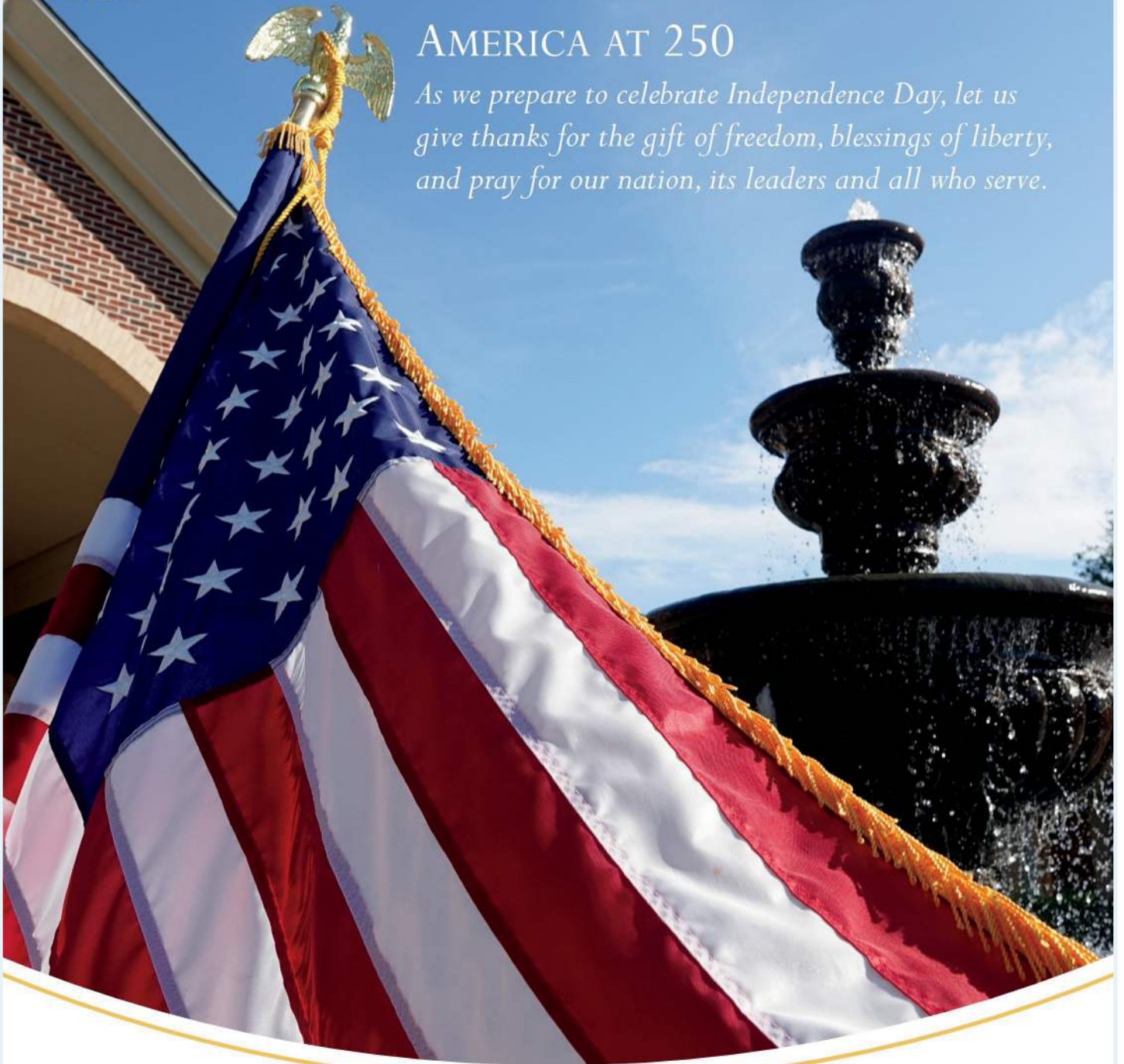

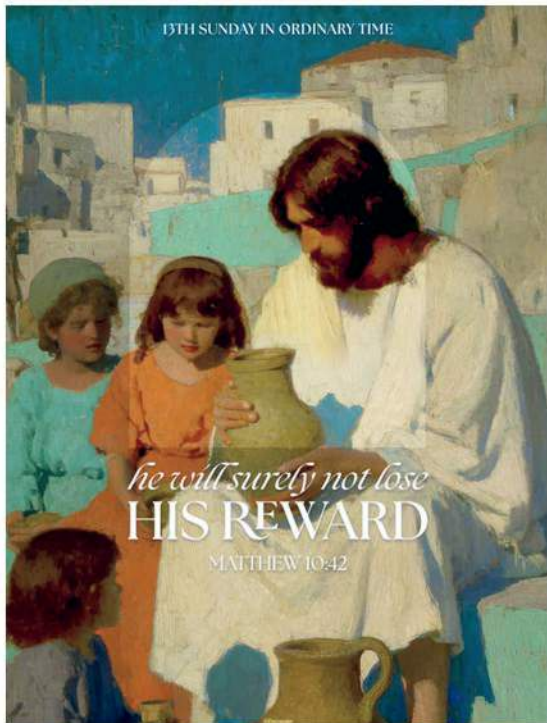

Guidelines for Communion For Catholics

1. To be in a state of grace, that is to say, to be free from any unconfessed mortal sin.
2. To abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from any food and drink, with the exception of water and medicine.
3. To know what you are receiving and to approach the altar with devotion.
4. You may receive Holy Communion standing or kneeling.
5. **Please consume the Eucharist in front of the minister of Holy Communion, before walking away.**

For Non-Catholics: We welcome you to Holy Mass and are glad you are here. Please feel free to participate by singing, standing, kneeling, etc. However, the reception of Holy Communion is reserved for Catholics in a state of grace. At the time of Communion, please feel free to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest for a blessing or to remain in your pew. See page 1302 in the hymnal for information.

FROM THE PASTOR



Today's readings remind us that following Christ requires commitment.

In the Gospel, Jesus calls His disciples to follow Him without hesitation. "No one who sets a hand to

the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God."

The stewardship way of life calls for this same focus. We are invited to give ourselves fully — not halfway, not when it is convenient, but completely.

When we place God first, we discover true freedom. As St. Paul reminds us, "For freedom Christ set us free."

Let us respond to God's call with trust and wholehearted commitment.

Pastoral Pondering

A regular prayer life is the heartbeat of the Catholic faith—it's how we cultivate intimacy with God, receive grace for ministry, and model discipleship for those we serve. The Church teaches that prayer is essential for holiness (CCC 2558–2565), and saints like St. Teresa of Ávila and St. John of the Cross emphasize perseverance in it as the path to union with Christ. Here are some of the most effective, time-tested practices that help build and sustain a consistent habit of prayer.

1. Establish a Fixed Daily Rhythm (The Foundation)

Morning Offering and Evening Examination:

Begin the day with a short Morning Offering (e.g., the traditional one or the one from the Apostleship of Prayer) to consecrate your work, joys, and sufferings. End with an Examen of Conscience (St. Ignatius style: gratitude, review of the day, sorrow for sins, resolution, and a prayer for tomorrow). These bookend the day in 5–10 minutes each and create natural anchors.

Liturgy of the Hours (Divine Office): For priests and religious, this is the official prayer of the Church. It is, however, recommended for everyone. If you want to give it a try, commit to at least Lauds and Vespers daily if full coverage isn't possible yet. Apps like *iBreviary* or *Universalis* make it portable. Many find that praying in the same chair or chapel spot builds the habit powerfully.

Set a "Prayer Appointment": Treat prayer like a non-negotiable meeting—same time, same place (e.g., 15–30 minutes in the morning before the demands of the parish hit). Consistency beats intensity.

2. Core Devotional Practices

Daily Rosary: Our Lady repeatedly asked for this at Fatima and Lourdes. Even a single decade on busy days builds up.

Lectio Divina: Sacred reading of Scripture (Gospel of the day + one other passage). Read → Meditate → Pray → Contemplate. 15–20 minutes daily transforms Scripture from intellectual knowledge into lived encounter.

Eucharistic Adoration: Schedule a weekly Holy Hour (or even 15–30 minutes). Just being in His presence is transformative—bring your intentions, your family, and your own struggles. Many find this the single biggest sustainer of zeal.

3. Integrate Prayer into Daily Life

Short Aspirations and Ejaculatory Prayers:

Throughout the day, use simple phrases like "Jesus, I trust in You," "All for You, Lord," or the Jesus Prayer ("Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner"). These turn ordinary moments (stoplights on I-77, waiting for meetings) into prayer.

Angelus or Regina Caeli: At noon (and 6 a.m./6 p.m. if possible). It's brief, Trinitarian, and keeps the Incarnation before your eyes.

Grace Before Meals and Family/Staff Prayer: Model it publicly and invite others.

4. Accountability and Growth Tools

Spiritual Direction: Is essential for priests and religious but can be a great help to the laity as well.

Prayer Journal: Write intentions, insights from Lectio, or graces received. It helps track God's faithfulness during arid times.

Accountability Partner or Small Group:

Somebody that you can just touch base with. The Cursillo movement has built in helps for this.

Retreats and Pilgrimages: Annual silent retreat + shorter days of recollection. Local options in the Diocese of Charlotte or places like the Abbey of Mary Help of Christians can recharge you.

5. Overcoming Common Obstacles

Dryness/Distraction: Accept it as normal

(the saints endured it). Persevere with vocal prayer or Scripture when mental prayer feels empty. Offer the struggle itself.

Busyness: Start small—add one new practice for 2–3 weeks before layering another. Use driving, walking, or chores as prayer times.

Temptation to Skip: Remember St. Josemaría Escrivá's advice: "The battle is won or lost in the first five minutes of prayer." Just begin.

Recommended Resources

Books: *Introduction to the Devout Life* (St. Francis de Sales)—practical for busy people; *The Three Ages of the Interior Life* (Fr. Reginald Garrigou-Lagrange); *Time for God* (Jacques Philippe).

Apps: Laudate, iBreviary, the TAN Books app, Hallow (great guided content), or the USCCB daily readings app.

Church Teaching: Catechism of the Catholic Church, Part Four on Prayer; documents like *Veritatis Splendor* or papal writings on the spiritual life.

Remember, a faithful prayer life bears fruit in charity, patience, and joy—even when we don't "feel" it. Many great saints credit their perseverance to these simple, steady habits.

Stewardship Spotlight on the Holy Face Devotion

This week, our spotlight is on the *Holy Face Devotion*. This spiritual work of mercy recognizes the physical and spiritual consequences of sin and participates in Christ's redemptive work of bringing healing into the world through prayers of reparation.

The primary purpose of the devotion is to respond to the urgent call Our Lord gave in 1843 to make reparation for sins against the first three commandments: Denial of God (atheism/communism); Blasphemy, and the Profanation of Sundays and Holy Days. Among other saints, St. Therese of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face (The Little Flower) had a particular devotion to the Holy Face. *"This salutary reparation to the Holy Face is a Divine Work to save modern society."* -Pope Blessed Pius IX.

Any time one feels the nudge from the Holy Spirit to become involved is a good time to inquire and participate.

The Holy Face Devotion here at St. Mark is our offering, in response to His requests. Reparation Prayer Warriors at St. Mark usually gather every Tuesday at 5:30 PM to pray the prayers of reparation from the Manuals of Confraternities of the Holy Face. Practicing the Virtues: Prudence

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus "resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem" (Luke 9:51). Along the way, several people express a desire to follow Him, but each hesitates when confronted with the demands of discipleship. Jesus challenges them to place Him above every other priority and to follow Him without looking back.

The virtue we consider this week is prudence.

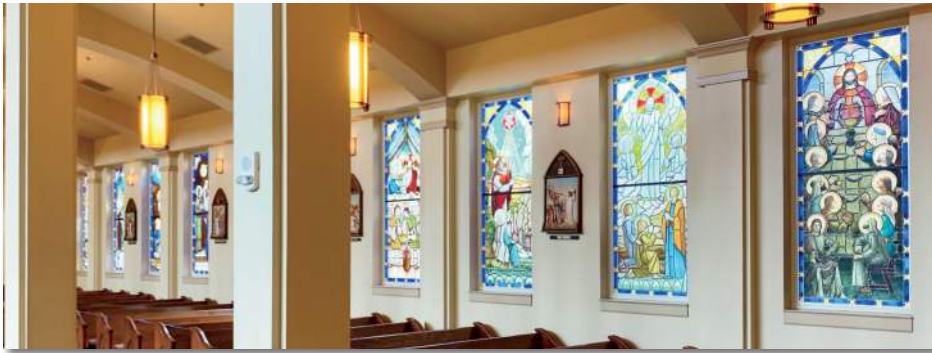
Prudence is the virtue that helps us recognize the good and choose the right course of action. It is not merely caution or careful planning. Rather, prudence enables us to see situations clearly, judge wisely, and act according to God's will. The vice opposed to prudence is imprudence, making decisions without proper discernment or regard for what truly matters.

Jesus demonstrates perfect prudence in today's Gospel. Knowing what awaits Him in Jerusalem, He remains steadfast in carrying out the Father's plan. His decisions are guided not by convenience, comfort, or fear, but by faithful obedience to His mission.

In our church, the word Prudence appears on a pillar near the front left side of the sanctuary beneath Christ's words from the Great Commission: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved." As Jesus sends His disciples into the world to proclaim the Gospel, prudence helps us hear His call, discern His will, and respond with faith. Like those invited to follow Christ in today's Gospel, we are challenged not simply to admire Him from a distance, but to make the wise and lasting choice to follow Him.

As we continue our journey through Ordinary Time, may we ask the Holy Spirit for the gift of prudence, that we may recognize God's will in our daily lives and have the courage to follow where He leads.





Stained Glass Windows

Last week, we learned of the passing of sacred artist **Ronald Neill Dixon** (1941–2026), who designed and created the stained glass windows that surround us in prayer in the nave of the church.

From the installation of the Ascension window in 2018 to the completion of St. Florian in 2023, he created our 22 Mysteries of the Rosary windows and 12 which honor the saints, titled a Glimpse into Heaven.

Sacred art does more than decorate a building. It teaches, inspires, and lifts our hearts toward heaven. Beauty evangelizes in ways words alone cannot.

Every day, people walk into St. Mark carrying burdens, worries, joys, and prayers. Before a word is spoken, these windows begin telling them the story of Christ. Through color, light, and sacred imagery, they quietly draw our hearts toward God.

Long after artists are gone, their work continues to speak. Thousands of parishioners, visitors, brides and grooms, children preparing for First Holy Communion, families celebrating baptisms, and those mourning loved ones at funeral Masses will continue to encounter the beauty Mr. Dixon created. His legacy now lives within these walls and will remain part of St. Mark for generations to come.

Please join us in praying for the repose of Ronald Dixon's soul, for his wife Annie, and for all who work at Dixon Studio as they mourn this loss.

Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him.

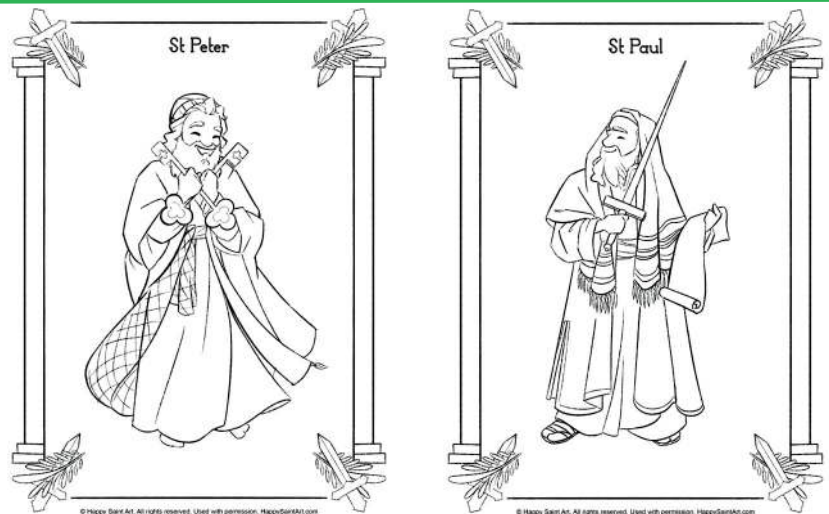

DEL PASTOR



Las lecturas de hoy nos recuerdan que seguir a Cristo requiere compromiso.

En el Evangelio, Jesús llama a sus discípulos a seguirle sin dudar. "Nadie que ponga la mano en el arado y mire lo que quedó atrás es digno del reino de Dios."

La forma de vida responsable exige ese mismo enfoque. Estamos invitados a entregarnos por

completo — no a medias, no cuando sea conveniente, sino por completo.

Cuando ponemos a Dios primero, descubrimos la verdadera libertad. Como nos recuerda San Pablo, "Por la libertad, Cristo nos liberó."

Respondamos al llamado de Dios con confianza y compromiso total. © Consultores de Gestión Católica, 2026.

Reflexión pastoral – Una vida de oración regular es el latido del corazón de la fe católica: es como cultivamos la intimidad con Dios, recibimos gracia para el ministerio y modelamos el discipulado para quienes servimos. La Iglesia enseña que la oración es esencial para la santidad (CIC 2558–2565), y santos como Santa Teresa de Ávila y San Juan de la Cruz enfatizan la perseverancia en ella como camino hacia la unión con Cristo. Aquí tienes algunas de las prácticas más efectivas y probadas que ayudan a construir y mantener un hábito constante de oración.

Establecer un ritmo diario fijo (La Fundación)

Ofrenda matutina y examen vespertino: Comienza el día con una breve ofrenda matutina (por ejemplo, la tradicional o la del Apostolado de la Oración) para consagrar tu trabajo, alegrías y sufrimientos. Termina con un Examen de Conciencia (estilo San Ignacio: gratitud, repaso del día, dolor por los pecados, resolución y una oración por el mañana). Estos abren el día en 5–10 minutos cada uno y crean anclas naturales.

Liturgia de las Horas (Oficio Divino): Para sacerdotes y religiosos, esta es la oración oficial de la Iglesia. Sin embargo, se recomienda a todo el mundo. Si quieres probarlo, comprométete a al menos Laudes y Vísperas diarias si aún no es posible la cobertura completa. Apps como *iBreviary* o *Universalis* lo hacen portátil. Muchos descubren que rezarla en la misma silla o lugar de capilla fortalece el hábito de forma poderosa.

Fija una "cita de oración": Trata la oración como una reunión innegociable: misma hora, mismo lugar (por ejemplo, entre 15 y 30 minutos por la mañana antes de que lleguen las demandas de la parroquia). La constancia supera a la intensidad.

Prácticas devocionales fundamentales

Rosario diario: Nuestra Señora lo pidió repetidamente en Fátima y Lourdes. Incluso una sola década en días ajetreados se acumula.

Lectio Divina: Lectura sagrada de las Escrituras (Evangelio del día + otro pasaje). Lee → medita → reza → contempla. 15–20 minutos diarios transforman la Escritura de conocimiento intelectual en encuentro vivido.

Adoración Eucarística: Programa una Hora Santa semanal (o incluso de 15 a 30 minutos). El simple hecho de estar en Su

presencia es transformador: trae tus intenciones, tu familia y tus propias luchas. Muchos consideran que esto es el mayor motivo de entusiasmo.

Integrar la oración en la vida diaria

Aspiraciones breves y oraciones evacuatorias: A lo largo del día, usa frases sencillas como "Jesús, confío en Ti", "Todo por ti, Señor" o la oración de Jesús ("Señor Jesucristo, Hijo de Dios, ten piedad de mí, pecador"). Estos convierten momentos ordinarios (semáforos en la I-77, espera de reuniones) en oración.

Angelus o Regina Coeli: Al mediodía (y a las 6 a.m./6 p.m. si es posible). Es breve, trinitaria, y mantiene a la Encarnación ante tus ojos.

Gracia antes de las comidas y oración familiar/personal:

Modela la situación pública e invita a otros.

Herramientas de responsabilidad y crecimiento

Dirección espiritual: Es esencial para sacerdotes y religiosos, pero también puede ser de gran ayuda para los laicos.

Diario de oración: Escribe intenciones, ideas de la Lectio o gracias recibidas. Ayuda a rastrear la fidelidad de Dios durante tiempos áridos.

Socio de responsabilidad o pequeño grupo: Alguien con quien puedas contactar directamente. El movimiento Cursillo ha ayudado para esto.

Retiros y peregrinaciones: Retiro anual en silencio + días cortos de recuerdo. Las opciones locales en la Diócesis de Charlotte o en lugares como la Abadía de María Auxiliadora pueden recargarte.

Superando obstáculos comunes

Sequedad/distracción: Acéptalo como algo normal (los santos lo soportaron). Persevera con la oración vocal o con las Escrituras cuando la oración mental se sienta vacía. Ofrece la lucha en sí.

Actividad ajetreada: Empieza poco a poco: añade una nueva práctica durante 2–3 semanas antes de añadir otra más. Utiliza conducir, caminar o hacer tareas como momentos de oración.

Tentación de saltarse: Recuerda el consejo de San Josemaría Escrivá: "La batalla se gana o se pierde en los primeros cinco minutos de oración." Simplemente empieza.

Recursos recomendados

Libros: *Introducción a la vida devota* (St. Francis de Sales)—práctico para personas ocupadas; *Las tres edades de la vida interior* (fr. Reginald Garrigou-Lagrange); *Tiempo para Dios* (Jacques Philippe).

Apps: Laudate, iBreviary, la app Tan Books, Hallow (excelente contenido guiado) o la app de lecturas diarias de USCCB.

Enseñanza de la Iglesia: Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, Parte Cuatro sobre la Oración; documentos como *Veritatis Splendor* o escritos papales sobre la vida espiritual.

Recuerda, una vida de oración fiel da fruto en caridad, paciencia y alegría, incluso cuando no lo "sentimos". Muchos grandes santos atribuyen su perseverancia a estos hábitos simples y constantes.

Quinceañeras: Estar inscritos en la parroquia mínimo 3 años como familia. La quinceañera debe estar confirmada para la fecha de la celebración. Podrán encontrar todos los requisitos en nuestra página de internet. Favor comunicarse con Emilio Gómez al menos 9 meses antes de la fecha del cumpleaños para coordinar con un Sacerdote sus reuniones.

Presentaciones: Se hacen el cuarto domingo de cada mes. Por favor comunicarse con Emilio Gómez al menos dos semanas antes de la presentación para dar el nombre del bebé, si es una presentación de 40 días.
