SECRETARY'S REPORT

Mr. President, Fellow Bowlers,

It is my pleasure to submit this report on our activities for the season of 1983. In an exceptional wet month in May, the weather changed in June for the rest of the season to put sun on our backs for a beautiful summer to enjoy ourselves on the greens.

Regretably, after a fine opening in the first two Middleton Cup games, we once again failed to play to our potential and succumbed rather meekly when it mattered most. We play the same teams again in 1984 and with a better fighting spirit let us emulate the team who last won the Cup in 1980. In the Middleton Cup we played 4, won 2, tied 1 and lost 1, shots for 459, shots against 438.

In the Midland Counties Championship we finished 4th out of 7 teams, playing 6 games, we won 2 and lost 4, shots for 687, shots against 716. For these games we blooded players with, as we thought, potential for future Middleton Cup teams, but as you will see from the results aforementioned there is a vast difference from Club and Friendly games to Championship winning teams. It therefore looks on paper that at the present time, as far as Northamptonshire is concerned, there is no substitute for experience.

We played 20 Friendly games, winning 9, tying 1 and losing 10, shots for 2260, shots against 2430. These games, I am sorry to report, were not at all very well supported, often players chosen dropped out, others failed on occasions to turn up, a most unsatisfactory state of affairs. I would ask you all gentlemen, please report back to your Clubs, that once you have your County badge do not sever connections, please put your name forward by filling in the match availability form in the Year Book, as all assistance will be greatly appreciated, as we do need to field a strong side in all County fixtures.

Eight Executive matches were played, these games were very much enjoyed and all clubs concerned are to be congratulated for entertaining us so excellently. The handbook next season will contain a match pro-forma for these games, and I ask all executives who wish to be considered for matches, please fill in the form provided to let me know when you are available.

Four players were nominated for the International trial at Nottingham, and E. P. Tredwell was selected to play, unfortunately he did not catch the Selector's eye. But once again Bob Stenhouse was chosen as England Team Manager and after 19 years they won the International Championship. Congratulations also to Bob Stapleton on his appointment as an England Selector and on

the General Purposes Committee, all this as well as Secretary of the Midland Counties.

Once again we did not win a National title at Worthing, and for the 2nd year in succession the Kingsthorpe triple progressed the farthest, this time though only reaching the 3rd Round. Well done Andrew Manton of West End, who reached the area finals of the National Under 25 Singles.

The Manfield Cup this year produced a nail biting finish, the winners being Stewart and Lloyds of Corby who beat the runners-up Abington on the extra ends. Our thanks are due to Arthur Capon and members of the Competitions and Draws Committee for the organisation and results produced in record time.

County Coach, Vic Cooper, had a very busy year, especially with 'Bowls 83' which is run in conjunction with the Sports Council, to teach new bowlers of both sexes to play bowls. He attended all the National Coaching courses, also arranging the Northamptonshire Area under 25 coaching day, to select four players to attend the Midlands Area National Coaching Weekend held at Nottingham for the best young players in the Midland Counties. We thank you Vic for giving your services so freely to our Association.

To our Minute Secretary, George Shears, who is finally retiring from office, on behalf of the County, thank you very much.

The Selection Committee met on sixteen occasions and attended all Middleton Cup and Midland Counties Championship matches, and are deserving the thanks from all members of the Association for their time and interest in our game of bowls so freely given.

During the year we welcomed two new Clubs, Monks Park WMC and Carlsberg, and although in 1984 we say goodbye to Wittering who will be joining the Huntingdonshire Association, a further two Clubs will be joining us. They are Wellingborough Old Grammarians and Northampton Amateurs, and we wish them a long and happy association with us.

Once again we are indebted to all clubs who make their greens and facilities available to the N.B.A., as the success of our County depends on the goodwill from Officers and Members of Clubs who stage our home matches, thank you very much gentlemen. I would also like to thank Kettering Conservatives, Abington and Wellingborough Town Bowls Clubs, who provide facilities for Council Meetings, Selection Committee Meetings, and for the use of their committee rooms, also the many clubs who provided facilities etc. for the final stages of County Championships.

Our Annual Dinner proved a great success with an attendance

of over 160 at the Fir Tree Restaurant, Wellingborough. The President was accompanied by Mrs. E. Walters, Junior Vice President of the English Women's Bowling Association and Secretary of the County Ladies, chief guests being the EBA Senior Vice President R. F. Taylor and wife, The Mayor and Mayoress of Kettering Councillor and Mrs. D. F. Coe, Midland Counties President, P. Donohoe and wife, Northamptonshire Ladies President Mrs. B. Willett and husband, and H. W. Smith Chairman of Northamptonshire Honorary Vice Presidents Association, together with guests from nine other Counties. The evening started with a very nice meal, followed by not too long speeches and prize presentations, finally the evenings dancing performed under the band of Ron Snary from the Kislingbury Club.

I hope that our President, Frank Summerly, has enjoyed his year of office and is not too disappointed that we did not win any major honours, but like all other 34 County Presidents, Frank, over 90% of you must all feel the same at the end of his term of office. I am sure you have enjoyed yourself, as you have given time and energy unstintingly to the furtherance and cause of improving bowls in Northamptonshire. You have remained cheerful, tactful and courteous throughout and have supported me and all other Officers of the Association to the best of your ability, for which I personally thank you, and I hope when you look back in future years you have many happy memories of your term in office.

To all who contribute to the successful running of this Association, too numerous to be named individually, your contributions are acknowledged and very much appreciated. My Assistant Secretary and three Area Secretaries have again done sterling work in the successful running of our County's affairs, and our Treasurer, Colin Baddiley, in his first year of office has kept our finances in a healthy state. To Arthur Capon, the Competitions Secretary, after many difficulties because of the same players being involved in the final stages of competitions, well done, because I know you had to chase around the County to bring about the final conclusions. Finally I must thank Peter Heath for supplying the County with two sets of scorecard holders and scorecards, your sponsorship is very much appreciated.

Thank you all gentlemen, winter well, and lets hope for better results in 1984.

COUNTY COACH REPORT

Mr. President and Gentlemen,

1983 has seen further developments in the Coaching Scheme, in the past years the National Coaching Team has worked to ensure that sufficient numbers of trained Instructors and Coaches were available to staff the scheme, this year the emphasis has been on improving the standards and techniques of coaching.

To this end, two weekend courses have been held, at Bournemouth in May, and at Rugby in July, six of our certificated coaches besides myself attended one or other of the courses. The National Coaching Team have now decided that attendance at a similar course is required as part of the preparation for Advanced Coach certification.

During the past year we have regraded five Instructors to Coach and certificated three more Instructors. In the County we have 43 Club Coaches, 14 are certificated Coaches, 21 are certificated Instructors, distributed over 32 clubs, which means 28 clubs are without a club coach, this is far short of the scheme's objective of at least one certificated Instructor or Coach in every club.

In September the National Coaching Team ran a Weekend coaching course for under 25's at Nottingham Indoor Bowling Green, to which we were invited to send four representatives.

In order to select our four representatives I wrote to every club affiliated to our Association asking for details of under 25's and whether they would attend a day course to be considered for selection. From the 61 letters, I received replies from 10 clubs and 10 candidates, this response was most disappointing, these bowlers are the future of the County and should be encouraged.

I express my gratitude to the President and Committee of Kislingbury Bowling Club for the use of their green and club facilities and for the support they gave me in running the selection and qualification courses which ensured the day was a success.

I was privileged to assist the National Coaching Team at Nottingham with the under 25's course and can report that our four representatives were both, in behaviour and performance, a credit to themselves and to the County.

We again supported the Sports Council's Bowls '83, this year we received a record number of applications, 150 in all, which at nine venues stretched our willing coaches to the limit.

As we took over the administration of the scheme this year, we were able to retain the revenue in the County, so this year as well as introducing bowlers into the game, the County benefited financially.

In conclusion, I thank all coaches and bowlers who have assisted and supported me during the past season, for without this support we would not have a coaching scheme in the County.
