Guidelines for Communion For Catholics

- To be in a state of grace, that is to say, to be free from any unconfessed mortal sin.
- To abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from any food and drink, with the exception of water and medicine.
- 3. To know what you are receiving and to approach the altar with devotion.
- 4. Please consume the Holy Eucharist in front of the minister of Holy Communion, before walking away.

For Non-Catholics: We welcome you to Holy Mass and are glad you are here. Please feel free to participate by singing, standing, kneeling, etc. However, the reception of Holy Communion is reserved for Catholics in a state of grace.

At the time of Communion, we invite you to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest for a blessing or to remain in your pew.

FROM THE PASTOR



On this Feast of Christ the King, our readings show us that we serve the greatest of Kings, who is at the same time the humblest of Kings. Christ is

the perfect model of servant leadership. And what an indescribable privilege that He has called us to be servant leaders — stewards in the work of advancing His Kingdom.

In our second reading, from St. Paul's letter to the Colossians, Paul describes the great power and dignity that characterize Christ the King. "All things were created through him and for him. He is before all things and in him all things hold together." It makes you want to stand up and cheer. That's our King!

Yet, what a contrasting description of the same King we find in our Gospel passage, from Luke. Now we see our King nailed to the Cross. Everyone from rulers to soldiers, to the criminals on either side of Christ is mocking, sneering, and reviling him. They tauntingly urge him to prove His kingship by coming down from the Cross to end his suffering with a great show of power. "if you are the King of the Jews, save yourself."

But He does not. Amazingly, it is in this moment of seeming-weakness and humiliation, when all appears hopeless and lost, that the full breadth of his greatness as king is displayed. Though all things were created through and for Him — Christ chooses to live entirely for others, for us!

What does this mean for us as his followers and stewards of His kingdom? It is precisely that our lives are not about us. They are about Christ and others. And we will advance his kingdom to the extent that we embrace this mindset: my life is not about me; it is about serving the King of kings. © Catholic Stewardship Consultants, 2025

Stewardship Spotlight: Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

Growing in Christ, Serving One Another, Sharing Our Gifts, and Connecting in Faith.

As we celebrate the feast of Christ the King, it is a good time for special reflection on Holy Communion and the grace we receive in the true body, blood, soul, and divinity of Christ. "Then he took the bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, saying, 'This is my body, which will be given for you; do this in memory of me.'" (Luke 22:19). May we never take for granted this gift which strengthens us and increases our unity with Christ, our King.

Our spotlight this week highlights a ministry that helps ensure the availability of Holy Communion for all those who need it. Our bishops, priests, and deacons are ordinary ministers of Holy Communion by the authority of their ordination. In a church the size of St. Mark, more than ordained ministers are needed to distribute Holy Communion effectively during weekend Masses and to those who are homebound, in nursing homes, assisted living facilities, or hospitalized. Lay parishioners answering the call to serve in this way become Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion.

Training is provided to ensure proper reverence, consistency, and a safe environment in accordance with church norms. In a statement of welcome to this ministry Father John notes that these volunteers, "...not only respond to their Baptismal call to serve the people of God, but make a commitment to Christ through their dedication and evangelization as instructed at the end of Mass: 'Go and Announce the Gospel of the Lord.' They share in Christ's loving ministry to His people as they visit with or offer the Eucharist."

Prepare the Way: St. Andrew Christmas Novena

When: Pray Daily, Nov. 30-Dec. 24

St. Andrew is associated with this Christmas novena because it begins on his feast day, November 30. He holds the honor of being the first apostle to be called by Christ to follow Him. This novena is a bit different in that it does not invoke the intervention or aid of the saint himself, but is adoring, glorifying the hour of Christ's birth and seeking aid from God Himself!

The St. Andrew Christmas Novena is typically prayed for 25 days and continues until Christmas Eve on December 24. All you have to do is pray the short novena prayer 15 times each day; you can pray them all at once or spread throughout the day. We can't promise you will get your request, but praying is indeed a gift to the Holy Child and a beautiful way to spiritually prepare for Christmas season by reflecting on Christ's birth.

Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in the piercing cold.



Mass & Veneration of the Relics of St. Anthony of Padua


St. Mark Catholic Church is honored to welcome two precious first-class relics of St. Anthony of Padua from the Pontifical Basilica in Padua, Italy. The relics will be accompanied by Fr. Mario Conte and Fr. Fabio Turrisendo, Franciscan Friars from the Basilica where the saint is buried.

About the Relics

Two reliquaries will be present:

- A golden bust containing layers of skin from St. Anthony's cheek
- A free-standing reliquary containing a fragment of his floating rib

These relics have been venerated by Pope Francis, Saint John Paul II, Saint Mother Teresa, Pope Benedict XVI, and Servant of God Sr. Lúcia of Fatima.



After each Mass, the faithful may venerate the relics and participate in the worldwide tradition of writing prayer petitions to St. Anthony. Cards, pens, and holy cards will be provided. All petitions will be brought back to the saint's tomb in Padua, where the Franciscan Friars will pray for each intention.

Who Is St. Anthony?

Born in 1195 in Lisbon and a brilliant Franciscan preacher, St. Anthony died in 1231 at the age of 35 and was canonized within a year, one of the fastest canonizations in Church history. Known for his miracles, teaching, and powerful intercession, he was declared a Doctor of the Church in 1946. While famous for helping find lost items, St. Anthony is also a patron for those seeking faith, family harmony, health, hope, peace of mind, and trust.

All are invited to join us for this special day of grace and to seek the intercession of one of the Church's most beloved saints.



En esta Fiesta de Cristo Rey, nuestras lecturas nos muestran que servimos al más grande de los Reyes, que es al mismo tiempo el más humilde de los Reyes. Cristo es el modelo perfecto de liderazgo servidor. Y qué privilegio tan indescriptible que Él nos haya llamado a ser líderes servidores — administradores en la obra de avanzar en Su Reino.

En nuestra segunda lectura, de la carta de San Pablo a los Colosenses, Pablo describe el gran poder y dignidad que caracterizan a Cristo Rey. "Todas las cosas fueron creadas a través de él y para él. Todos, desde gobernantes hasta soldados, pasando por los criminales de ambos lados de Cristo, se burlan, se burlan y le desprecien. Le instan burlonamente a demostrar su realeza bajando de la Cruz para acabar con su sufrimiento con una gran demostración de poder. "si eres el Rey de los judíos, sálvate."

Pero no lo hace. Sorprendentemente, es en este momento de aparente debilidad y humillación, cuando todo parece perdido y desesperanzado, cuando se muestra toda la magnitud de su grandeza como rey. Aunque todas las cosas fueron creadas a través de Él y para Él — Cristo elige vivir enteramente para los demás, ¡para nosotros! ¿Qué significa esto para nosotros como sus seguidores y guardianes de Su reino? Es precisamente que nuestras vidas no giran en torno a nosotros. Son sobre Cristo y los demás. Y avanzaremos en su reino hasta la medida en que adoptemos esta mentalidad: mi vida no gira en torno a mí; se trata de servir al Rey de Reyes. © Consultores de Gestión Católica, 2025


