

Your selection committee met on numerous occasions but unfortunately were not able to get the right combination this year, winning two and losing two in the Middleton Cup, wooden spoonists in the Midland Counties Championship, losing five and only winning one.

In this the 75th year of the Association, the executive entertained the English Bowling Association and the Midland Counties Bowling Association. 50 players received Colts badges and 33 players were

awarded their blazer badge.

In the national sphere, Northants were represented in the international trial by Maurice Allen and Stuart Letts, neither player making the England team and none of our players excelled at Worthing. In number of clubs the county remains constant, this year we welcomed Daventry & District Bowling Club but unfortunately Kettering Park B.C. are resigning,

leaving us with a total of 61 clubs.

We are again indebted to Abington, Kettering Conservative and Wellingborough Bowling Clubs for providing accommodation for Council, Annual General and Selection Meetings. We are further indebted to the clubs who have made their greens and facilities available to the N.B.A. for County matches, Competitions and the Manfield Cup. May I take this opportunity of thanking all of them for their help and co-operation. The Annual Dinner was held at the Wicksteed Park Pavilion, a very good night was enjoyed by the few who attended. We were honoured with the presence of the E.B.A. President Tom Blake, and the M.C.B.A. President Martin Bates.

Our President Jim Foran is now nearing the end of a very difficult year, difficult because he was the unfortunate President to follow the successes of last year, he had the job of returning all last year's spoils. Nevertheless Jim has has a very good year, he has carried out his duties as your President with dignity and will look back on his year with satisfaction.

The N.B.A. continues to be thoroughly well served by its Officers. S.V.P. Jack Forster, J.V.P. Frank Summerly have both given full support to our President. John Clipston and the area secretaries, our handbook editors, your Treasurer Joe Cooper, and all the other officers including my Assistant Secretary Neville Whitsey all do a tremendous job for the Association and I thank them all sincerely for the way they carry out their duties.

COUNTY COACH REPORT

Mr. President and Gentlemen.

In 1981 we have maintained steady progress in the instructions of beginners. Our club coaches, many now in their second season, are, with the introduction of the coaching manuals and backing from their club committees, finding their feet and introducing able, keen, knowledgeable beginners into the game. We may appear to many to be still on the bottom rung of the coaching ladder, this is so, we must walk before we run.

This year a further nine club coaches qualified at Kingsthorpe as National bowls instructors. In total with the three club coaches who qualified preseason at Peterborough we now have 28 qualified instructors from 25 clubs in the county. I would like to express my gratitude to the President and committee of Kingsthorpe Bowling Club who for the past two seasons have permitted the use of their clubhouse and green for the

qualification courses.

We again assisted with the Sports Council Bowls 81 promotion, some 20 instructors working for four weeks at nine venues. One interesting feature this year was the number of Park bowlers who instructed in the game, in order to learn and improve. The County has received a bonus from last year's promotion by the formation of Daventry and District Bowling Club. This club was formed by people attending the course, instructed by E. Baker and W. Boys. who felt that this was the way to continue their involvement and enjoyment of the game.

In order to advance our coaching scheme I am inviting some of our qualified instructors to become area coaches. These coaches will work in their own areas assisting the County Coach in the training of new instructors, and assisting clubs without coaches in the instruction of

beginners.

Finally, to all those club committees who failed to find someone to become club coach, keep looking, somewhere in your club there must be a member willing to put back into the game a few hours to help beginners, in return for the many hours of enjoyment that they themselves have experienced.
