Guidelines for Communion For Catholics

1. To be in a state of grace, that is to say, to be free from any unconfessed mortal sin.
2. To abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from any food and drink, with the exception of water and medicine.
3. To know what you are receiving and to approach the altar with devotion.
4. You may receive Holy Communion standing or kneeling.
5. **Please consume the Holy Eucharist in front of the minister of Holy Communion, before walking away.**

For Non-Catholics: We welcome you to Holy Mass and are glad you are here. Please feel free to participate by singing, standing, kneeling, etc. However, the reception of Holy Communion is reserved for Catholics in a state of grace. At the time of Communion, please feel free to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest for a blessing or to remain in your pew.

FROM THE PASTOR



The Gospel Reading for today is what is popularly called the Sermon on the Mount. Many think it is the absolute epitome of Jesus' teachings. To be sure it tells us how we are to live our lives, the attitudes we are to have. We must remember that those who were waiting and hoping for the Messiah expected a military leader, one who would lead them in battle against their oppressors.

In His Sermon on the Mount Jesus gives a more accurate perspective of Who He is. He begins what we call the Beatitudes (the word means "blessings") with "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." In a sense we are all "poor in spirit." Without the guidance and strength provided us by the Lord there is no way we can escape this poverty of spirit, of spirituality, if you will.

That is why we often say that living God-centered lives is at the very core of stewardship. Being a disciple of Christ translates into being a steward of our many gifts and blessings. Some scholars believe that Jesus may have given this sermon often during His ministry. Those who followed Jesus and became the earliest Christians, the first members of the Church, were fond of quoting and referring to what the Lord said on this occasion. As stated, Jesus provides us with the secret of living a good life. If we rely on Him and follow Him, we will be blessed. © Catholic Stewardship Consultants, 2025

Feast of the Presentation of the Lord

Forty days after Christmas, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, traditionally known as Candlemas. On this day, Mary and Joseph bring the infant Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem, faithfully fulfilling the Law—and in doing so, unknowingly place the Light of the world into the heart of the Temple.

In the Gospel account, Simeon takes the Child into his arms and proclaims Jesus to be “a light for revelation to the Gentiles and glory for your people Israel.” This moment reveals who Christ truly is: Light entering the world, offered to God, and given for all.

Because of this proclamation, the Church blesses candles on this feast. Candles are a visible reminder of Christ’s presence—quiet, steady, and enduring. They symbolize the Light that shines in darkness and is not overcome.

All are invited to bring household candles to be blessed. These may be used throughout the year during personal prayer, at times of illness or difficulty, during storms, or when a visible reminder of Christ’s nearness is needed.

Blessed candles become sacramentals—simple objects set aside to draw our hearts toward God and remind us that faith is lived not only in church, but in the ordinary moments of home and family life.

As we place candles before the altar to be blessed, we are invited to ask: Where does Christ want to bring His light into my life this year—and how am I called to carry that light to others?

BLESSING OF THROATS

7 am & 9 am Mass

On the Feast of St. Blaise, all are invited to come and receive a special blessing for protection from afflictions of the throat and other illnesses.

It is customary to bless the throats with two candles tied together with a red ribbon to form a cross. The priest or deacon will place the candles around the throat of whoever seeks the blessing, saying:

"Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you free from every disease of the throat, and from every other disease. In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."

Feast of St. Blaise Blessing of Throats

The Church's calendar beautifully weaves faith into everyday life, and the Feast of St. Blaise is a beloved example of this lived tradition.

St. Blaise, a bishop and martyr of the early Church, is remembered for his intercession for those suffering from illnesses of the throat. On his feast day, the Church invites the faithful to receive a special blessing for protection and healing, especially from ailments of the throat and other illnesses.

At our 7 and 9 am daily Masses on Tuesday, February 3, the Blessing of Throats will be offered. Using two candles tied together in the form of a cross, the priest or deacon will pray this ancient blessing over those who come forward, asking God's protection and grace through the intercession of St. Blaise.

This simple ritual reminds us that God cares for the whole person—body and soul—and that the Church accompanies us not only in moments of worship, but in moments of vulnerability, illness, and need.

Many people battle illness, seen and unseen, physical and emotional, so this blessing becomes an act of trust: placing our health, our voices, and our daily lives into God's hands.

Come and receive this blessing. Let the rhythms of the Church year shape your prayer, your home, and your heart.



Virtue for the Week: Hope

As we continue our journey through Ordinary Time, the Church places before us the Beatitudes—words of promise spoken to those whose lives do not always feel strong, successful, or complete. These are not commands or ideals to be achieved by effort alone. They are assurances of what God is already bringing about.

The virtue that allows us to hear the Beatitudes with trust is hope.

Hope is not optimism or positive thinking. It is not pretending that suffering, weakness, or uncertainty do not exist. Christian hope is the quiet confidence that God is faithful to His promises, even when the way forward is not yet clear.

In our church, the pillar marked Hope is located near the back, in a place with little light and little attention. This is fitting. Hope is often lived not in moments of clarity, but in waiting. It remains steady even when answers are delayed or circumstances remain unresolved.

Above the doors near this pillar is the Scriptural Art depicting Pentecost, with the words: “And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit.” As we leave the church, this image reminds us that hope does not end at the altar. It goes with us. The same Spirit given to the disciples continues to guide, strengthen, and sustain the Church today.

The opposite of hope is not realism, but despair or resignation—the belief that change is impossible or that God is no longer at work. As Fr. John has encouraged us this year, growth in the Christian life often means allowing God to transform these quiet vices into virtues.

Hope grows when we remain faithful in small ways: returning to prayer, staying close to the Sacraments, and trusting God one step at a time. As we walk with Christ through Ordinary Time, may we ask for the grace to live with hope—not because everything is resolved, but because God is present and His promises endure.

Prayer Apostolate of Reparation

In 1843, Jesus revealed to Sister Mary of St. Peter, a Carmelite nun in Tours, France, that reparation was imperative for the sins of atheism, blasphemy, and the profanation of Sundays and Holy Days. The Archconfraternity of the Holy Face was established in 1885 to facilitate this work of reparation looking to St. Veronica as their model.

You are invited to participate in the work of reparation through this devotion, imitating the actions of the holy woman Veronica. In her desire to alleviate, in whatever way she could, the sufferings inflicted on Jesus by His executioners during His Passion, Veronica wiped the filth from His Holy Face. By praying the prayers of reparation and striving to promote the faithful observance of the first three commandments of the Lord, we seek to alleviate the sufferings our Lord endures from atheists, blasphemers, and those who profane His Holy Days.

Speak Lord Your Servant is Listening...

In one of Fr. Roux's homilies, he shared how every day we should pray the words, speak Lord your servant is listening.

He spoke about the importance of silence and how so many of us struggle with silence.

However, it is often in silence that we can hear the Lord speak to our hearts.

For me personally, I know that to be true. That is why the Adoration Chapel, though it may not always be perfectly quiet, fosters that very prayer, speak Lord your servant is listening.

The past few weeks, I offered some suggestions for prayer intentions. Most of us who spend time with the Lord in Adoration have many intentions that we bring before Him. This is a good thing. He wants us to ask, seek and knock. Scripture tells us this. Scripture also tells us to give thanks and praise to the Lord!

Over the years though, many have found that there are those times when they are before the Lord and it is almost like sitting with an old friend. No need to share anything but each other's company. He gazes at you and you gaze at him. How simple and yet so beautiful. Those moments of silence have often revealed to their hearts things that they would not otherwise have received.

Silence can be very difficult for most of us. For me personally, it takes more than a few minutes in Adoration before I can declutter all the things that consume my thoughts.

The most important thing is to try and not to give up. Next time in Adoration, after you have offered prayers of thanksgiving and your intentions say those words that our Lord longs to hear...

Speak Lord your servant is listening. Then wait. It may take several times before you can truly enter into the silence, but it is well worth it. Prayer is a wonderful thing and as Catholics the Saints help reveal to us so many nuggets of wisdom that help us grow closer to the Lord. Silence is one of those things that most, if not all, of the Saints recommend to us.





La lectura del Evangelio de hoy es lo que popularmente se llama el Sermón de la Montaña. Muchos piensan que es el epitome absoluto de las enseñanzas de Jesús. Por supuesto, nos dice cómo debemos vivir nuestras vidas, las actitudes que debemos tener. Debemos recordar que quienes esperaban y deseaban al Mesías

En su Sermón del Monte, Jesús ofrece una perspectiva más precisa de quién es. 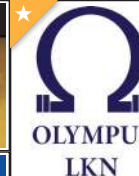

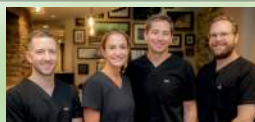
