- 1. To be in a state of grace, that is to say, to be free from any unconfessed mortal sin.
- To abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from any food and drink, with the exception of water and medicine.
- To know what you are receiving and to approach the altar with devotion.
- 4. St. Mark uses altar rails. Please go to the far end of the rail and either kneel to receive Holy Communion on the tongue or remain standing to receive in your hand. The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended.
- Please consume the Holy Eucharist in front of the minister of Holy Communion, before walking away.

For Non-Catholics: We welcome you to Holy Mass and are glad you are here. Please feel free to participate by singing, standing, kneeling, etc. However, the reception of Holy Communion is reserved for Catholics in a state of grace. At the time of Communion, please feel free to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest for a blessing or to remain in your pew.

FROM THE PASTOR: ALL SOULS DAY



On All Souls Day, the Church prays for all who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith. The Scriptures remind us of the hope we

share in Christ. The Book of Wisdom assures us that "the souls of the just are in the hand of God" (Wis 3:1), while St. Paul teaches that through Baptism, we were united with Christ in His death so that we might also live with Him forever (Rom 6:3-9).

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us words of profound comfort and promise: "Everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him on the last day" (Jn 6:40). Eternal life is God's greatest gift to us, and it shapes the way we live here and now.

As Christian stewards, we are called to make use of the time, talents, and treasure entrusted to us in ways that prepare us for eternity. Each day is an opportunity to serve God, love our neighbor, and hand on the gift of faith to others.

Pastoral Pondering

As we begin the month of November, hearts and minds quickly begin moving towards the Holidays. These weeks will go by quickly as we end the liturgical year and begin the season of Advent with a new liturgical year. Remember to use these days as opportunities to pray, to put faith into action through charitable outreach, and to seek to grow in our love for God and neighbor.

I also, before the end of the year, want to address the importance of the DSA, the Diocesan Support Appeal. I have had a few people express to me that because of their concern or disagreement with Bishop Martin, they could not support the DSA. Please be aware that this particular appeal does not support Diocesan administration. The DSA supports direct ministry in the Diocese including Catholic Charities and Vocations among others.

Moreover, the DSA is an assessed collection. This means that each parish is given a target that it is required to reach, either by freewill gift or taxation. If we do not reach our assessed goal, funds must be taken from general

offertory to cover the difference.

Hence, I would ask if you have not donated to the DSA this year, that you make a contribution to help us close the gap and reach our assessed goal. The most recent report indicates that we are still \$45,227.38 away from our goal of \$403,139.00 and have outstanding pledges of \$30,856.83. Thank you for your assistance with this important effort.

Finally, as already announced, Bishop Martin will be celebrating the Rite of Ordination to the diaconate for three men, including James Tweed, on Saturday, December 6. The Mass of Ordination will be celebrated at 10 am. at Immaculate Conception in Hendersonville. We are open to arranging bus transportation for those who would like to attend. In many respects, because of the year that he spent with us, James considers St. Mark his home, and he has already asked that his first Mass be celebrated here next summer. It would be wonderful if we could have a nice group from the parish to be present to support him and he begins ordained ministry. Praying for the Faithful Departed

This year, All Souls Day — the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed — falls on Sunday, November 2, giving it a special prominence in our liturgical life.

On this day, the Church turns her heart toward those who have died and are still being purified before entering the fullness of Heaven. It is a day of hope and mercy, reminding us that death does not end love and that our prayers truly aid the souls of the departed.

Because All Souls Day falls on a Sunday this year, the liturgical color will be black, a rare and solemn sight. Black vestments express our Christian mourning and the gravity of death, yet also our confidence in the Resurrection and in God's infinite mercy.

How to Gain a Plenary Indulgence for the Faithful Departed

The Church grants a plenary indulgence, the full remission of temporal punishment due to sin, to those who devoutly pray for the souls in purgatory under the usual conditions:

- Visit a cemetery and pray for the dead (even silently).
- 2. Receive Holy Communion that day.
- 3. Go to Confession within about 20 days.
- 4. Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father (an Our Father and a Hail Mary suffice).
- 5. Be free from all attachment to sin, even venial.

This indulgence may be gained once per day from November 1–8, and applied only to the souls in purgatory.

All Souls Day beautifully connects Heaven, earth, and purgatory in one great communion of love. As we attend Mass clothed in the rare beauty of black vestments, let us remember: in praying for the dead, we proclaim our faith in the living Christ, who is "the Resurrection and the Life."

Please remember in your prayers those who have passed in the past year. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen.

Stewardship Spotlight: Praying for Souls in Purgatory

In November, Catholics are invited to meditate on the Communion of Saints.

"We believe in the communion of all the faithful of Christ, those who are pilgrims on earth, the dead who are being purified, and the blessed in heaven, all together forming one Church; and we believe that in this communion, the merciful love of God and his saints is always [attentive] to our prayers" (CCC 962)

All Souls Day, begins the Church Militant's month-long focus on prayers for the dead. This dedicated period reminds us to pray for souls in Purgatory (the Church Suffering).

"It is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins" (2 Macc. 12: 46).

Our readings today proclaim our hope in life everlasting with the Church Triumphant and all saints in heaven. Our prayers for souls in Purgatory are spiritual works of mercy and may, under proper conditions, gain plenary or partial indulgences.

We grow in our own conversion and holiness as we pray for the souls in purgatory, while helping souls attain heaven. St. John Paul II stated that, "the spiritual condition for receiving a plenary indulgence is the exclusion 'of all attachment to sin, even venial sin.' Therefore, it would be a mistake to think that we can receive this gift by simply performing certain outward acts. On the contrary, they are required as the expression and support of our progress in conversion."
