

Guidelines for Communion For Catholics

- To be in a state of grace, that is to say, to be free from any unconfessed mortal sin.
- 2. To abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from any food and drink, with the exception of water and medicine.
- To know what you are receiving and to approach the altar with devotion.
- St. Mark uses altar rails. Please go to the far end of the rail and either kneel to receive Holy Communion on the tongue or remain standing to receive in your hand. The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended.
- Please consume the Holy Eucharist in front of the minister of Holy Communion, before walking away.

For Non-Catholics: We welcome you to Holy Mass and are glad you are here. Please feel free to participate by singing, standing, kneeling, etc. However, the reception of Holy Communion is reserved for Catholics in a state of grace. At the time of Communion, please feel free to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest for a blessing or to remain in your pew.

FROM THE PASTOR: 29TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



The four pillars of parish stewardship are hospitality, prayer, formation, and service. Today's readings show us the immense value of prayer and the privileged place it must have in our

individual lives and in our parish community.

Our Lord Himself calls us to prayer — and persistence in prayer — in the Gospel passage from Luke. Jesus tells the parable of the nagging widow who finally wears down the judge with her unrelenting persistence in her pursuit of a just ruling from him on her behalf. Jesus goes to great lengths to describe this judge, saying he "neither feared God nor respected any human." Yet even this corrupt judge responds with a just judgment because of the widow's persistence.

Jesus uses this outlandish example to draw a vivid contrast between a reluctant, dishonest judge and our loving, all-merciful Father. If even a bad judge will give a good result in response to a persistent request, how much more (infinitely more) eagerly and perfectly will our good Father respond to our persistent prayers to Him.

If he delays in responding, if he provides a different response from the one we were expecting, we can remain confident and trusting in His goodness, knowing that His response, whenever it comes and in whatever form, will be the very best one for us.

Our job then, as Christian stewards, is simply to remain faithful to our relationship with God through prayer. We must lean on each other in our communities — family and parish — as we support each other in prayer. Pastoral Pondering – I have noticed for a while now that many folks in the parish, and many Catholics in general, seem to have an erroneous or at least a confused understanding of the "Sunday obligation." The obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days is rooted in our fundamental obligation to

worship God and keep the Lord's Day holy. In light of this, I thought it opportune to present a summary of the Church's teaching in this regard. I hope you find it helpful.

Catholics are obligated to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation primarily because it is a precept of the Church, rooted in both divine law and ecclesiastical authority. This obligation stems from the Third Commandment ("Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day"), which in Christian tradition applies to Sunday as the day commemorating Christ's Resurrection, marking it as a day of worship, rest, and renewal. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) explains this in detail, particularly in sections on the precepts of the Church and the Third Commandment.

Biblical and Theological Foundations

- The obligation draws from Scripture, where God commands the sanctification of the Sabbath (Exodus 20:8-11; Deuteronomy 5:12-15). For Christians, this shifts to Sunday—the "Lord's Day"—to honor Jesus' Resurrection on the first day of the week (Acts 20:7; Revelation 1:10).
- The Eucharist is seen as the "source and summit" of the Christian life (CCC 1324), making participation essential for spiritual nourishment, community unity, and fulfilling one's relationship with God. As CCC 2180 states, the faithful are bound to participate in Mass on these days to sanctify them through worship. Holy Days of Obligation are additional feasts (such as Christmas, Assumption of Mary, or All Saints' Day, varying by region) that the Church designates as equally important for similar reasonshonoring key mysteries of faith, the Virgin Mary, or saints—requiring the same level of observance.

Church Law and Precepts

- This is formalized as the first precept of the Church: "You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor" (CCC 2042). It requires active participation in the Eucharistic celebration and abstaining from work that hinders sanctification or rest.
- Canon Law reinforces this: "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation, the faithful are obliged to

participate in the Mass" (Canon 1247). The Sunday Eucharist is described as the "foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice," making attendance obligatory unless excused by serious reasons like illness, infant care, or a dispensation from a pastor (CCC 2181). Deliberately missing without such cause is considered a grave (mortal) sin.

Practical and Spiritual Reasons

 Attending Mass orients believers toward God at the start of the week, fosters community, and provides grace through the sacraments. It's not just a rule but an opportunity for encounter with Christ.

The Church emphasizes this as the highest form of worship, essential even during travel or vacations, underscoring its priority in Catholic life.

This obligation applies to all Catholics who have reached the age of reason (around 7 years old) and are physically able, with exceptions for valid impediments.

Parents have a very important obligation to assist their children to fulfill this obligation. In general, children under the age of 16 cannot get to Mass without the assistance of the adults in their lives. Hence, the culpability for missing Mass usually falls to those adults rather than the children.

In the end fulfilling the "Sunday obligation" is more about loving God than anything else. Do we love Him enough to give Him at least an hour on Sundays and holy days? It would seem this is the least we can do in offering this act of love to the One who loved us first.

Rosary Makers Spread Devotion to Rome: The Making of 1.000 Rosaries

This October-the Month of the Rosarvour St. Mark Rosary Makers are sharing their love for the Blessed Virgin Marv with the universal Church in a beautiful way. The group has crafted over 1,000 rosaries that will soon journey to Rome, where they will be distributed to seminarians, missionaries, and priests studying at the Pontifical University of Saint Thomas Aquinas (the Angelicum), a Dominican university serving students from more than 100 countries.

The rosaries will be received and distributed by Fr. Benedict Croell, O.P., a Dominican friar who serves in Development and Mission Advancement at the Angelicum and as rector of the Convitto Internazionale San Tommaso d'Aquino, a residence for priests.

Fr. Benedict, appointed a Missionary of Mercy by Pope Francis in 2016, has served in many ministries, including five years in the Dominican missions in East Africa. Many parishioners may remember him from his visit to St. Mark several years ago, when he led our powerful parish mission on the Presence of God, focusing on Divine Providence, the Divine Indwelling, and the Real Presence of Jesus in the Fucharist.

This connection makes our outreach especially meaningful, as we join with the Dominican Friars and the global Church in fostering a deeper devotion to Our Ladv.

To ensure the rosaries reach their destination safely, parishioners Chris and Kelly Fernandez and their family will hand-deliver them to Rome during the first week of November, a true family mission! In addition to this international effort, our Rosary Makers continue to craft hundreds of rosaries for parish needs and special requests, including for Baptisms, Confirmations, and the Boy Scouts. We recently sent 100 rosaries to St. Agnes Church in WV at the request of a parishioner as they do not have enough rosaries.

Please keep our dedicated Rosary Makers-and all who will receive these rosaries-in your prayers as together we help spread the peace and love of Mary's intercession throughout the world.





Suicide and self-harm are deeply painful issues in our communities, but they're also preventable. Emily spent eight years working at colleges and universities, including Davidson College, helping young adults navigate mental health concerns within the college environment. Emily specializes in supporting adolescents and young adults with anxiety, depression, eating disorders/disordered eating, relationship conflicts, personality disorders, and many other mental health concerns. Over the past twelve years, Emily has taught numerous Mental Health First Aid USA courses to increase community awareness surrounding mental health concerns. She is passionate about improving mental health awareness and response within the Catholic community.


Charles Fraune, "The Most Powerful Saints in Exorcisms: What Exorcists Want You to Know"

As you may know the month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. There are so many great homilies that have been given on the importance of praying the Rosary.

There was one homily that I heard on the feast day of the Holy Rosary that really struck me. The priest was sharing the importance of praying the Rosary in Adoration. He mentioned that it was the perfect place to pray the rosary. When you pray the Rosary, you are meditating on the life of Jesus. What better place to meditate on the life of Christ then when you are sitting right before him in the Blessed Sacrament.

I have to say that I do enjoy praying both the Rosary and the Chaplet in the Chapel. The quietness of the Chapel with our Lord before us can help us better enter into the mysteries that we are meditating on.

There have been many miracles that are attributed to praying the rosary. I have included just a few of them in this bulletin piece. We also know that In Fatima, during the apparitions, the Blessed mother asked the children to pray the Rosary for peace in the world.

I would like to invite you to go to the chapel and offer a Rosary for peace and for all the intentions you carry in your heart.

I remember seeing an old movie and the scene showed two men that were going to fight. One man said to the other. Go ahead, choose your weapon. Of course he chose the one that seemed to be most powerful.

For us, the Rosary is that weapon. Know that the Rosary is a powerful weapon that helps us grow in holiness, conquer sin and draws us deeper into a relationship with Christ through the intercession of the Blessed Mother. Below are a few of the Promises the Virgin Mary gave to those who faithfully pray the Rosary:

- Those who faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary shall receive signal graces.
- I promise my special protection and the greatest graces to all those who shall recite the Rosary.
- The Rosary shall be a powerful armor against hell. It will destroy vice, decrease sin, and defeat heresies.
- The recitation of the Rosary will cause virtue and good works to flourish. It will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God. 

DEL PÁRROCO – 29 DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO OR DINARIO



Los cuatro pilares de la mayordomía parroquial son la hospitalidad, la oración, la formación y el servicio. Las lecturas de hoy nos muestran el inmenso valor de la

oración y el lugar privilegiado que debe tener en nuestras vidas individuales y en nuestra comunidad parroquial

Nuestro Señor mismo nos llama a la oración, y a la persistencia en la oración, en el pasaje del Evangelio de Lucas. Jesús cuenta la parábola de la viuda fastidiosa que finalmente desgasta al juez con su implacable persistencia en su búsqueda de un fallo justo de él en su nombre. Jesús hace todo lo posible para describir a este juez, diciendo que "no temía a Dios ni respetaba a ningún ser humano". Sin embargo, incluso este juez corrupto responde con un juicio justo debido a la persistencia de la viuda.

Jesús usa este ejemplo extravagante para establecer un vívido contraste entre un juez reacio y deshonesto y nuestro Padre amoroso y misericordioso. Si incluso un mal juez dará un buen resultado en respuesta a una petición persistente, cuánto más (infinitamente más) con entusiasmo y perfección responderá nuestro buen Padre a nuestras persistentes oraciones a Él. Si se demora en responder, si proporciona una respuesta diferente a la que esperábamos, podemos permanecer confiados y confiados en Su bondad, sabiendo que Su respuesta, cuando sea que llegue y en cualquier forma, será la mejor para nosotros.

Nuestro trabajo entonces, como mayordomos cristianos, es simplemente permanecer fieles a nuestra relación con Dios a través de la oración. Debemos apoyarnos unos en otros en nuestras comunidades, familia y parroquia, mientras nos apoyamos mutuamente en oración. Un pilar fuerte de oración hará que todos nuestros otros esfuerzos de mayordomía sean fructíferos. © Consultores de mayordomía católica, 2025

Reflexión pastoral: he notado desde hace un tiempo que muchas personas en la parroquia, y muchos católicos en general, parecen tener una comprensión errónea o al menos confusa de la "obligación dominical". La obligación de asistir a Misa los domingos y días festivos tiene sus raíces en nuestra obligación fundamental de adorar a Dios y santificar el Día del Señor. A la luz de esto, me pareció

oportuno presentar un resumen de la enseñanza de la Iglesia a este respecto. Espero que te resulte útil.

Los católicos están obligados a asistir a Misa los domingos y días festivos de precepto principalmente porque es un precepto de la Iglesia, arraigado tanto en la ley divina como en la autoridad eclesiástica. Esta obligación se deriva del Tercer Mandamiento ("Acuérdate de santificar el día del Señor"), que en la tradición cristiana se aplica al domingo como el día que conmemora la Resurrección de Cristo, marcándolo como un día de adoración, descanso y renovación. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica (CIC) explica esto en detalle, particularmente en secciones sobre los preceptos de la Iglesia y el Tercer Mandamiento.

Fundamentos bíblicos y teológicos

La obligación se basa en las Escrituras, donde Dios ordena la santificación del sábado (Éxodo 20:8-11; Deuteronomio 5:12-15). Para los cristianos, esto cambia al domingo, el "Día del Señor", para honrar la resurrección de Jesús el primer día de la semana (Hechos 20:7; Apocalipsis 1:10).

La Eucaristía es vista como la "fuente y cumbre" de la vida cristiana (CIC 1324), haciendo que la participación sea esencial para el alimento espiritual, la unidad de la comunidad y la realización de la relación con Dios. Como establece CIC 2180, los fieles están obligados a participar en la Misa en estos días para santificarlos a través del culto.

Los Días Santos de Obligación son fiestas adicionales (como Navidad, Asunción de María o Día de Todos los Santos, que varían según la región) que la Iglesia designa como igualmente importantes por razones similares, honrando misterios clave de la fe, la Virgen María o santos, que requieren el mismo nivel de observancia.

Ley y preceptos de la Iglesia

Esto se formaliza como el primer precepto de la Iglesia: "Asistirás a misa los domingos y en los días festivos de precepto y descansarás del trabajo servil" (CIC 2042). Requiere una participación activa en la celebración eucarística y abstenerse de trabajos que dificulten la santificación o el descanso.

El Derecho Canónico refuerza esto: "Los domingos y otros días festivos de precepto, los fieles están obligados a participar en la Misa" (Canon 1247).

La Eucaristía dominical se describe como el

"fundamento y confirmación de toda práctica cristiana", lo que hace que la asistencia sea obligatoria a menos que esté excusada por razones graves como enfermedad, cuidado infantil o una dispensa de un pastor (CIC 2181). Faltar deliberadamente sin tal causa se considera un pecado grave (mortal).

Razones prácticas y espirituales

Asistir a Misa orienta a los creyentes hacia Dios al comienzo de la semana, fomenta la comunidad y brinda gracia a través de los sacramentos. No es solo una regla, sino una oportunidad para el encuentro con Cristo.

La Iglesia enfatiza esto como la forma más alta de culto, esencial incluso durante viajes o vacaciones, subrayando su prioridad en la vida católica.

Esta obligación se aplica a todos los católicos que han alcanzado la edad de la razón (alrededor de los 7 años) y son físicamente capaces, con excepciones por impedimentos válidos.

Los padres tienen la obligación muy importante de ayudar a sus hijos a cumplir con esta obligación. En general, los niños menores de 16 años no pueden asistir a Misa sin la ayuda de los adultos en sus vidas. Por lo tanto, la culpabilidad por faltar a Misa generalmente recae en esos adultos y no en los niños.

Al final, cumplir con la "obligación dominical" se trata más de amar a Dios que cualquier otra cosa. ¿Lo amamos lo suficiente como para darle al menos una hora los domingos y días santos? Parecería que esto es lo menos que podemos hacer para ofrecer este acto de amor a Aquel que nos amó primero.




