Guidelines for Communion For Catholics

- 1. To be in a state of grace, that is to say, to be free from any unconfessed mortal sin.
- 2. To abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from any food and drink, with the exception of water and medicine.
- 3. To know what you are receiving and to approach the altar with devotion.
- St. Mark uses altar rails. Please go to the far end of the rail and either kneel to receive Holy Communion on the tongue or remain standing to receive in your hand. The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended.
- Please consume the Holy Eucharist in front of the minister of Holy Communion, before walking away.

For Non-Catholics: We welcome you to Holy Mass and are glad you are here. Please feel free to participate by singing, standing, kneeling, etc. However, the reception of Holy Communion is reserved for Catholics in a state of grace. At the time of Communion, please feel free to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest for a blessing or to remain in your pew.

FROM THE PASTOR: 28TH SUNDAY IN OR DINARY TIME



Today's readings demonstrate the power and vital importance of gratitude in the life of the Christian disciple, for gratitude leads us to worship God who offers us salvation.

We see the power of gratitude on display in the Gospel passage from Luke after Jesus heals ten lepers. "And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned." Only one of the ten

recognized the tremendous blessing he had received from Jesus and returned to thank him. While it's easy to feel indignant at the failure of the nine others to return and thank Jesus, how often do we fail to recognize the blessings, answered prayers, and healings (both physical and spiritual) that the Lord showers upon us, day

The truth is that our very lives and every breath we take are His gift to us. But we can get so caught up in the stresses and distractions of daily life that we lose touch with this truth.

The Samaritan reacts to his gift of healing with the proper response to our loving God. Recognizing what he had just received from the Lord, he "returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked Him." He was grateful for what God had done for him, and this gratitude led to worship. And because of this response, Jesus offered him a far more precious gift than physical healing; He offered him the gift of salvation. "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you."

Too often, we hear the phrase, "Count your blessings," and write it off as nothing more than a trite saving. Today's Gospel shows us otherwise. Gratitude is powerful. It deepens our faith in God and leads us to fitting worship of Him. @Catholic Stewardship Consultants, 2025

Pastoral Pondering - Over the past few weeks, St. Mark has had funeral after funeral. As we approach November, I thought it might be helpful to discuss the Catholic approach to death and dying. Rather than seeing the end of the earthly journey as something to be dreaded and avoided. Catholics approach death and dying with a blend of spiritual practices, rituals, and theological beliefs rooted in their faith, emphasizing hope in eternal life, God's mercy, and the communal support of the Church. Here's a concise overview:

1. Theological Perspective on Death

Eternal Life and Resurrection: Catholics believe death is not the end but a transition to eternal life. Based on Christ's resurrection. they hold that the soul separates from the body at death, awaiting the final resurrection when body and soul are reunited (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 989-1001).

Judgment and Afterlife: After death, each person faces a particular judgment, determining their eternal destiny: heaven (often via purification in purgatory), or hell if unrepentant of serious sin (CCC 1021-1022). This belief shapes their approach to preparing for

2. Preparation for Death

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick: This sacrament is administered to those seriously ill or near death, offering spiritual healing, forgiveness of sins, and strength, It's often paired with Confession and Holy Communion (called Viaticum, meaning "food for the journey") to prepare the soul for eternity (CCC 1499-1532).

Gratitude is the key to a stewardship way of life. Prayer and Repentance: Catholics are encouraged to reflect on their lives, seek forgiveness through Confession, and entrust themselves to God's mercy. Prayers like the Rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet are common for the dying and their families. Spiritual Support: Priests, family, or Catholic communities often pray with the dying, offering comfort through Scripture, hymns, or the Commendation of the Dying, a ritual to entrust the soul to God.

3. Rituals and Practices After Death

Funeral Rites: The Catholic funeral consists of three parts: Vigil (Wake): A time for family and friends to gather, pray (often the Rosary), and share memories.

Funeral Mass/Mass of Christian Burial: A liturgy celebrating Christ's resurrection and praying for the deceased's soul, often emphasizing hope over despair.

Committal: The burial or cremation (permitted since 1963, though the Church prefers burial) with prayers entrusting the deceased to God.

Masses for the Dead: Catholics offer Masses for the deceased, especially for souls in purgatory, believing these prayers aid their purification (CCC 1032).

4. Grieving and Community Support

Hope in Resurrection: Grief is acknowledged, but Catholics are encouraged to focus on the hope of eternal life, which tempers sorrow (1 Thessalonians 4:13-14).

Community Role: The Church community supports the bereaved through prayers, Masses, and practical help, reinforcing that death is a shared journey within the "communion of saints."

Memento Mori: The tradition of "remembering death" encourages Catholics to live virtuously, keeping eternity in mind, often through practices like praying for the dead on All Souls' Day (November 2).

5. Cultural Variations

While core beliefs and rituals are universal, cultural practices vary. For example:

In Hispanic Catholic communities, *Día de los Muertos* blends indigenous traditions with Catholic prayers, honoring the dead with altars and Masses

In some European traditions, month's mind Masses (a Mass one month after death) are common to continue praying for the deceased.

6. Practical Aspects

End-of-Life Decisions: The Church teaches that life must be respected, but extraordinary medical measures aren't required if they're burdensome or futile (CCC 2278). Palliative care is supported to alleviate suffering while respecting natural death.

Advance Directives: Catholics are encouraged to prepare advance directives aligned with Church teaching, ensuring their care respects their faith.

7. Comfort in Faith

Catholics draw comfort from Scriptures like John 11:25 ("I am the resurrection and the life") and prayers like *Eternal Rest* ("Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord"). The belief in purgatory offers hope that loved ones can be aided through prayer, even after death, and reminds us that death never has the last word.

When we feel overwhelmed by problems, we often cry out to Jesus for help, even when we stand spiritually or physically distant from him. Today's readings all highlight our hope when we trust God to assist us and the call to give gratitude to God. "In all circumstances, give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." (1 Thessalonians 5:18)

Regardless of our current difficulties, reverence and fear of disappointing the Lord can help us recognize our need for the gifts of healing and redemption. Practicing the virtue of gratitude becomes easier when we humble ourselves to admit we are sinners in need of a savior. "He has not dealt with us as our sins merit, nor requited us as our wrongs deserve." (Psalm 103:10) In His merciful and compassionate love, He continually offers cleansing we do not deserve. If we allow pride to blind us to our need for his forgiveness, we easily go the way of the nine; instead, may our love for God move us to perfect contrition and gratitude. 
MEDITATIONS

Field of Crosses

Did you know that a team of volunteers from the Respect Life Ministry puts up crosses every year during Respect Life Month?

The crosses have moved around through the years — sometimes they are at the Memorial for Life and sometimes they are at the bell tower. Either way, the crosses symbolize the countless lives lost to abortion each hour. There are approximately 118 abortions per hour in the United States. That equates to 1 abortion per cross per hour.

As you see the crosses, pause to remember the little ones who never had the chance to be born, and lift them to the mercy of God. Pray, too, for mothers and fathers who carry the pain of abortion, that they may find healing and hope in Christ.

Heavenly Father, Creator of all life, we grieve the loss of so many innocent children. Today is the New Feast of Saint Carlo Acutis

This year the Church celebrates for the first time the Feast of St. Carlo Acutis on October 12. Carlo, who died of leukemia in 2006 at the age of 15, is the first millennial saint—someone who shows us what holiness looks like in our own time.


Carlo had a deep love for the Eucharist, calling it his "highway to heaven." From an early age, he made daily Mass and Eucharistic Adoration part of his life. He also had a gift for computers and used his talents to share the faith, creating a website that catalogued Eucharistic miracles from around the world. His life reminds us that sanctity is not reserved for priests or religious—it is possible for young people, for students, and for ordinary Catholics living in the digital age.

In his own words: "To always be close to Jesus, that's my life plan."

As we celebrate his feast day, may St. Carlo inspire us to grow in love for the Eucharist, to use our gifts for God's glory, and to seek holiness in everyday life.

O God, who gave St. Carlo Acutis the grace to unite his love for the Eucharist with his joy in sharing the Gospel, grant that, through his intercession, we may also grow in love for Christ present in the Blessed Sacrament and bear witness to Him in the world. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.



Did You Know?

Saint Carlo Acutis (1991-2006)

- Born: May 3, 1991, in London; raised in Milan,
- Died: October 12, 2006, from leukemia at age
- **Canonized:** By Pope Francis in 2025 the first millennial saint.

Patronage: Youth, computer programmers, and the internet.


Carlo was an ordinary teenager with extraordinary faith. He loved soccer, video games, and spending time with friends, but above all he loved the Eucharist. He said: "The Eucharist is my highway to heaven."

Carlo's computer skills allowed him to build an online exhibit of Eucharistic miracles from around the world-still viewed today in many languages. His example shows how technology can be used to spread the Gospel and to draw people closer to Christ.

Carlo lived simply, prayed daily, and made it his mission to put God first in everything. He reminds us that holiness is possible at every age, even in the middle of a busy, modern life.




High School Youth Ministry Bible Study is Returning!

ADORATION



Take courage, I am with you.

By Donna Fodale, Adoration Coordinator I don't know about you but lately I often feel like the world is upside down. It can feel overwhelming at times. When I find myself feeling this way, I like to sit down in Adoration and read the Scripture passage Matthew 14: 23-32. Jesus walking on water.

As we continue to look at the different encounters that people had with Jesus, I think that this Scripture is one that we all can relate to in one way or another. It reminds us of how important it is to keep our eyes on the Lord when we are right in the middle of the storm of life.

Many of us, like Peter in this passage, let fear overcome us. Instead, the Lord reminds us that He is with us in the difficult moments, to take courage and stay close to him. Even when Peter seemed to lose his focus and started to be consumed by the raging storm, Jesus reached out to him and drew him to himself. How comforting it is to know that in those moments when we feel all is lost, we can call out to our Savior and know that He will help us.

Have you ever considered that the Chapel is like a boat that is situated right in the center of a storm. When you enter the Chapel, Jesus is there keeping you safe from many different storms that everyday life throws at us. He is in the boat with you. He is inviting you to keep your eyes focused on Him. He tells you, take courage, I am with you.

The more time we spend in Adoration the more we come to understand this truth. What Scripture brings you comfort in difficult times? I invite you to read that Scripture before the Lord in Adoration. How does the Scripture help you stay focused on the Lord?

Matthew 14:23-32

Then he made the disciples get into the boat and precede him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds.

After doing so, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When it was evening, he was there alone.

Meanwhile the boat, already a few miles offshore, was being tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it.

During the fourth watch of the night, He came toward them, walking on the sea.

When the disciples saw him walking on the sea they were terrified. "It is a ghost," they said, and they cried out in fear.

At once [Jesus] spoke to them, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid."

Peter said to him in reply, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water."

He said, "Come." Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward lesus

But when he saw how [strong] the wind was, he became frightened; and, beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" Immediately Jesus stretched out his hand and caught him, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" After they got into the boat, the wind died

La gratitud es la clave para una forma de vida de mayordomía. Las lecturas de hoy demuestran el poder y la importancia vital de la gratitud en la vida del discípulo cristiano, porque

la gratitud nos lleva a adorar a Dios que nos ofrece la salvación.

Vemos el poder de la gratitud en el pasaje del Evangelio de Lucas después de que Jesús sana a diez leprosos. "Y uno de ellos, al darse cuenta de que había sido sanado, regresó". Si bien es fácil sentirse indignado por el fracaso de los otros nueve para regresar y agradecer a Jesús, ¿con qué frecuencia no reconocemos las bendiciones, las oraciones respondidas y las sanidades (tanto físicas como espirituales) que el Señor derrama sobre nosotros, día y noche?

La verdad es que nuestras propias vidas y cada aliento que tomamos son Su regalo para nosotros. Pero podemos quedar tan atrapados en el estrés y las distracciones de la vida diaria que perdemos el contacto con esta verdad.

El samaritano reacciona a su don de curación con la respuesta adecuada a nuestro Dios amoroso. Reconociendo lo que acababa de recibir del Señor, "volvió, glorificando a Dios en voz alta; y se postró a los pies de Jesús y le dio gracias". Estaba agradecido por lo que Dios había hecho por él, y esta gratitud lo llevó a la adoración.

"Levántate y vete; tu fe te ha salvado".

Con demasiada frecuencia, escuchamos la frase "Cuenta tus bendiciones" y la descartamos como nada más que un dicho trillado. El Evangelio de hoy nos muestra lo contrario. La gratitud es poderosa. Reflexión pastoral: en las últimas semanas, San Marcos ha tenido un funeral tras otro. A medida que nos acercamos a noviembre, pensé que podría ser útil discutir el enfoque católico de la muerte y el morir. En lugar de ver el final del viaje terrenal como algo que debe temerse y evitarse, los católicos abordan la muerte y el morir con una mezcla de prácticas espirituales, rituales y creencias teológicas arraigadas en su fe, enfatizando la esperanza en la vida eterna, la misericordia de Dios y el apoyo comunitario de la Iglesia. Aquí hay una descripción general concisa:

1. Perspectiva teológica sobre la muerte

Vida eterna y resurrección: Los católicos creen que la muerte no es el final, sino una transición a la vida eterna. Basándose en la resurrección de Cristo, sostienen que el alma se separa del cuerpo al morir, esperando la resurrección final cuando el cuerpo y el alma se reúnen (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, 989-1001).

Juicio y vida después de la muerte: Después de la muerte, cada persona se enfrenta a un juicio particular, que determina su destino eterno: el cielo (a menudo a través de la purificación en el purgatorio) o el infierno si no se arrepiente de un pecado grave (CIC 1021-1022). Esta creencia da forma a su enfoque para prepararse para la muerte.

2. Preparación para la muerte

Sacramento de la Unción de los Enfermos:

Este sacramento se administra a los enfermos graves o cercanos a la muerte, ofreciendo curación espiritual, perdón de pecados y fortaleza. A menudo se combina con la Confesión y la Sagrada Comunión (Ilamada Viático, que significa "alimento para el viaje") para preparar el alma para la eternidad (CIC 1499-1532).

Oración y arrepentimiento: Se anima a los católicos a reflexionar sobre sus vidas, buscar el perdón a través de la confesión y confiarse a la misericordia de Dios. Las oraciones como el Rosario o la Coronilla de la Divina Misericordia son comunes para los moribundos y sus familias.

Apoyo espiritual: Los sacerdotes, la familia o las comunidades católicas a menudo oran con los moribundos, ofreciendo consuelo a través de las escrituras, los himnos o el Elogio de los moribundos, un ritual para confiar el alma a Dios.

3. Rituales y prácticas después de la muerte Ritos funerarios: El funeral católico consta de

Ritos tunerarios: El funeral católico consta de tres partes:

<u>Vigilia (velatorio):</u> Un momento para que familiares y amigos se reúnan, recen (a menudo el Rosario) y compartan recuerdos.

Misa fúnebre / Misa de entierro cristiano: Una liturgia que celebra la resurrección de Cristo y ora por el alma del difunto, a menudo enfatizando la esperanza sobre la desesperación.

Entierro: El entierro o cremación (permitido desde 1963, aunque la Iglesia prefiere el entierro) con oraciones que encomiendan al difunto a Dios.

Misas por los difuntos: Los católicos ofrecen misas por los difuntos, especialmente por las almas del purgatorio, creyendo que estas oraciones ayudan a su purificación (CIC 1032).

4. Duelo y apoyo comunitario

Esperanza en la resurrección: Se reconoce el dolor, pero se anima a los católicos a centrarse en la esperanza de la vida eterna, que atempera el dolor (1 Tesalonicenses 4:13 -14).

Papel de la comunidad: La comunidad de la Iglesia apoya a los afligidos a través de oraciones, misas y ayuda práctica, reforzando que la muerte es un viaje compartido dentro de la "comunión de los santos".

Memento Mori: La tradición de "recordar la muerte" alienta a los católicos a vivir virtuosamente, teniendo en cuenta la eternidad, a menudo a través de prácticas como orar por los muertos en el Día de los Fieles Difuntos (2 de noviembre).

5. Variaciones culturales

Si bien las creencias y rituales fundamentales son universales, las prácticas culturales varían. Por ejemplo:

En las comunidades católicas hispanas, el Día de los Muertos combina las tradiciones indígenas con las oraciones católicas, honrando a los muertos con altares y misas.

En algunas tradiciones europeas, las Misas de un mes de mente (una Misa un mes después de la muerte) son comunes para continuar orando por los difuntos.

6. Aspectos prácticos

Decisiones al final de la vida: La Iglesia enseña que la vida debe ser respetada, pero no se requieren medidas médicas extraordinarias si son onerosas o inútiles (CIC 2278). Los cuidados paliativos se apoyan para aliviar el sufrimiento respetando la muerte natural.

Directivas anticipadas: Se alienta a los católicos a preparar directivas anticipadas alineadas con la enseñanza de la Iglesia, asegurando que su cuidado respete su fe.

7. Consuelo en la fe

Los católicos obtienen consuelo de escrituras como Juan 11:25 ("Yo soy la resurrección y la vida") y oraciones como *Descanso eterno* ("Concédeles el descanso eterno, oh Señor"). La creencia en el purgatorio ofrece la esperanza de que los seres queridos pueden ser ayudados a través de la oración, incluso después de la muerte, y nos recuerda que la muerte nunca tiene la última palabra.


