Queen Assumed into Heaven, I rejoice that after years of heroic martyrdom on Earth, you have at last been taken to the throne prepared for you in Heaven by the Holy Trinity.

Lift my heart with you in the glory of your Assumption above the dreadful touch of sin and impurity. Teach me how small Earth becomes when viewed from Heaven.

Make me realize that death is the triumphant gate through which I shall pass to your Son, and that someday my body shall rejoin my soul in the unending bliss of Heaven.

From this Earth, over which I tread as a pilgrim, I look to you for help. In honor of your Assumption into Heaven, I ask for this favor: (Mention your request).

When my hour of death has come, lead me safely to the presence of Jesus to enjoy the vision of my God for all eternity together with you. Amen.



ANUNCIOS EN ESPAÑOL



Del Pastor – 18 Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

El pasaje del Evangelio de hoy viene como una palmadita en la espalda del Cielo para todos los que nos esforzamos por vivir una forma de vida de mayordomía. Nos recuerda por qué vivimos de la manera en que lo hacemos y por qué tomamos las

decisiones que tomamos. Seamos realistas, si realmente abrazamos esta forma de vida, habrá personas que consideren que nuestras elecciones, basadas en servir a Dios y a los demás, son francamente tontas. Pero veamos qué piensa Dios. Alerta de spoiler: ¡resulta que los mayordomos cristianos no son tontos!

En este pasaje, Jesús deja en claro que la vida no se trata de "cosas" cuando cuenta la parábola del rico hombre de negocios que pensó que tenía todo resuelto. El hombre tenía tal abundancia de cosas que no tenía espacio para guardarlas todas. Entonces, pensando en las cosas terrenales y no en lo que está arriba, decidió construir un lugar más grande para almacenar todas esas cosas. Dándose palmaditas en la espalda, pensó en los buenos momentos que tendría en los años venideros. Pero Jesús nos dice que ese día resultaría ser el último día del hombre en la tierra. Y lo había pasado pensando solo en sí mismo. ¡Qué tonto!

No te avergüences de vivir de manera diferente a las personas que te rodean. Tenga confianza al establecer prioridades basadas en lo anterior.

Reflexión pastoral – Con la elección del Papa León XIV, muchas personas han expresado interés en comprender la historia de su predecesor más reciente con el mismo nombre, el Papa León XIII, quien es considerado un gran defensor de la doctrina social católica. Su encíclica, Rerum

Novarum, es la base para nuestra comprensión de esta importante rama de la teología católica, por lo que pensé que podría ser útil compartir un resumen de ese documento.

Rerum Novarum, una encíclica publicada por el Papa León XIII en 1891, aborda los desafíos sociales y económicos del mundo moderno, enfatizando el papel de la Iglesia en el tratamiento de las injusticias dentro de la sociedad que se industrializa rápidamente. Marca el comienzo de la enseñanza social católica moderna y establece un marco para tratar temas relacionados con el trabajo, el capital y la sociedad.

Temas clave de la Rerum Novarum:

- 1. **Dignidad del trabajo**: Afirma la dignidad del trabajo y los derechos de los trabajadores, incluidos los salarios justos, el derecho a formar sindicatos y las condiciones de trabajo decentes. El trabajo no es simplemente una actividad económica, sino un medio para el desarrollo personal de las personas.
- 2. **Propiedad privada**: La encíclica defiende el derecho a la propiedad privada, afirmando que es natural y beneficiosa para las personas y las familias. Sin embargo, este derecho conlleva la responsabilidad de usar la propiedad de uno para el bien común.
- 3. **Papel del Estado**: Describe el papel del Estado en la promoción de la justicia y la protección de los derechos de las personas, especialmente de los pobres y vulnerables. El Estado debe actuar como agente del orden social y el bien común, pero no debe extralimitarse en las libertades individuales.
- 4. Cooperación de clase: El Papa León XIII aboga por la relación de cooperación entre empleados y empleadores, fomentando un espíritu de comprensión mutua y colaboración en lugar de conflicto, con el objetivo de armonizar los intereses para el beneficio de la sociedad.
- 5. **Justicia social**: La encíclica se ocupa de los efectos del capitalismo y el socialismo sin control, criticando ambos extremos y enfatizando un equilibrio que respeta la dignidad humana al tiempo que promueve la justicia social y el bienestar de todos los miembros de la sociedad.
- La Rerum Novarum sirve como piedra angular para el pensamiento social católico posterior, invitándonos a considerar cómo podemos abordar los problemas económicos y sociales respetando la dignidad humana y el bien común.






