- To know what you are receiving and to approach the altar with devotion.
- Please consume the Holy Eucharist in front of the minister of Holy Communion, before walking away.

For Non-Catholics: We welcome you to Holy Mass and are glad you are here. Please feel free to participate by singing, standing, kneeling, etc. However, the reception of Holy Communion is reserved for Catholics in a state of grace.

#### FROM THE PASTOR



On this Second Sunday of Advent, our second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Romans encourages us to focus our Advent preparations in this way: "Welcome one another, then, as Christ

welcomed you, for the glory of God." And how does Christ welcome us? With unconditional love.

This is the essence of Christian hospitality, a vital aspect of stewardship living. Fully embraced, it has the power to transform our lives and the lives of those who experience it through us.

The practice of Christian hospitality is also a way for us stewards to answer the call of John the Baptist, in our Gospel passage from Matthew. His words apply just as much to us today as they did to the people awaiting the Savior's arrival. John says, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" And he recalls the words of the prophet Isaiah, "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." There is a definite connection between repentance and effective hospitality.

So how can we make repentance a regular part of our everyday lives? We can make an "examination of conscience" a daily part of our prayers, thanking God for the times we said "yes" to Him, and asking forgiveness for the times we chose our own will. We can (and should!) go to Confession this Advent. We can reach out to a family member or friend where there is distance or discord and make peace.

As we "straighten the paths" of our own hearts and minds, we become more hospitable people, better stewards of God's grace and mercy, and far more open and ready to invite others into our lives, homes, and parish. #### **Pastoral Pondering**

Pope Leo XIV, the 267th Bishop of Rome, undertook his inaugural apostolic journey abroad from November 27 to December 2, 2025. This six-day itinerary encompassed Turkey (November 27–30) and Lebanon (November 30–December 2), marking a deliberate choice of destinations in the Middle East amid ongoing regional conflicts and global ecclesiastical anniversaries. As the successor to Pope Francis, who had planned a similar trip before his passing in April 2025, Leo XIV's

voyage fulfills a commitment to ecumenical and inter-religious engagement while advancing themes central to his nascent papacy: peace, unity, and dialogue.

## Historical and Ecumenical Significance in Turkey

The Turkish leg of the journey centered on Iznik (ancient Nicaea), where Pope Leo XIV participated in commemorations of the 1,700th anniversary of the First Council of Nicaea (325 AD). This ecumenical council, convened by Emperor Constantine I. produced the Nicene Creed-a foundational statement of Christian faith affirming the divinity of Christ and shared by Catholic, Orthodox, and Protestant traditions. The event underscored the common heritage of Christianity, with Leo XIV joining Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew I of Constantinople for a joint declaration and doxology at the Patriarchal Church of Saint George in Istanbul. This collaboration highlights efforts to bridge the schism between the Catholic and Eastern Orthodox churches, echoing historical papal visits to Turkey (e.g., by Pope Paul VI in 1967 and Pope Benedict XVI in 2006).

In a broader context, the visit to predominantly Muslim Turkey (where Christians constitute less than 0.5% of the population) served as a gesture of interfaith outreach. Key moments included a prayer at Istanbul's Blue Mosquethough Leo XIV refrained from visibly praying there, distinguishing his approach from predecessors—and a meeting with President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan. Discussions addressed tensions over sites like the Hagia Sophia, reconverted to a mosque in 2020, and emphasized mutual respect amid Turkey's role as a crossroads of early Christianity and St. Paul's homeland. The pilgrimage thus reinforced the papacy's commitment to fostering "what unites us" over divisions, as articulated by Vatican spokespersons.

## Humanitarian and Diplomatic Significance in Lebanon

Transitioning to Lebanon, Pope Leo XIV's itinerary addressed the nation's profound challenges: economic collapse since 2019, the devastating 2020 Beirut port explosion (which killed over 200 and displaced thousands), and renewed violence from Israeli airstrikes in 2024 targeting Hezbollah positions, despite a fragile Gaza ceasefire. Lebanon's Christian community, the largest in the Arab world (comprising 30–35% of the population), faces

emigration and instability, making the visit a vital affirmation of solidarity.

Notable engagements included meetings with President Joseph Aoun, Parliament Speaker Nabih Berri, and Prime Minister Nawaf Salam; an inter-religious prayer at Beirut's port memorializing explosion victims; and visits to the tomb of St. Charbel and the statue of Our Lady of Lebanon. An open-air Mass at Beirut's waterfront, anticipated to draw 120,000 attendees, symbolized communal resilience. Hezbollah leader Naim Qassem extended a formal welcome, delivering a letter via group members and framing the visit as an opportunity for dialogue on regional peace. This outreach to Muslimmajority Lebanon (65-70% Muslim) amplified Leo XIV's message of coexistence, drawing parallels to Pope John Paul II's 1997 visit and Benedict XVI's in 2012 amid the Syrian civil war.

## Broader Geopolitical and Papal Implications

Occurring against the backdrop of a "piecemeal" third world war— encompassing Ukraine, Gaza, and Middle Eastern flashpoints—Leo XIV's journey positioned the Holy See as a moral voice for de-escalation. In addresses, he invoked his predecessor Pope Francis's warnings on humanity's endangered future, urging world leaders to prioritize peace negotiations. The trip's timing, covered by over 80 journalists from 15 countries (including major U.S. networks), amplified its global resonance, particularly as the first foreign voyage of an American pope.

Symbolically, selecting Muslim-majority nations for his debut underscores a pontificate rooted in Augustinian spirituality (Leo XIV being the first from the Order of Saint Augustine) and social teaching, echoing Pope Leo XIII's emphasis on justice in industrialized eras. It signals continuity with Francis's bridge-building while introducing Leo XIV's vision: unity across faiths, support for persecuted minorities, and advocacy for the vulnerable. By December 2, 2025, the visit had already prompted reflections on its potential to influence fragile truces and inter-communal harmony in the region.

This apostolic journey, therefore, transcends ceremonial bounds, serving as a strategic affirmation of the Catholic Church's role in promoting global stability and religious solidarity.



## Stewardship Spotlight: Producing Good Fruit Growing in Christ, Serving One Another, Sharing Our Gifts, and Connecting in Faith

Our Gospel today calls us to produce good fruit as evidence of our repentance. The desire to repent is rooted in recognizing our sin and admitting when our deeds and words do not align with Jesus' teaching. When we respond to His call to be Christian disciples, the evidence of how well we truly repent becomes visible in the fruit of our work.

"Offerings, when born of love, not only alleviate the needs of one's brother or sister, but also purify the heart of the giver, if he or she is willing to change." (46. Apostolic Exhortation Dilexite of the Holy Father Leo XIV to All Christians on Love for the Poor) When we offer our time, talent, and treasure to perform works of Mercy, we become a sign of hope in the world. Ideally, this is done in love, a sign of perfect contrition.

#### The Immaculate Conception: Holy Day of Obligation

This year, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary—the patronal feast of the United States—falls on Monday, December 8, and remains a Holy Day of Obligation. Because of the calendar, Catholics will need to attend two separate Masses over two days:

- Mass for the Sunday obligation (Second Sunday of Advent)
- Mass for the Holy Day of Obligation (Immaculate Conception)

## The Immaculate Conception and Advent

Celebrated each year on December 8, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception honors the moment when Mary, by a unique grace of God, was preserved from original sin from the first instant of her conception.

This teaching highlights God's plan for our salvation: from the very beginning, He prepared a pure and holy mother for His Son.

During Advent, as we prepare to welcome Christ anew, this feast reminds us that God always goes before us. Long before the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem, God's saving work was already unfolding in Mary. Her "yes" to God makes her the model of discipleship: trusting, receptive, and full of grace.

The Immaculate Conception is also the patronal feast of our country. We ask Mary's intercession for our Church, our nation, and our families as we seek to grow in holiness during this sacred season.

Please plan now to attend:

- One Mass for the Second Sunday of Advent
- One Mass for the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception

Thank you for keeping these holy days with faith and devotion as we journey through Advent together.

St. Mark Catholic Church is honored to welcome two precious first-class relics of St. Anthony of Padua from the Pontifical Basilica in Padua, Italy. The relics will be accompanied by Fr. Mario Conte and Fr. Fabio Turrisendo, Franciscan Friars from the Basilica where the saint is buried.



#### About the Relics

Two reliquaries will be present:

- A golden bust containing layers of skin from St. Anthony's cheek
- A freestanding reliquary containing a fragment of his floating rib

These relics have been venerated by Pope Francis, Saint John Paul II, Saint Mother Teresa, Pope Benedict XVI, and Sr. Lúcia of Fatima.

#### **Veneration & Prayer Petitions**

After each Mass, the faithful may venerate the relics and take part in the worldwide tradition of writing prayer petitions to St. Anthony. Cards, pens, and holy cards will be provided. All petitions will be returned to the saint's tomb in Padua, where the Franciscan Friars will pray for each intention.

#### Who Is St. Anthony?

Born in 1195 in Lisbon, St. Anthony became a brilliant Franciscan preacher known for his miracles, teaching, and powerful intercession. He died in 1231 at age 35 and was canonized within a year—one of the fastest canonizations in Church history. In 1946 he was declared a Doctor of the Church.

While well-known for helping find lost items, St. Anthony is also a patron for those seeking faith, family harmony, health, hope, peace of mind, and trust.

All are warmly invited to join us for this special day of grace and to seek the intercession of one of the Church's most beloved saints.





En este segundo domingo de Adviento, nuestra segunda lectura de la carta de San Pablo a los romanos nos anima a enfocar nuestros preparativos de Adviento de esta manera: "Recibidos unos a otros, pues, como Cristo os acogió, para la gloria de Dios." ¿Y cómo nos recibe Cristo? Con amor incondicional.

Esta es la esencia de la hospitalidad cristiana, un aspecto vital de la vida de mayordomía. Plenamente aceptado, tiene el poder de transformar nuestras vidas y las vidas de quienes lo experimentan a través de nosotros.

La práctica de la hospitalidad cristiana es también una forma para que nosotros, los mayordomos, respondamos al llamado de Juan el Bautista, en nuestro pasaje del Evangelio de Mateo. Sus palabras nos afectan hoy tanto como a las personas que esperan la llegada del Salvador. Juan dice: "¡Arrepiéntanse, porque el reino de los cielos está cerca!" Y recuerda las palabras del profeta Isaías: «Preparad el camino del Señor, rectificad sus caminos.» Existe una conexión clara entre el arrepentimiento y la hospitalidad efectiva.

Entonces, ¿cómo podemos hacer del arrepentimiento una parte habitual de nuestra vida cotidiana? Podemos hacer que un "examen de conciencia" sea parte diaria de nuestras oraciones, dando gracias a Dios por las veces que le dijimos "sí" y pidiendo perdón por los momentos en que elegimos nuestra propia voluntad. Podemos (¡y deberíamos!) ir a confesar este Adviento. Podemos contactar con un familiar o amigo donde haya distancia o discordia y hacer las paces.

A medida que "rectificamos los caminos" de nuestro propio corazón y mente, nos convertimos en personas más hospitalarias, mejores administradores de la gracia y misericordia de Dios, y mucho más abiertos y dispuestos a invitar a otros a nuestras vidas, hogares y parroquia. Reflexión pastoral - El Papa León XIV, el 267° obispo de Roma emprendió su viaje apostólico inaugural al extranjero del 27 de noviembre al 2 de diciembre de 2025. Este itinerario de seis días abarcó Turquía (27–30 de noviembre) y Líbano (30–2 de diciembre), marcando una elección deliberada de destinos en Oriente Medio en medio de conflictos regionales en curso y aniversarios eclesiásticos globales. Como sucesor del Papa Francisco, quien había planeado un viaje similar antes de su fallecimiento en abril de 2025, el viaje de León XIV cumple un compromiso con el compromiso ecuménico e interreligioso, al

tiempo que avanza temas centrales para su incipiente papado: paz, unidad y diálogo.

## Importancia histórica y ecuménica en Turquía

La etapa turca del viaje se centró en İznik (antigua Nicea), donde el papa León XIV participó en las conmemoraciones del 1.700 aniversario del Primer Concilio de Nicea (325 d.C.). Este concilio ecuménico, convocado por el emperador Constantino I, produjo el Credo Niceno, una declaración fundamental de la fe cristiana que afirma la divinidad de Cristo y es compartida por las tradiciones católica, ortodoxa y protestante. El evento puso de relieve la herencia común del cristianismo, con León XIV uniéndose al patriarca ecuménico Bartolomé I de Constantinopla para una declaración conjunta y doxología en la Iglesia Patriarcal de San Jorge en Estambul. Esta colaboración pone de relieve los esfuerzos para tender puentes entre las iglesias católica v ortodoxa oriental, haciendo eco de las históricas visitas papales a Turquía (por ejemplo, de los papas Pablo VI en 1967 y Benedicto XVI en 2006).

En un contexto más amplio, la visita a la Turquía predominantemente musulmana (donde los cristianos constituyen menos del 0,5% de la población) sirvió como un gesto de alcance interreligioso. Momentos clave incluyeron una oración en la Mezquita Azul de Estambul—aunque León XIV se abstuvo de rezar visiblemente allí, distinguiendo su enfoque de sus predecesores—y una reunión con el presidente Recep Tayyip Erdoğan. Las discusiones abordaron las tensiones en lugares como Santa Sofía, reconvertida en mezguita en 2020, y enfatizaron el respeto mutuo en medio del papel de Turquía como encrucijada entre el cristianismo primitivo y la patria de San Pablo. La peregrinación reforzó así el compromiso del papado de fomentar "lo que nos une" por encima de las divisiones, tal y como expresaron los portavoces del Vaticano.

#### Importancia humanitaria y diplomática en el Líbano

Al trasladarse al Líbano, el itinerario del Papa León XIV abordó los profundos desafíos de la nación: el colapso económico desde 2019, la devastadora explosión del puerto de Beirut en 2020 (que causó más de 200 muertes y desplazaron a miles), y la renovada violencia por los ataques aéreos israelíes en 2024 dirigidos a posiciones de Hezbolá, a pesar de un frágil alto el fuego en Gaza. La comunidad cristiana del Líbano, la mayor del mundo árabe (que comprende entre el 30 y el 35% de la población), enfrenta la emigración y la inestabilidad, lo que convierte la visita en una afirmación vital de solidaridad.

Entre sus compromisos destacados se encuentran reuniones con el presidente Joseph Aoun, el presidente del Parlamento, Nabih Berri, y el primer ministro, Nawaf Salam; una oración interreligiosa en el puerto de Beirut en conmemoración de las víctimas de la explosión; y visitas a la tumba de San Charbel y a la estatua de Nuestra Señora del Líbano. Una misa al aire libre en el malecón de Beirut, que se esperaba atraería a 120.000 asistentes, simbolizaba la resiliencia comunitaria. El líder de Hezbolá, Naim Qassem, le dio la bienvenida formal, entregando una carta a través de los miembros del grupo y presentando la visita como una oportunidad para el diálogo sobre la paz regional. Este acercamiento al Líbano de mayoría musulmana (65-70% musulmán) amplificó el mensaje de convivencia de León XIV, trazando paralelismos con la visita del Papa Juan Pablo II en 1997 y la de Benedicto XVI en 2012 en medio de la guerra civil siria.

### Implicaciones geopolíticas y papales más amplias

Ocurriendo en el contexto de una tercera guerra mundial "fragmentada" -que abarcaba Ucrania, Gaza y puntos conflictivos de Oriente Medio- el viaje de León XIV posicionó a la Santa Sede como una voz moral para la desescalada. En sus discursos, invocó las advertencias de su predecesor, el Papa Francisco, sobre el futuro en peligro de la humanidad, instando a los líderes mundiales a priorizar las negociaciones de paz. El momento del viaje, cubierto por más de 80 periodistas de 15 países (incluidas grandes cadenas estadounidenses), amplificó su resonancia global, especialmente como el primer viaje al extranjero de un papa estadounidense.

Simbólicamente, seleccionar naciones de mayoría musulmana para su debut subraya un pontificado arraigado en la espiritualidad agustiniana (León XIV fue el primero de la Orden de San Agustín) y en la doctrina social, haciendo eco del énfasis del papa León XIII en la justicia en las eras industriales. Señala continuidad con la construcción de puentes de Francisco mientras introduce la visión de León XIV: unidad entre religiones, apoyo a minorías perseguidas y defensa de los vulnerables. Para el 2 de diciembre de 2025, la visita ya había provocado reflexiones sobre su potencial para influir en frágiles treguas y armonía intercomunal en la región.

Este camino apostólico, por tanto, trasciende los límites ceremoniales, sirviendo como una afirmación estratégica del papel de la Iglesia Católica en la promoción de la estabilidad global y la solidaridad religiosa.




