

SECRETARY'S REPORT — 1975

Mr. President and Gentlemen,

It is my pleasure to submit this report on the affairs of our Association during 1975.

We can look back on a summer which has provided us with plenty of ideal bowling weather and during which we have been able to complete a very full match programme with only one game being seriously interrupted by the elements.

Measured by the number of affiliated Clubs, the strength of the N.B.A. remained unchanged throughout the summer: having recently welcomed the McAlpine's Sports Association B.C. in March, we have recently lost the Kettering G.P.O. B.C. by resignation and at this point the number of member Clubs stood at 77. However, this position is now likely to be very seriously affected by a recent decision of the E.B.A. General Purposes Committee to which I will refer later.

Our President

Bob Stapleton has followed an onerous year in the office of Senior Vice-President with a very busy year as our President. He has been a fine ambassador for his County and for the game of bowls wherever his duties have taken him. The office of President involves much hard work and takes up a great deal of time. Over the past two years our President has given unstintingly of his time and energies for our Association, and when he steps down to join the distinguished list of Past Presidents of the N.B.A. he will be able to look back on his year as President in the knowledge that the high standards of his predecessors have been maintained.

Unfortunately the fine weather of the summer arrived too late to cover the Presidential Tour to Northumberland and it is reported that the busiest member of the Touring Party was its Honorary Physician. Even the worst of the weather cannot permanently depress the spirits of a touring party and the week up North was enjoyed by most of the party for most of the time.

The Match Programme

It has been a season of high promise, but of mixed fortunes: in the Middleton Cup we qualified for the Quarter-Final, but not quite with the style that the first two matches promised. The Quarter-Final against Yorkshire was a very close game throughout, but a 13-shot deficit denied us a visit to Worthing (and a trip to South Africa?).

The Midland Counties Championship again provided much keen and competitive bowling, and, in the event, was decided by our match with Warwickshire at Stratford-on-Avon, which Warwickshire won by a single shot. Warwickshire finished as Midland Counties Champions, with Northants. as runners-up. By the time we re-played our washed-out match with Leicestershire, the Championship was beyond our reach

Competitions

Elsewhere, Jack Hodson presents his final report as the N.B.A. Competition Secretary: our good friend Jack has de cided to pass on the duties of Competition Secretary to his heir-apparent, John Clipston. I am sure everyone will join me in expressing gratitude to Jack Hodson for his long and distinguished service to the N.B.A. and to wish him health and happiness in his "retirement".

Success again eluded our Bowlers at Worthing, but congratulations to the Kettering Conservatives who kept our hopes alive for a long time in the Triples, and almost "made

it".

The International Trial

Our quota of nominations for the International Trial was submitted, supplemented, in accordance with the revised provisions, with the names of past and present Internationals—but the N.B.A. was not represented in the Trial teams

The Selection Committee

In an effort to reduce the calls on the time of the members of the Selection Committee, the rules covering nominations for friendly matches were revised at the last Annual General Meeting. The resulting gain was very much a swings-androundabouts affair. Although the Selection Committee met on only 14 occasions during 1975 (as against 20 in 1974) the meetings tended to last much longer and those in August and September must have set up an endurance record.

I do not know if it is generally appreciated that members of the Selection Committee give up ten of the first dozen Saturdays of the Season to watch the County Trial, and subsequently the Midland Counties and Middleton Cup matches, but all are inspired by a common objective

desire for success for the N.B.A.

The Selection Committee tries very hard to achieve a fair representation of all affiliated Clubs in the friendly matches but allowing for the but allowing for the wide variation in the size of Clubs and the necessity to Call all allinated Clubs in the size of Clubs and the necessity to field a balanced team, and for the fact that there are only only there are only 24 places to fill—and 77 Clubs to fill them it is a daunting the file and 10 Clubs to fill them it is a daunting task.

The Selection Committee is not slow to give new names a chance: 1975 has been a record year for the award of Colts Badges—62 in all. The County Blazer Badge was presented to 39 players, three of whom qualified by reaching the final of an N.B.A. competition.

The Year Book

High praise is due to our Handbook Editor, Arthur Frost, for providing us with a Yearbook of such high quality but yet keeping within the budget which he had previously set: it is a remarkable achievement to have kept the price within our financial limits. Two years ago printing costs were rising so rapidly that the future of the Yearbook was seriously threatened.

Peterborough Area

The E.B.A. General Purposes Committee has recently announced a ruling which cannot but have a serious effect on the N.B.A.'s present administrative and Competitions structure. It has decided that Clubs within the Soke of Peterborough may, if they so wish, and after resigning from their present County Association, seek affiliation to another County. The effect of this decision is that those Clubs who so wish, may now leave Northants. and join Huntingdonshire. At the time of writing this Report, six Clubs have given notice of their intention to withdraw from the N.B.A. While one cannot deny the right of any Club to exercise the option thus granted, it is difficult to understand the reasons for the E.B.A. decision, since the whole question of revised County Boundaries is at present a matter for consideration by a Working Party.

The N.B.A. will be sorry to lose the six Clubs from its Peterborough Area, but everything possible will be done to ensure that those Peterborough Clubs which remain with us are enabled to share fully in the activities of this Association, and do not suffer from any side-effects of a problem for which they are in no way responsible.

Annual Dinner and Dance

The Annual Dinner and Dance will not have been held before my report goes to the Printers: for 1975, and because of the clash with many Club Dinners in late October, the I.B.A. Dinner has been put back to a day in late November. By the date of the Annual General Meeting, it will be possible to see if this arrangement has proved successful and make a decision as to the date and venue for the 1976 Dinner accordingly.

Other Matters

The N.B.A. is once again indebted to those Clubs whose facilities have been made available to us in 1975 for our home matches, and to the Wellingborough Town, Kettering Conservative and Abington Clubs who have been host for Council Meetings, the Annual General Meeting and many Committee Meetings.
