


# Summer Packet

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Attached please find a list of suggested books for your child's summer reading fun and the reading project that goes along with these books! Your child may select **one** of the suggested books they read this summer to do the project on. Although it is recomended that your child read three books over the summer momths, one of these books and project are required for your child to do. They will count as your child's first reading test grade and are due on the first day of school.

- Whenever possible, children should read at least 15 minutes per day.
- Read aloud to your child, even if they want to read independently.
- Read outside
- Set aside a potion of the day as DEAR time- Drop Everything and Read
- Encourage your child to read magazines, newspapers, even the back of the cereal box.
- Ask your child questions about the book; who, what, where, why, when, and how.
- Review comprehension, vocabulary, and listening skills when reading aloud.

Many of the books on the list are available at the Public Library. Remember to checkout local bookstores for new releases for your child to read.










## Make a Pizza Pie Book Report

-Describe in detail the main setting of the story.

#### Slice 3 - Problem

-Describe in detail the main problem in the story.

#### Slice 4 - Solution

-Describe in detail how the problem was solved.

#### Slice 5 - Summary

-Describe what the story was about. Use lots of details.

#### Slice 6 - Title & Author

-Write and be sure to capitalize the title of the book and the author's name

- -You used full sentences, with correct spelling.
- -You used your neatest handwriting & coloring.
