- Holy week schedule is set: Tuesday Chrism Mass (Cathedral), Thursday washing of feet optional, will not be done as we follow Bishop/Cathedral; Confession Th, F, Sa 11-2p, Friday Passion 3p, 7p Spanish; Saturday business decorating, practice for catechumins, Vigil 8:30p
- Four priests, rotation sometimes certain priests may not be at the mass; accommodate when need to move priests around so sometimes it doesn't work out for 7a mass.
- St. Mark sponsors vineyard of hope, silver and blue, st. mark school auction, Eucharistic Congress council members can go since we get tickets
- DSA \$143,994, 82K not posted, \$142,375 outstanding
- Manny Moore starts June 1st, Director of Music
- Organ needs more work but we are past being able to fix it; need to come up with a plan, intermediate. Asked Manny.
