### Guidelines for Communion For Catholics

- To be in a state of grace, that is to say, to be free from any unconfessed mortal sin.
- To abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from any food and drink, with the exception of water and medicine.
- To know what you are receiving and to approach the altar with devotion.
- St. Mark uses altar rails. Please go to the far end of the rail and either kneel to receive Holy Communion on the tongue or remain standing to receive in your hand. The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended.
- Please consume the Holy Eucharist in front of the minister of Holy Communion, before walking away.

# FROM THE PASTOR



As our Advent preparations draw to a close and Christmas fast approaches, it is fitting that today's readings demonstrate the intensity of the Father's perfect

and passionate love for each of us, culminating in the gift of His own Son, Jesus Christ, on Christmas Day. As we reflect on the enormity of this gift, let us ask ourselves what we can offer in return.

In our first reading, from Isaiah, the Lord invites King Ahaz to "ask for a sign from the Lord, your God." And not just any sign. The Lord says, "let it be deep as the nether-world, or high as the sky!" Ahaz, though, cannot arouse himself from his bleak and limited outlook, and actually refuses this invitation. Undeterred by his negativity, the Lord says through the prophet Isaiah, that he himself will provide the sign: "the virgin shall conceive and bear a son" and his name will be Emmanuel which means, "God with us." What great love and patience our heavenly Father has shown his people throughout all ages!

In the second reading, from Paul's letter to the Romans, St. Paul sends a blessing of "Grace...and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. This — grace and peace — is precisely the gift we celebrate on Christmas Day. Through his incarnation, Jesus brings the intimate love of God right into our midst; and through His death and resurrection, He

saves us from our sins and restores us to right relationship with the Father. This is the peace that the world cannot offer.

In response to such an overwhelming gift, what can we do except offer our lives as a gift in return, embracing a stewardship way of life with all the love and strength we have to give?

In our Gospel passage from Matthew, we find an unparalleled example of one who embraced this way of life in St. Joseph, as he responds to God's call to him through the message of an angel. St. Joseph immediately and humbly obeys the instruction from the angel: "Do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." Open to this extraordinary role, he did as the angel commanded and "takes Mary into his home."

We never hear St. Joseph speak, but the Scriptures tell us he was always listening, attentive to the leading of the Holy Spirit for his family. It was Joseph who found the stable where the baby Jesus would be born. No doubt it was Joseph who cleaned it up and prepared it for Mary and Jesus since we know that Mary was about to give birth. Joseph protected the family, guarded them, and tended to their safety, their comfort, and their well-being at the expense of his own plans and preferences. Though we do not hear any words from St. Joseph his actions clearly show that he offered himself, his whole life, as a gift to his family through his strong guidance, protection, and service.

Let us imitate St. Joseph, then, as good stewards, giving our very lives to those around us in love and gratitude to God who has given us everything we have, especially His own Son, Jesus Christ. We will no doubt find that the more we give ourselves away, the more our generous Father will fill us with His grace and peace — these are truly the best Christmas gifts we could receive. © Catholic Stewardship Consultants, 2025

### Stewardship Spotlight: Seeing and Serving God with Us

# Growing in Christ, Serving One Another, Sharing Our Gifts, and Connecting in Faith

As we prepare to remember Jesus' birth, we hear that his very name, Emmanuel, means "God is with us". It bears reflection that He voluntarily came not only in lowly human form, not only to a poor family, but humbling himself to be born where animals lodged, and quickly migrating to avoid the murderous wrath of a jealous king. These circumstances help lead us where He wants us to go. As Jesus lived humbly, He also calls us to see Him in the faces of the poor.

Many saints have sought to emulate Christ and live fully in this call. Saint Mother Teresa took a vow of poverty to serve and live among the poorest of the poor. Saint Francis of Assisi, "saw brothers and sisters, living images of the Lord... through a solidarity that overcame distances and a compassionate love." (64. Apostolic Exhortation Dilexite of the Holy Father Leo XIV to All Christians on Love for the Poor) Saint Clare of Assisi embraced voluntary poverty for her order and "taught her sisters that Christ was their only inheritance and that nothing should obscure their communion with him." (65. Apostolic Exhortation Dilexite of the Holy Father Leo XIV to All Christians on Love for the

Although we are not all called to voluntary poverty, we are all called to seek and serve Him through service to the poor and marginalized. "...whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me." (Matthew 25:40) There are many ways to respond to this call, and St. Mark's partners with several diocesan and community organizations, which we encourage you to prayerfully consider joining with your gifts of time, talent, and/or treasure. As those who give can attest, seeing and serving Jesus in the poor will transform us.

# The Holy Season of Christmas!

While the rest of the world is packing things up, we as Catholics are just getting started.

You will notice that it is only now that we adom the sanctuary with poinsettias, Christmas trees, and our beautiful Nativity. It's time for the proverbial 12 days of Christmas, so let the festivities and Christmas Carols begin!

The first 8 days are known as the Octave of Christmas, a time of solemn rejoicing. In the Catholic Church, solemnity doesn't mean grim, it means the highest ranking which means serious rejoicing, pomp and glory.

Each of these 8 days are celebrated just like they were Christmas day itself from Christmas Eve Vigil until the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God on January 1.

Epiphany is celebrated on the first Sunday after January 1, and this year that date is January 4! The Christmas Season officially comes to end on Sunday, January 11 when we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord.

Try to keep your Christmas tree up until then, but if you cannot, at least keep your Nativity on display.

# Hear the Testimony of Paul Zucarelli



When: Wed., Jan. 9, 7pm Where: Parish Hall

On Pentecost Sunday in 2017, Catholic businessman Paul Zucarelli went into sudden cardiac arrest after heart surgery. He suffered nine cardiac arrests and was clinically dead for nearly two hours. Doctors had little hope, yet through the fervent intercessory prayer of family, friends, and Bishop Thomas Olmsted, Paul

survived and returned with a powerful testimony of Heaven and of Christ's merciful love.

We cannot comprehend the love, mercy and grace of God who created each of us. I am a Blessed man who gives all glory to God Through the Cross of Jesus Christ - Christ in us our hope of Glory.

Paul shares how that experience completely changed his life and his priorities. Once focused on success and comfort, he now travels the country urging people to take God seriously, to return to

the sacraments, and to live every day in light of eternity. He tells his story in his book Faith Understood: An Ordinary Man's Journey to the Presence of God and in One Lord, One Faith, One Church, written with evangelist Jesse Romero.

His witness has been featured on EWTN Live with Fr. Mitch Pacwa and on Divine Mercy programs with Fr. Chris Alar, as well as on the John-Henry Westen Show and other Catholic media.

# DEL PASTOR—ADVIENTO

A medida que nuestros preparativos de Adviento llegan a su fin y se acerca el ayuno navideño, es apropiado que las lecturas de hoy demuestren la intensidad del amor perfecto y apasionado del Padre por cada uno de nosotros, culminando en el regalo de Su propio Hijo, Jesucristo, el día de Navidad. Al reflexionar sobre la magnitud de este regalo, preguntémonos qué podemos ofrecer a cambio.

En nuestra primera lectura, de Isaías, el Señor invita al rey Acaz a "pedir una señal al Señor, tu Dios." Y no es cualquier cartel. El Señor dice: "¡Sea tan profundo como el inframundo, o alto como el cielo!" Sin embargo, Ahaz no puede salir de su visión sombría y limitada, y de hecho rechaza esta invitación. Sin dejarse intimidar por su negatividad, el Señor dice a través del profeta Isaías que él mismo dará la señal: "la virgen concebirá y dará a luz un hijo" y su nombre será Emanuel, que significa "Dios con nosotros." ¡Qué gran amor y paciencia ha mostrado nuestro Padre celestial a su pueblo a lo largo de todos los tiempos!

En la segunda lectura, de la carta de San Pablo a los Romanos, San Pablo envía una bendición de "Gracia... y paz de parte de Dios nuestro Padre y del Señor Jesucristo. Esto — la gracia y la paz — es precisamente el regalo que celebramos el día de Navidad. A través de su encarnación, Jesús trae el amor íntimo de Dios directamente a nuestro medio; y mediante su muerte y resurrección, nos salva de nuestros pecados y nos devuelve la recta relación con el Padre. Esta es la paz que el mundo no puede ofrecer.

Ante un regalo tan abrumador, ¿qué podemos hacer salvo ofrecer nuestras vidas como regalo a cambio, abrazando una forma de vida de gestión con todo el amor y la fuerza que tenemos para dar?

En nuestro pasaje evangélico de Mateo encontramos un ejemplo inigualable de alguien que abrazó este modo de vida en San José, al responder al llamado de Dios a través del mensaje de un ángel. San José obedece de inmediato y humildemente la instrucción del ángel: "No tengáis miedo de acoger a María, vuestra esposa, en vuestra casa. Porque es por el Espíritu Santo que este niño ha sido concebido en ella. Ella dará a luz un hijo, y tú lo llamarás Jesús, porque él salvará a su pueblo de sus pecados." Abierto a este papel extraordinario, hizo lo que el ángel le ordenó y "acoge a María en su hogar."

Nunca escuchamos hablar a San José, pero las Escrituras nos dicen que siempre escuchaba, atento a la guía del Espíritu Santo para su familia. Fue José quien encontró el establo donde nacería el niño Jesús. Sin duda fue José quien lo limpió y lo preparó para María y Jesús, ya que sabemos que María estaba a punto de dar a luz. 
