

#### SECRETARY'S ANNUAL REPORT, 1974

Mr. President and Gentlemen,

It is my pleasure to submit this brief report of the events of 1974.

#### Our President

Sadly, ill-health has denied to Arthur Strickland much of the pleasure of his year as the President of our Association. Arthur suffered illness shortly after taking office and was then unable to take any part in our activities until early September when he was able to join his colleagues at Thrapston for the Under 40's match, and to see some enterprising and enjoyable bowling in a gale-force wind.

We congratulate our President on his recovery and give him our best wishes for continued and speedy progress to full health and strength.

#### Affiliated Clubs

We began 1974 with 76 affiliated clubs and for a few weeks following the September Council Meeting, the number stood at 78: we are pleased to welcome Wittering B.C. and Kislingbury B.C. into our Association and wish them a long and happy future with us.

As I write this, I have learned that the Kettering G.U.S. Club will leave the N.B.A. this year: however, many of the members will be bowling with other clubs in the Kettering area in future years.

#### County Matches

In the Middleton Cup, we lost what proved to be the vital game against Herts.—and Herts. went forward to the Quarter Finals.

The Midland Counties Championship produced a lot of very keen bowling. In two matches the result remained in doubt until the final wood was bowled. Against Worcestershire, 2 shots on the final end tied the game for us. Against Warwickshire, 2 shots on the final end gave us a victory by that margin.

Our friendly matches continue to provide good bowling and new friends wherever our fixtures take us: the popularity of the matches is proved by the support they receive. For one match in 1974, the Selection Committee had the task of nominating a team from a list containing 148 names.

County Competitions

Success eluded Northamptonshire bowlers in the National Championships, but within the County, the Competitions provided much very competitive bowling, and the 1974 Competition winners include a blend of established names and new faces. In 1974, eight players qualified for the County Badge by reaching the final of one of the Competitions.

#### The President's Tour

Very early in the year, the Emergency Committee had to decide whether to proceed with the 1974 Tour as it became known that our President would be prevented by illness from taking part.

With the support of three Past Presidents, and the Chairman of the Vice-Presidents' Association, a plan was prepared so that these gentlemen, together with the Senior and Junior Vice-Presidents, would each preside on one day of the Tour.

The touring party enjoyed a week of splendid weather in Devon and won four of their six matches, and came home decorated with a "limited-edition" tie apiece. The President received a present from the Touring Party as a memento of the Tour he was unable to share.

#### Annual Dinner and Dance

The Annual Dinner and Dance was held at Wicksteed Park on October 23rd, with D'Arcy Drayton, Senior Vice-President of the E.B.A., and Midland Counties President Jack Jarvis as our principal guests.

The evening was very successful within the limits of the support received: including our guests, only 172 were present and of 76 affiliated clubs, only 15 were represented at the Dinner. Dinner.

May I take this opportunity to thank my friend, Past resident and Too of the very President and Toastmaster George Robinson, for the considerable help he gives me on these occasions.

### International Trial Match

As usual, our full quota of nominations for the International Trial was submitted: if your Selectors were surprised by one omission from the Trial Teams, they were pleased that George Wills was a control of the Trial Teams, they were when that George Wills was again recognised, and delighted when

after three Trials, he was selected for the England team. Congratulations to George, and best wishes for future years.

#### The Selection Committee

The Selection Committee met on 20 occasions. This year we are indebted to Wellingborough Town, West End, Kettering Conservative and Pianoforte Supplies Clubs, who provided facilities for Selection Committee Meetings. In addition to these meetings, the Selectors are present in force at all Middleton Cup and Midland Counties Matches, and also at the Middleton Cup Trial and the "Under 40's" match.

Much time is devoted to trying to achieve the happy balance which will provide a strong and representative team for friendly matches, while providing an opportunity for Club bowlers to qualify for their County Badge. In 1974, 40 bowlers received their County Badge after playing six times for their County: 40 bowlers were presented with the Colts Badge.

#### County Year Book

The Association owes much to Arthur Frost for his valiant efforts in editing and arranging for the printing of the 1974 Year Book. Arthur took over this onerous task at very short notice and had to overcome a long series of obstacles before a 1974 edition was assured. The N.B.A. Year Book sets a very high standard—for which the credit must go to the Honorary Editor.

#### Other Items

Many things contribute to the successful running of our Association. A major factor is the co-operation received from the member Clubs. The N.B.A. is indebted to all those Clubs whose facilities are so freely made available to us for matches and meetings and to their members and ladies who do the backstage work to prepare for the game, and provide the teas.

May I also thank publicly, the Officers and friends who have helped and supported me through the year: Senior Vice-President Bob Stapleton, Junior Vice-President Clarrie Austin, who have had so much extra to do this summer: Honorary Treasurer Joe Cooper, who continues his sterling service to the N.B.A.: Competition Secretary Jack Hodson: the Area Secretaries: the Past Presidents who deputised on those occasions when neither our President nor his deputies was available. And a special word of thanks to my Honorary Assistant George Wills who does much of the secretarial work of the Selection Committee and is a tremendous help at all times. To these and to all my colleagues whose help and co-operation has ensured another happy year—thank you.
