

Guidelines for Communion For Catholics

- 1. To be in a state of grace, that is to say, to be free from any unconfessed mortal sin.
- 2. To abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from any food and drink, with the exception of water and medicine.
- 3. To know what you are receiving and to approach the altar with devotion.
- 4. St. Mark uses altar rails. Please go to the far end of the rail and either kneel to receive Holy Communion on the tongue or remain standing to receive in your hand. The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended.
- Please consume the Holy Eucharist in front of the minister of Holy Communion, before walking away.

For Non-Catholics: We welcome you to Holy Mass and are glad you are here. Please feel free to participate by singing, standing, kneeling, etc. However, the reception of Holy Communion is reserved for Catholics in a state of grace. At the time of Communion, please feel free to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest for a blessing or to remain in your pew.

FROM THE PASTOR: 27TH SUNDAY IN OR DINARY TIME



Our readings today show us that living a stewardship way of life, that is, a life focused on serving God and His Kingdom, is not easy. They also show us that our lives belong to God, not to us, and that God will indeed bring about the fulfillment of His kingdom. We just need to have faith that He can do it and commit to our small part in His grand design.

This is both our privilege and responsibility as Christian stewards. Jesus makes this privilege and responsibility clear in today's Gospel passage from Luke. When the apostles ask the Lord to increase their faith, He tells them that even a mustard-seed sized faith is all that is needed to move mountains (because it is God who does the heavy lifting). We need to only take the tiniest step forward, and He will do the rest.

But living our lives in His service is also very much our responsibility, as Jesus explains through the parable of the unprofitable servant later in the passage. Our Lord describes a scene in which a servant has just come from tending to the master's affairs and asks whether it would be reasonable for the master to begin waiting on the servant. Of course, it would not be reasonable! The servant would be expected to continue to serve his master until he has completed the work the

master has given him that day. Jesus says that we should have the same attitude before God.

The time, talents, and treasure entrusted to us are all God's. Our very lives belong to Him. Whatever we do on God's behalf with our lives and our gifts is simply our God-given responsibility.

Spotlight on Called & Gifted Workshop

Today's second reading reminds us that we are called to "stir into flame the gift of God that you have through the imposition of my hands." (2 Timothy 1:6) The Holy Spirit living in all the baptized requires our cooperation to bear fruit. When we surrender our intellect and will in obedience to follow and serve where God calls, the gifts and graces of the Holy Spirit are stirred into flame.

The church is called to help us discover and develop our charisms. "Whether extraordinary or simple and humble, charisms are graces of the Holy Spirit which directly or indirectly benefit the Church, ordered as they are to her building up, to the good of men, and to the needs of the world. Charisms are to be accepted with gratitude by the person who receives them and by all members of the Church as well. They are a wonderfully rich grace for the apostolic vitality and for the holiness of the entire Body of Christ, provided they really are genuine gifts of the Holy Spirit and are used in full conformity with authentic promptings of this same Spirit, that is, in keeping with charity, the true measure of all charisms." (CCC 799-800)

We are all called to serve where He calls us. When we serve where we are truly called, service is joy. "For that which men love, either no labor is felt, or the labor itself is loved." (St. Augustine) We each have unique contributions to make as parts of the Body of Christ and no individual is called to do everything.



ADORATION

Now Jesus Loved Martha and Her Sister and Lazarus

One of my favorite encounters with Jesus is from John Chapter 11: 1-7 (The raising of Lazarus)

In this Scripture I am drawn to the encounter that both Mary and Martha have with Jesus. The moment that Lazarus became ill, they both knew exactly whom they should go to for help. They knew that Jesus loved them and that he would not abandon them in their time of need

This scripture also highlights the love that Mary has for Jesus. In John 12:3 we read about how Mary, with great love and humility, knelt at Jesus' feet and anointed them with perfumed oil. I can just imagine that when Jesus received the message Mary sent, letting him know that Lazarus was ill, it may have brought back the memory of her kneeling at his feet, anointing them. Maybe at that moment he remembered how gentle she was when anointing his feet. Maybe there was a moment she looked up at him and he looked in her eyes and both were met with love and mercy. So beautiful!

These are the moments that we often experience in the Adoration chapel.

Are we like Mary and Martha? Do we go to Jesus when we need help? Just as Jesus loves Mary and Martha, he loves each one of us.

Think about this... that same Jesus that Mary knelt before is the same Jesus you come before in Adoration.

That same Jesus that raised Lazarus from the dead, is the same Jesus that you sit before in Adoration.

As Catholics we believe that Jesus is truly present in the Blessed Sacrament... body, blood, soul and divinity. If for some reason you struggle with this truth, spend time in Adoration and ask the Lord to help you with this truth. He will!

Each one of us can read different scriptures and take different things from them. The Holy Spirt seems to highlight for us different words, depending on what the Lord is inviting us to look at on our own spiritual journey.

I invite you to take this passage with you to Adoration. Read it a few times and see what touches your heart. What is your encounter with Jesus like?

John chapter 11:1-7

Now a man was ill, Lazarus from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. Mary was the one who had anointed the Lord with perfumed oil and dried his feet with her hair; it was her brother Lazarus who was ill.

So, the sisters sent word to him, saying, "Master, the one you love is ill."

When Jesus heard this he said, "This illness is not to end in death," but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it."

Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus.

So, when he heard that he was ill, he remained for two days in the place where he was. Then after this he said to his disciples, "Let us go back to Judea."

Del Pastor

Nuestras lecturas de hoy nos muestran que vivir una forma de vida de mayordomía, es decir, una vida centrada en servir a Dios y a Su Reino no es fácil.

También nos muestran que nuestras vidas pertenecen a Dios, no a nosotros, y que Dios ciertamente traerá el cumplimiento de Su reino. Este es tanto nuestro privilegio como nuestra responsabilidad como mayordomos cristianos. Jesús deja claro este privilegio y responsabilidad en el pasaje del Evangelio de hoy de Lucas. Cuando los apóstoles como el Señor para aumentar su fe, Él les dice que incluso una fe del tamaño de una semilla de mostaza es todo lo que se necesita para mover montañas (porque es Dios quien hace el trabajo pesado). Solo necesitamos dar el más mínimo paso hacia adelante, y Él hará el resto.
