Guidelines for Communion For Catholics

- 1. To be in a state of grace, that is to say, to be free from any unconfessed mortal sin.
- 2. To abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from any food and drink, with the exception of water and medicine.
- 3. To know what you are receiving and to approach the altar with devotion.
- 4. St. Mark uses altar rails. Please go to the far end of the rail and either kneel to receive Holy Communion on the tongue or remain standing to receive in your hand. The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended.
- 5. Please consume the Holy Eucharist in front of the minister of Holy Communion, before walking away.

For Non-Catholics: We welcome you to Holy Mass and are glad you are here. Please feel free to participate by singing, standing, kneeling, etc. However, the reception of Holy Communion is reserved for Catholics in a state of grace. At the time of Communion, please feel free to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest for a blessing or to remain in your pew.

FROM THE PASTOR: 26TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



We have all been given great power by God in the form of Time, Talents, and Treasure. Today's readings remind us that this power is meant to be used for great good. And that

failure to do so has eternal consequences.

We see the urgency for us to put our powers to good use in today's Gospel passage from Luke. Our Lord tells the rather chilling parable of the rich man who ignored poor Lazarus during their lifetimes. At the moment of the rich man's death, he goes down to the netherworld, while Lazarus is taken to the eternal iov and comfort in the bosom of Abraham. The rich man keenly regrets his indifference towards the needs of Lazarus, but it is too late for regret. His choices have played out, and now the rich man will face the consequences of his failure to use the gifts God gave him.

Pursuit of God's kingdom and care for the poor are not trifling matters. Our Lord makes this clear to us over and over in the Scriptures and the constant teachings of our 2,000-year-old Church. We are free to ignore these teachings and live instead for ourselves. But there will be tragic results for us in the end. And, because we are made for eternity, living selfishly on this earth doesn't really bring us true happiness anyway.

So how can we use our great powers for great good?

By embracing stewardship way of life. By putting God first in all areas of our lives — in the way we spend our time, the ways we share our talents, the ways we give of our financial resources. Pastoral Pondering - Even though this vear is not a presidential or mid-term election, local elections are quite important, and we often don't take them as seriously as we should. This year we have two parishioners running for office, Dan Boone is running for town council, and Bill Fountain is running for school board. To some these positions may seem insignificant, but it is at the local level that we, as Catholics, can have the greatest impact. I thought it might be helpful then to give a reminder of the duties of Catholics in political life. The Church teaches that lay Catholics bear primary responsibility for temporal affairs, including politics, as an extension of baptismal vocation (CCC 1913). Key duties include:

Forming Conscience: Study Church teachings to discern moral priorities; avoid reducing faith to single issues but prioritize intrinsic evils like abortion.

Active Involvement: Vote informatively, run for office, join parties or advocacy groups, and dialogue with officials to apply Gospel values. Pope Francis stated, "A good Catholic meddles in politics," offering the best of oneself to help leaders govern justly.

Non-Partisan Advocacy: The Church engages issues (e.g., life, family, peace) but avoids partisanship to focus on principles. Parishes can host voter education but not endorse candidates.

For Public Officials: Catholic politicians must align actions with Church moral teachings; supporting grave evils like abortion risks scandal and cooperation in evil.

Separation of church and state protects, rather than hinders, faith-based action in public life.

Challenges and Encouragement
In polarized environments, Catholics may feel disenfranchised, but the Church calls for renewed engagement to transform society incrementally toward justice. Resources like the USCCB's Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship (updated periodically) guide voters on applying Catholic Social Teaching. Ultimately, political action flows from love of neighbor, proving faith through works

(James 2:14-17).

Wraparound services: financial and transportation assistance, mental health support, and referrals.





ADORATION



Whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." John 4:14

By: Donna Fodale/ Adoration Coordinator Throughout scripture we see these beautiful encounters that people have with Jesus.

Each encounter offering some sort of teaching, healing, transformation or an opportunity to choose Jesus over sin.

When we read some of these passages we can often relate to one of the people that encounter Jesus. Over the next several weeks I will be sharing some of these encounters. I would like to invite you to read them in Adoration. When we come before the Lord in Adoration we too, like the Samaritan woman in the passage below, encounter Jesus. We know that Jesus is truly present in the Monstrance. Each one of us meets Him with our own temptations and sins. Each one has their own story and wounds that they carry into the Chapel. Just as Jesus knew that this woman would be going to the well that day, he knows that you are coming to be with him, if only for a moment in Adoration. Each encounter you have with him holds the promise of a deeper understanding of the love that he has for you. How does this passage below speak to you? Are you thirsty for the living water that Jesus is offering each of us?

The first passage scripture passage that I would like to share is from John 4-15:

The Samaritan Woman (Woman at the Well)

He (Jesus) had to pass through Samaria. So he came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of land that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there. Jesus, tired from his journey, sat down there at the well. It was about noon.

A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink (For Jews use nothing in common with Samaritans.)

Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water."

[The woman] said to him, "Sir, you do not even have a bucket and the well is deep; where then can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us this well and drank from it himself with his children and his flocks?" Jesus answered and said to her, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again. but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water, so that I may not be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water."

ANUNCIOS EN ESPAÑOL



Dios nos ha dado un gran poder en forma de Tiempo, Talentos y Tesoros. Las lecturas de hoy nos recuerdan que este poder está

destinado a ser utilizado para un gran bien. Y ese no hacerlo tiene consecuencias eternas.

Vemos la urgencia de que hagamos un buen uso de nuestros poderes en el pasaje del Evangelio de hoy de San Lucas. Nuestro Señor cuenta la parábola bastante escalofriante del hombre rico que ignoró al pobre Lázaro durante sus vidas. En el momento de la muerte del rico, desciende al abismo, mientras que Lázaro es llevado al gozo y consuelo eternos en el seno de Abraham. El hombre rico lamenta profundamente su indiferencia hacia las necesidades de Lázaro, pero es demasiado tarde para arrepentirse. Sus elecciones se han cumplido, y ahora el hombre rico enfrentará las consecuencias de su fracaso en usar los dones que Dios le dio.

La búsqueda del reino de Dios y el cuidado de los pobres no son asuntos insignificantes. Nuestro Señor nos lo aclara una y otra vez en las Escrituras y en las enseñanzas constantes de nuestra Iglesia de 2.000 años de antigüedad. Somos libres de ignorar estas enseñanzas y vivir para nosotros mismos. Pero al final habrá resultados trágicos para nosotros. Y, debido a que estamos hechos para la eternidad, vivir egoístamente en esta tierra realmente no nos trae verdadera felicidad de todos modos.

Entonces, ¿cómo podemos usar nuestros grandes poderes para un gran bien? Adoptando una forma de vida de mayordomía. Poniendo a Dios en primer lugar en todas las áreas de nuestras vidas: en la forma en que pasamos nuestro tiempo, en las formas en que compartimos nuestros talentos, en las formas en que damos de nuestros recursos financieros. La vida de mayordomía nos llama a salir de nuestra zona de confort y a comprometernos con el Señor y las cosas que le importan. ©Consultores de mayordomía católica, 2025

Reflexión pastoral: aunque este año no es una elección presidencial o de mitad de período, las elecciones locales son bastante importantes y, a menudo, no las tomamos tan en serio como deberíamos. Este año tenemos dos feligreses que se postulan para un cargo, Dan Boo-

ne se postula para el concejo municipal y Bill Fountain se postula para la junta escolar. Para algunos, estas posiciones pueden parecer insignificantes, pero es a nivel local donde nosotros, como católicos, podemos tener el mayor impacto. Pensé que podría ser útil entonces dar un recordatorio de los deberes de los católicos en la vida política.

La Iglesia enseña que los católicos laicos tienen la responsabilidad principal de los asuntos temporales, incluida la política, como una extensión de la vocación bautismal (CIC 1913). Los deberes clave incluyen:

Formar la conciencia: Estudiar las enseñanzas de la Iglesia para discernir las prioridades morales; evitar reducir la fe a temas individuales, pero priorizar los males intrínsecos como el aborto.

Participación activa: Vote informativamente, postularse para un cargo, unirse a partidos o grupos de defensa y dialogar con funcionarios para aplicar los valores del Evangelio. El Papa Francisco afirma: "Un buen católico se entromete en la política", ofreciendo lo mejor de sí mismo para ayudar a los líderes a gobernar con justicia.

Defensa no partidista: La Iglesia se involucra en temas (por ejemplo, la vida, la familia, la paz) pero evita el partidismo para centrarse en los principios. Las parroquias pueden albergar educación electoral pero no respaldar candidatos.

Para los funcionarios públicos: Los políticos católicos deben alinear las acciones con las enseñanzas morales de la Iglesia; apoyar males graves como el aborto corre el riesgo de escándalo y la cooperación en el mal.

La separación de la iglesia y el estado protege, en lugar de obstaculizar, la acción basada en la fe en la vida pública.

Desafíos y estímulo

En entornos polarizados, los católicos pueden sentirse privados de sus derechos, pero la Iglesia pide un compromiso renovado para transformar la sociedad gradualmente hacia la justicia. Recursos como la *Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos* (que se actualiza periódicamente) guían a los votantes sobre la aplicación de la CST. En última instancia, la acción política fluye del amor al prójimo, demostrando la fe a través de las obras (Santiago 2:14-17).


