

My Dear Parishioners:

What a great block party! I am ever so grateful to the many volunteers and our august staff for making everything happen. To call the block party a major success would be a ridiculous understatement. It was great to see individuals of divergent backgrounds getting together and having a genuinely good time. Well done St. Aloysius.

This week's Gospel again makes you and I prioritize what is important from what is simply the fluff of this world. It makes us put ourselves in perspective and educates us on the need to develop personal humility. The sin of pride seems harmless at first but in many ways it is the most insidious of mortal sins. It is the sin that feels comfortable – the sin we truly like. It makes us more and more insular and ever so narcissistic. Pride distances us from God – in a sense we are drawn away to the point where we become our own version of god – utterly devoted to and in love with...wait for it...ourselves.

We have all been in a situation as described in Luke's Gospel – where we assume we are the center of attention and suddenly poof – we are nothing. We take the seat of honor only to be asked to go to the other end of the table...to the lowest spot. In that seemingly endless interregnum between one's arrogant presumption of honor and the moment when one settles into the lowest spot. There is only one word that applies...AWKWARD!

Putting ourselves last, putting those we love and those we lift up first obviates the awkwardness and by necessity – causes us to be raised up. A priest buddy of mine always helps me put the importance of things, of stuff, of titles, of arrogance, of selfishness into perspective when he reminds me: "you know, I've never been to a funeral where the hearse is hitched to a U-Haul." Isn't that the truth! Christ was nailed naked to a cross – they did everything to demean and disgrace Him but all they did was make His dignity and divinity more obvious.

Remember, the last always come first and the first, always finish in the back of the pack...or worse.
