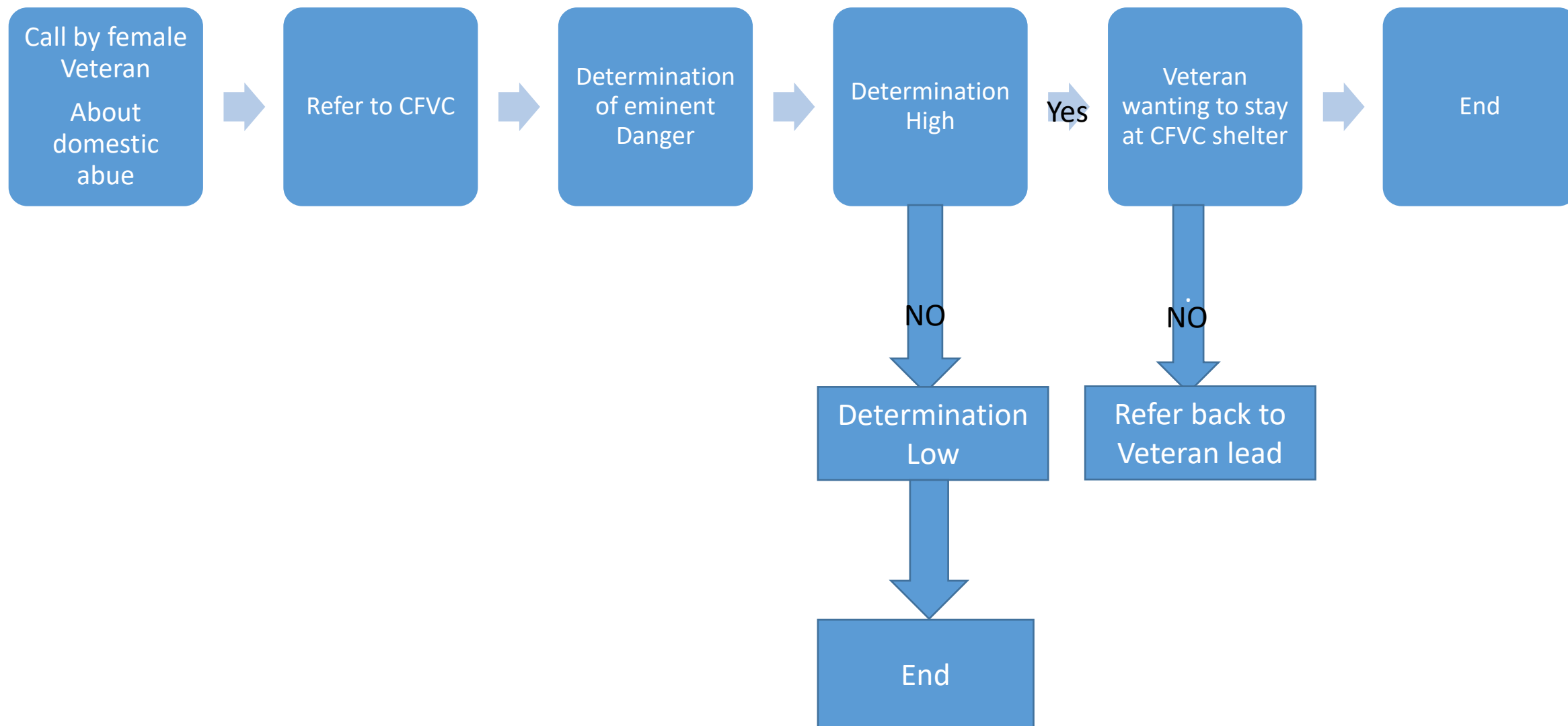
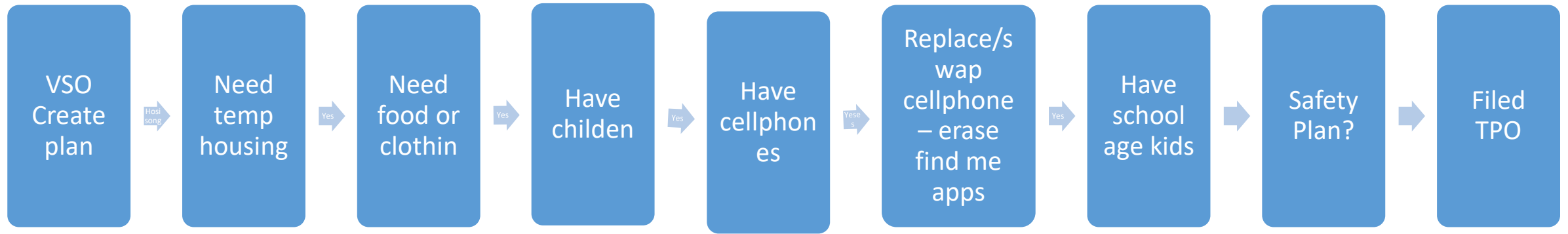






Imminent danger is a **condition or practice that poses a threat of death or serious physical harm**¹²³⁴ to an individual or a group of individuals. Imminent danger **requires immediate intervention**²⁴ to prevent or eliminate the danger, and cannot be resolved through normal procedures¹²³. Imminent danger is often defined by laws or regulations that aim to protect workers, consumers, or the public from harm³⁴.

In the context of domestic violence, **imminent danger** refers to a situation where an individual faces an immediate and serious threat to their safety or well-being. It signifies that harm or violence is **immediately impending** and requires urgent intervention. When someone is in imminent danger due to domestic violence, they may be at risk of physical harm, sexual assault, or psychological abuse. If you are a victim of any act of domestic violence or have **reasonable cause to believe** that you are in imminent danger, you can seek a protective order from the court to prohibit domestic violence¹. It's crucial to take such threats seriously and seek help promptly to ensure safety and prevent further harm. Remember that domestic violence can have severe consequences, impacting both physical and mental health, and it's essential to address it effectively².
