Guidelines for Communion For Catholics

- 1. To be in a state of grace, that is to say, to be free from any unconfessed mortal sin.
- To abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from any food and drink, with the exception of water and medicine.
- 3. To know what you are receiving and to approach the altar with devotion.
- St. Mark uses altar rails. Please go to the far end of the rail and either kneel to receive Holy Communion on the tongue or remain standing to receive in your hand. The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended.
- Please consume the Holy Eucharist in front of the minister of Holy Communion, before walking

For Non-Catholics: We welcome you to Holy Mass and are glad you are here. Please feel free to participate by singing, standing, kneeling, etc. However, the reception of Holy Communion is reserved for Catholics in a state of grace. At the time of Communion, please feel free to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest for a blessing or to remain in your pew.

FROM THE PASTOR – EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS



be a desire to understand and appreciate the significance of many of the celebrations. feasts, and solemnities we as Catholics observe and experience. Today's Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross celebrates three historical events: the finding of the True Cross by St. Helena; the construction and dedication of churches by Helena's son the

Emperor Constantine on the site of Mt. Calvary where Christ was crucified; and the return of the Cross to Jerusalem by the Emperor Heraclius II.

As Catholics, we need to remember the Cross every time we make the Sign of the Cross. We make that sign often and almost always at the beginning and the end of our prayers. However, that sign in itself is a prayer. Sometimes we do it automatically without really considering its meaning and importance. Rather than a hurried sign, we should make the Sign of the Cross with reverence, respect, and the constant reflection of how vital the Cross is to our salvation. Stewardship invites us to practice our faith with this deference and appreciation to the Lord, truly in the Name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. © Catholic Stewardship Consultants, 2025

Pastoral Pondering - As is the case with most of you, the shooting in Minneapolis has been heavy on my mind and heart these last days. In the face of tragedies like a shooting, the Catholic Church responds with a focus on prayer, support, and action rooted in the teachings of Christ's love and mercy.

1. Prayer and Solidarity: The Church calls for prayers for the victims, their families, and all affected by the tragedy. Prayer is seen as a vital means of seeking comfort, strength, and healing from God. The community is encouraged to come

One of the aspects of our stewardship should together in solidarity, expressing compassion and support for those suffering. There seems to be a misunderstanding by some that the purpose for prayer is to keep bad things from happening, obviously, bad things happen, including the crucifixion and the martyrs. We pray to entreat God's help and for strength and perseverance within the reality of a fallen and broken world.

- 2. Pastoral Care and Support: Priests, religious, and lay ministers offer pastoral care to those impacted, providing spiritual guidance, counseling, and support. Catholic Charities and other Church-affiliated organizations often offer practical assistance to meet immediate needs.
- 3. Promotion of Peace and Justice: The Church advocates for addressing the root causes of violence through the promotion of peace, justice, and reconciliation. This involves calling for societal changes to reduce violence, promoting dialogue, and working towards policies that respect human dignity and foster a culture of life.
- 4. Encouragement of Forgiveness and Reconciliation: While recognizing the deep pain and injustice caused by such acts, the Church also encourages forgiveness as a path to healing and reconciliation, consistent with Christ's teachings on loving one's neighbor and praying for one's enemies.
- 5. Commitment to Change: The Church often participates in or supports initiatives aimed at creating safer communities. advocating for measures that address issues like gun violence. mental health, and social inequalities that may contribute to such tragedies.

Through these responses, the Church seeks to be a beacon of hope and a force for positive change in a world marred by suffering and violence.

Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, September 14

As you sit in Mass today, you'll notice the altar dressed in red liturgical fabric instead of green. That's because instead of the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time, we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. As a Feast of the Lord, it takes precedence over Sundays in Ordinary Time, reminding us that the Cross stands at the very heart of our faith. The Church has honored this feast since the 4th century, when the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem was dedicated on the site of Jesus' death and Resurrection. St. Helena, the mother of Emperor Constantine, discovered the True Cross around that time. From then until now, the Church has lifted high the Cross—not as a relic of sorrow, but as the glorious sign of Christ's triumph over sin and death.



The color red this Sunday symbolizes both Christ's sacrifice and His victory. What once was an instrument of suffering has become the sign of salvation. As we gather, may we look upon the Cross not only as history, but as the living reminder of God's love. Truly, when we "lift high the Cross," we proclaim the power of Christ, who draws all people to Himself (cf. John 12:32).

St. Helena and the Discovery of the True Cross

In the year 326 AD, St. Helena, mother of Emperor Constantine, traveled to Jerusalem and discovered three crosses at the site believed to be where Jesus was crucified. Not knowing which one was the True Cross, she sought a way to identify it.

According to tradition, a sick man was brought to touch each cross. When he came into contact with one of them, he was miraculously healed. This was recognized as the Cross on which Jesus was crucified, the instrument of our salvation.

St. Helena's discovery reminds us that the Cross, once a symbol of suffering, is now a sign of triumph and hope. It is this Cross that the Church lifts up in celebration each year on the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. If you go to the left transept, you can find a relic of St. Helena and several of the True Cross.



Ten Reasons to Make a Holy Hour According to Fulton J. Sheen (Part Two)

5. We'll Practice What We Preach

The Holy Hour will make us practice what we preach. "Here is an image," he said, "of the kingdom of heaven: there was once a king, who held a marriage feast for his son and sent out his servants with a summons to all those whom he had invited to the wedding; but they would not come" (Matt. 22:2–3).

It was written of Our Lord that He "began to do and to teach" (Acts 1:1). The person who practices the Holy Hour will find that when he teaches, the people will say of him as of the Lord: "All... were astonished at the gracious words which came from his mouth" (Luke 4:22).

6. Helps Us Make Reparations

The Holy Hour helps us make reparation for the sins of the world and for our own sins. When the Sacred Heart appeared to St. Margaret Mary, it was His Heart, and not His head, that was crowned with thorns. It was Love that was hurt. The sins of the world are our sins as if we had committed them. If they caused Our Lord a bloody sweat, to the point that He upbraided His disciples for failing to stay with Him an hour, shall we with Cain ask: "Is it for me to watch over my brother?" (Gen. 4:9).

7. Reduces Liability to Temptation

It reduces our liability to temptation and weakness. Presenting ourselves before Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament is like putting a tubercular patient in good air and sunlight. The virus of our sins cannot long exist in the face of the Light of the world. "Always I can keep the Lord within sight; always he is at my right hand, to make me stand firm" (Ps. 15:8).

Our sinful impulses are prevented from arising through the barrier erected each day by the Holy Hour. Our will becomes disposed to goodness with little conscious effort on our part. Satan, the roaring lion, was not permitted to put forth his hand to touch righteous Job until he received permission (Job 1:12). Certainly, then, will the Lord withhold serious fall from him who watches (1 Cor. 10:13). With full confidence in his Eucharistic Lord, the person will have a spiritual resiliency. He will bounce back

quickly after a falling: "Fall I, it is but to rise again, sit I in darkness, the Lord will be my light. The Lord's displeasure I must bear, I that have sinned against him, till at last, he admits my plea, and grants government, for redress" (Micah 7:8–9). kingdom of God We cannot understand the mystery of God's government, for it is the "sealed"

The Lord will be favorable even to the weakest of us, if He finds us at His feet in adoration, disposing ourselves to receive divine favors. No sooner had Saul of Tarsus, the persecutor, humbled himself before his Maker than God sent a special messenger to his relief, telling him that "even now he is at his prayers" (Acts 9:11). Even the person who has fallen can expect reassurance if he watches and prays.

8. Our Holy Hour is Our Personal Prayer

The Holy Hour is a personal prayer. The person who limits himself strictly to his official obligation is like the union man who downs tools the moment the whistle blows. Love begins when duty finishes. It is a giving of the cloak when the coat is taken. It is walking the extra mile. Does the person who loves His Lord have time for other activities before he performs acts of love "above and beyond the call of duty"? Does the patient love the physician who charges for every call, or does he begin to love when the physician

says: "I just dropped by to see how you were"?

9. Keeps Us from Seeking an Escape

Meditation keeps us from seeking an external escape from our worries and miseries.

No outward escape, neither pleasure, drink, friends, or keeping busy, is an answer. The soul cannot "fly upon a horse"; he must take "wings" to a place where his "life is hidden away . . . with Christ in God" (Col. 3:3).

10. The Holy Hour is Necessary

Finally, the Holy Hour is necessary for the Church. The history of the world since the Incarnation is the Way of the Cross. The rise of nations and their fall remain related to the kingdom of God. We cannot understand the mystery of God's government, for it is the "sealed book" of Revelation. John wept when he saw it (Rev. 5:4). He could not understand why this moment of prosperity and that hour of



adversity. The sole requirement is the venture of faith, and the reward is the depths of intimacy for those who cultivate His friendship. To abide with Christ is spiritual fellowship, as He insisted on the solemn and sacred night of the Last Supper, the moment He chose to give us the Eucharist: "You have only to live on in me, and I will live on in you" (John 15:4). He wants us in His dwelling: "That you, too, may be where I am" (John 14:3). Choose an hour that works with your schedule, register at: www.stmarknc.org/adoration





Why Join a Small Group?

Small Groups offer more than study—they create belonging. In a parish as large as St. Mark, it's easy to feel anonymous, but small groups make the parish feel like family. They provide a place to grow in faith, form friendships, and be supported in life's joys and struggles.

As the National Catholic Register points out, small groups transform "large parishes into communities of communities." They give people a chance to be known by name, to share faith on a personal level, and to strengthen their relationship with Christ and His Church. Many parishioners have found that belonging to a small group makes coming to Mass even more meaningful—because they know the faces and the stories around them.

Participation & Leadership:

You can browse existing groups and register, or if none fit your schedule or interests, you're encouraged to start your own, provided you meet the parish's Safe Environment requirements.

Prospective Small Group leaders can express interest through a Small-Group Leader Form, indicating preferences such as meeting time, group size, childcare availability, or demographic focus.

Exaltación de la Santa Cruz

Uno de los aspectos de nuestra mayordomía debe ser el deseo de comprender y apreciar el significado de muchas de las celebraciones, fiestas y solemnidades que nosotros, como católicos, observamos y experimentamos. La fiesta de la

Exaltación de la Santa Cruz de hoy celebra tres eventos históricos: el hallazgo de la Vera Cruz por Santa Elena; la construcción y dedicación de iglesias por el hijo de Helena, el emperador Constantino, en el sitio del Monte Calvario, donde Cristo fue crucificado; y la devolución de la Cruz a Jerusalén por el emperador Heraclio II.

Como católicos, debemos recordar la cruz cada vez que hacemos la señal de la cruz. Hacemos esa señal a menudo y casi siempre al principio y al final de nuestras oraciones. Sin embargo, esa señal en sí misma es una oración. A veces lo hacemos automáticamente sin considerar realmente su significado e importancia. En lugar de una señal apresurada, debemos hacer la Señal de la Cruz con reverencia, respeto y la reflexión constante de cuán vital es la Cruz para nuestra salvación. La mayordomía nos invita a practicar nuestra fe con esta deferencia y aprecio al Señor, verdaderamente en el Nombre del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo. © Consultores de mayordomía católica, 2025

Reflexión pastoral: como es el caso de la mayoría de ustedes, el tiroteo en Minneapolis ha sido pesado en mi mente y corazón estos últimos días. Frente a tragedias como un tiroteo, la Iglesia Católica responde con un enfoque en la oración, el apoyo y la acción arraigados en las enseñanzas del amor y la misericordia de Cristo.

- 1. Oración y solidaridad: La Iglesia Ilama a orar por las víctimas, sus familias y todos los afectados por la tragedia. La oración se ve como un medio vital para buscar consuelo, fortaleza y sanidad de Dios. Se anima a la comunidad a unirse en solidaridad, expresando compasión y apoyo a los que sufren. Parece haber un malentendido por parte de algunos de que el propósito de la oración es evitar que sucedan cosas malas, obviamente, suceden cosas malas, incluida la crucifixión y los mártires. Oramos para suplicar la ayuda de Dios y por fortaleza y perseverancia dentro de la realidad de un mundo caído y quebrantado.
- 2. Cuidado y apoyo pastoral: Los sacerdotes, religiosos y ministros laicos ofrecen atención pastoral a los afectados, brindando orientación espiritual, asesoramiento y apoyo. Caridades Católicas y otras organizaciones afiliadas a la Iglesia a menudo ofrecen asistencia práctica para satisfacer las necesidades inmediatas.
- 3. Promoción de la paz y la justicia: La Iglesia aboga por abordar las causas fundamentales de la violencia a través de la promoción de la paz, la justicia y la reconciliación. Esto implica pedir cambios sociales para reducir la violencia, promover el diálogo y trabajar hacia políticas que respeten la dignidad humana y fomenten una cultura de la vida.
- 4. Fomento del perdón y la reconciliación: Si bien reconoce el profundo dolor y la injusticia causados por tales actos, la Iglesia también fomenta el perdón como un camino hacia la curación y la reconciliación, de acuerdo con las enseñanzas de Cristo sobre amar al prójimo y orar por los enemigos.
- 5. Compromiso con el cambio: La Iglesia a menudo participa o apoya iniciativas destinadas a crear comunidades más seguras, abogando por medidas que aborden problemas como la violencia armada, la salud mental y las desigualdades sociales que pueden contribuir a tales tragedias.


