

## Guidelines for Communion For Catholics

1. To be in a state of grace, that is to say, to be free from any unconfessed mortal sin.
2. To abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from any food and drink, with the exception of water and medicine.
3. To know what you are receiving and to approach the altar with devotion.
4. *You may receive Holy Communion standing or kneeling.*
5. *Please consume the Holy Eucharist in front of the minister of Holy Communion, before walking away.*

**For Non-Catholics:** We welcome you to Holy Mass and are glad you are here. Please feel free to participate by singing, standing, kneeling, etc. However, the reception of Holy Communion is reserved for Catholics in a state of grace. At the time of Communion, please feel free to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest for a blessing or to remain in your pew. See page 1302 in the hymnal for more information.

# FROM THE PASTOR



Today's readings remind us that stewardship is not just a thing we do — rather, stewardship is at the core of who we are as disciples of Christ.

Our first reading, from Isaiah, contains this prophecy of Christ and what His saving message would mean to all who embrace it. "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone." We are among those blessed people on whom the light of Christ has shone. By virtue of our Baptism, we, who were once in the darkness of original sin, have been reborn into the great light that is God's grace in us. We are cherished members of God's family.

What a privilege! Yet, with this privilege comes the responsibility to actually live for God and to bring His Good News to all those we meet — at work, at school, in our community and right in our own home — in other words, to live as His good stewards.

And there is a certain urgency that comes with the call to a stewardship way of life as we see in our Gospel passage from Matthew. Jesus says, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." In other words, turn away from selfishness, turn towards God and live as His disciple now — don't wait!

In this same passage, the very first disciples give us examples of a good steward's prompt "yes" when the Lord called to them. Our Lord invites them to "Come after me and I will make you fishers of men." They did not hesitate but "at once they left their nets and followed him." They put our Lord and His will first.

This is the essence of a stewardship way of life — to be always ready for the ways that our Lord is calling us to bring His light to others. It's more than something we do — it's who we are. © Catholic Stewardship Consultants, 2025.

**Pastoral Pondering** — This past Thursday was the 53rd anniversary of the Supreme Court's *Roe vs. Wade* decision that legalized abortion. Even though that decision and the one that followed have been overturned by the Court, the work of defending life continues.

Even though the U.S. Supreme Court's 2022 decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization* overturned *Roe v. Wade* and returned abortion regulation to the states, the Catholic Church's commitment to the sanctity of human life remains unchanged and multifaceted. From a Catholic perspective, grounded in scripture, tradition, and teachings like those in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (e.g., CCC 2270-2275), advocacy for life isn't solely tied to one court ruling or legal framework—it's a holistic moral imperative that extends beyond abortion to all threats against human dignity. The key reasons why Catholics are called to continue this work:

## 1. Abortion Remains Legal and Accessible in Many Places Including NC

The *Dobbs* decision didn't ban abortion nationwide; it simply decentralized the issue. As of 2026, abortion is still legal in over half of U.S. states, often with few restrictions up to viability or beyond in some cases (e.g., California, New York). Millions of abortions occur annually, and access has expanded through measures like mail-order abortion pills (e.g., mifepristone). Catholics are urged to advocate for protective laws at the state and federal levels to safeguard the unborn, as the Church views direct abortion as intrinsically evil and never justifiable.

Beyond legislation, this includes supporting crisis pregnancy centers, adoption services, and policies that help women facing unplanned pregnancies, aligning with the Church's emphasis on mercy and practical charity.

## 2. Ongoing Cultural and Political Challenges

Pro-abortion initiatives continue to gain traction, such as ballot measures in states like Florida and Arizona that have sought to enshrine abortion rights in constitutions, or federal proposals to codify *Roe-like* protections. The Church teaches that Catholics have a duty to participate in the public square (e.g., via voting, lobbying, and education) to counter these efforts and promote a "culture of life," as articulated by Pope St. John Paul II in *Evangelium Vitae* (1995).

Globally, abortion rates remain high, and issues like international funding for abortion providers (e.g., through U.S. foreign aid) persist, requiring advocacy on an international scale.

## 3. The Broader Pro-Life Ethic

Catholic pro-life advocacy isn't limited to abortion; concern for life issues encompass all stages of life. This includes opposing euthanasia and assisted suicide (now legal in 10+ U.S. states and parts of Canada/Europe), promoting alternatives to the death penalty, embryonic stem cell research, human trafficking, poverty, war, and environmental degradation that harms the vulnerable.

Overturning *Roe* was a milestone, but it doesn't address root causes like economic inequality, lack of family support, or societal pressures that lead to abortion. Catholics are called to build a society where life is welcomed and protected through social justice initiatives, echoing Pope Francis's calls in *Fratelli Tutti* (2020) for integral human development.

## 4. Spiritual and Moral Witness

Ultimately, the Church's stance is rooted in the belief that every human life is sacred, created in God's image (Genesis 1:27), and that protecting the innocent is a core Gospel mandate (e.g., Matthew 25:40). Laws may change, but moral truth doesn't—Catholics are to witness to this truth through prayer, education, and personal example, fostering conversion of hearts rather than relying solely on legal victories.

Organizations like the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) emphasize that the fight for life is ongoing, urging parishes to engage in initiatives like Walking with Moms in Need to provide tangible support.

In summary, while *Dobbs* was a significant win, it's not the end of the road. The Catholic call to "stand up for life" is perpetual, driven by faith, compassion, and a vision for a just society.



## Stephen Ministry

We all go through times of grief, children leaving home, divorce, parenting, job loss, issues related to aging, cancer diagnosis, adjustment to retirement, medical crisis, job stress, spiritual crisis, unemployment, stress of being a caregiver, relocation, hospitalization, changing in living situations, terminal illness, natural disaster, chronic health conditions, adjustment to disability, rehabilitation from illness or injury, marital separation, pregnancy.

## Virtue for the Week: Humility

As we continue our journey through Ordinary Time, the Church invites us to grow in the virtue of humility—the virtue that allows us to be taught, formed, and led by Christ.

Humility is not weakness or self-diminishment. It is truthfully recognizing who we are before God and trusting that everything we have is a gift. In the early weeks of Ordinary Time, Jesus forms His disciples quietly and patiently, shaping their hearts before sending them into the world. Humility makes that formation possible.

In our church, the pillar marked Humility is located in the left transept—somewhat hidden, easily passed without notice. This placement itself reflects the nature of the virtue. Humility does not seek attention. It does not announce itself. It is lived faithfully, often unseen.

Beneath this pillar stands the statue of St. John Neumann, a shepherd known not for prominence, but for tireless service, simplicity of life, and deep pastoral care. Though he became a bishop, he lived humbly among his people, giving himself fully to the work God entrusted to him. His relic rests beneath our altar—a quiet reminder that holiness is often rooted in hidden fidelity rather than recognition.

The opposite of humility is pride or self-sufficiency, believing we can follow Christ on our own terms. Humility turns us instead toward trust, obedience, and openness to grace. It teaches us to listen before acting and to receive before being sent.

As Fr. John has encouraged us this year, spiritual growth often means allowing God to transform our vices into virtues. When we choose humility—through prayer, repentance, and teachability—we make room for God to work more deeply within us.

As we walk with Christ through Ordinary Time, may we ask for the grace to grow in humility, following the quiet example of the saints who learned to serve not for recognition, but for love of God and His people.



# GROWING HOME – UPDATE

## Growing Home: An Update on the New Rectory

If you've driven by Ranson Road lately, you've probably noticed the new rectory taking shape. It's exciting to see this long-planned part of our Growing Home Capital Campaign becoming a visible reality.

St. Mark is blessed with an active and growing clergy presence. We currently have our pastor, Fr. John Putnam, two parochial vicars, Fr. Kevin Martinez and Fr. Christopher Angermeyer, and Fr. Aaron Huber, chaplain at Christ the King High School, who lives in residence and assists with Sunday Masses.

Throughout the year, and especially during summer, Christmas, and Easter breaks from seminary, the rectory is also home to upper-level seminarians and transitional deacons assigned to St. Mark for pastoral formation. At any given time, it is not uncommon for four to eight men to be living in the house.

The new rectory is designed to support this reality of parish life:

Allowing our priests and seminarians to live on campus, close to the church and parishioners

Supporting daily prayer, Mass, study, and homily preparation

Making it easier to respond to hospital visits, emergencies, and late-night calls

Providing appropriate space for fraternity, rest, and hospitality

A rectory is a working home. It is where priests pray for the parish, prepare for the sacraments, welcome those in formation, and live the shared life of ministry. Creating a space that supports this way of life helps ensure that our priests can serve generously and sustainably.

Watching the rectory rise is a visible sign that St. Mark is truly growing home—for our parish family, for our priests, for seminarians, and for those God may be calling to the priesthood in the years ahead.



# DEL PASTOR



Las lecturas de hoy nos recuerdan que la mayordomía no es solo algo que hacemos, sino que la mayordomía está en el núcleo de quienes somos como discípulos de Cristo.

Nuestra primera lectura, de Isaías, contiene esta profecía de Cristo y lo que Su mensaje salvador significaría para todos los que lo abracen. "El pueblo que caminó en la oscuridad ha visto una gran luz; sobre los que habitaron en la tierra de la penumbra ha brillado una luz." Estamos entre aquellos bendecidos sobre quienes ha brillado la luz de Cristo. Por virtud de nuestro Bautismo, nosotros, que una vez estuvimos en la oscuridad del pecado original, hemos renacido en la gran luz que es la gracia de Dios en nosotros. Somos miembros queridos de la familia de Dios.

¡Qué privilegio! Sin embargo, con este privilegio viene la responsabilidad de vivir realmente para Dios y de llevar Sus Buenas Nuevas a todos los que conocemos — en el trabajo, en la escuela, en nuestra comunidad y en nuestro propio hogar — es decir, vivir como Sus buenos mayordomos.

Y hay cierta urgencia que viene con el llamado a una forma de vida de mayordomía, tal como vemos en nuestro pasaje del Evangelio de Mateo. Jesús dice: "Arrepíentense, porque el reino de los cielos está cerca." En otras palabras, aléjate del egoísmo, vuelve hacia Dios y vive como Su discípulo ahora — ¡no esperes!

En este mismo pasaje, los primeros discípulos nos dan ejemplos del "sí" de un buen mayordomo cuando el Señor les llamó. Nuestro Señor les invita a "Seguid a mí y os haré pescadores de hombres." No dudaron, pero "de inmediato dejaron sus redes y le siguieron." Ponen a nuestro Señor y su voluntad primero.

**Reflexión pastoral** — El pasado jueves se cumplió el 53º aniversario de la decisión del Tribunal Supremo *Roe vs. Wade* que legalizó el aborto. Aunque esa decisión y la posterior hayan sido revocadas por el Tribunal, el trabajo de defensa de la vida continúa.

Aunque la decisión del Tribunal Supremo de EE. UU. en 2022 en el caso *Dobbs contra Jackson Women's Health Organization* revocó *Roe contra Wade* y devolvió la regulación del aborto a los estados, el compromiso de la Iglesia Católica con la santidad de la vida humana sigue siendo inalterado y multifacético. Desde una perspectiva católica, basada en las Escrituras, la tradición y enseñanzas como las del Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica (por ejemplo, CCC 2270-2275), la defensa de la vida no está ligada únicamente a una sentencia judicial o marco legal: es un imperativo moral holístico que va más allá del aborto a todas las amenazas contra la dignidad humana. Estas son las principales razones por las que los católicos están llamados a continuar con este trabajo:

## 1. El aborto sigue siendo legal y accesible en muchos lugares, incluida Carolina del Norte

La decisión *Dobbs* no prohibió el aborto a nivel nacional; simplemente descentralizó el asunto. A fecha de 2026, el aborto sigue siendo legal en más de la mitad de los estados de EE. UU., a menudo con pocas restricciones hasta la viabilidad o más allá en

algunos casos (por ejemplo, California, Nueva York). Millones de abortos se realizan anualmente, y el acceso se ha ampliado gracias a medidas como las píldoras abortivas por correo (por ejemplo, la mifepristona). Se insta a los católicos a abogar por leyes protectoras a nivel estatal y federal para salvaguardar a los no nacidos, ya que la Iglesia considera el aborto directo como intrínsecamente malo y nunca justificable.

Más allá de la legislación, esto incluye apoyar centros de embarazo en crisis, servicios de adopción y políticas que ayudan a mujeres que enfrentan embarazos no planeados, en línea con el énfasis de la Iglesia en la misericordia y la caridad práctica.

## 2. Desafíos culturales y políticos continuos

Las iniciativas proabortistas siguen ganando terreno, como las medidas electorales en estados como Florida y Arizona que han intentado consagrar el derecho al aborto en las constituciones, o las propuestas federales para codificar protecciones similares a *Roe*. La Iglesia enseña que los católicos tienen el deber de participar en el espacio público (por ejemplo, mediante el voto, el lobby y la educación) para contrarrestar estos esfuerzos y promover una "cultura de vida", tal como lo articuló el Papa San Juan Pablo II en *Evangelium Vitae* (1995).

A nivel mundial, las tasas de aborto siguen siendo altas, y persisten cuestiones como la financiación internacional de proveedores de abortos (por ejemplo, a través de la ayuda exterior estadounidense), lo que requiere defensa a nivel internacional.

## 3. La ética provida más amplia

La defensa católica provida no se limita al aborto; La preocupación por la vida abarca todas las etapas de la vida. Esto incluye oponerse a la eutanasia y al suicidio asistido (ahora legales en 10+ estados de EE. UU. y partes de Canadá/Europa), promover alternativas a la pena de muerte, la investigación con células madre embrionarias, la trata de personas, la pobreza, la guerra y la degradación ambiental que perjudica a los más vulnerables.

Revocar *Roe* fue un hito, pero no aborda causas profundas como la desigualdad económica, la falta de apoyo familiar ni las presiones sociales que conducen al aborto. Los católicos están llamados a construir una sociedad donde la vida sea bienvenida y protegida a través de iniciativas de justicia social, haciendo eco de los llamamientos del Papa Francisco en *Fratelli Tutti* (2020) para un desarrollo humano integral.

## 4. Testimonio espiritual y moral

En última instancia, la postura de la Iglesia se basa en la creencia de que toda vida humana es sagrada, creada a imagen de Dios (Génesis 1:27), y que proteger a los inocentes es un mandato fundamental del Evangelio (por ejemplo, Mateo 25:40). Las leyes pueden cambiar, pero la verdad moral no: los católicos deben dar testimonio de esta verdad a través de la oración, la educación y el ejemplo personal, fomentando la conversión de corazones en lugar de depender únicamente de victorias legales.

Organizaciones como la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de EE. UU. (USCCB) enfatizan que la lucha por la vida continúa, instando a las parroquias a participar en iniciativas como Caminando con Moms in Need para proporcionar un apoyo tangible.

En resumen, aunque *Dobbs* fue una victoria significativa, no es el final del camino. El llamado católico a "defender la vida" es perpetuo, impulsado por la fe, la compasión y una visión para una sociedad justa.


