

As most of you know, I live at Old Saint Mary's in Greektown. More often than not, I will be walking up to the front of that beautiful church, heading to the rectory from my office in the Chancery, fairly worn out after a long day's work and I run into one or more of our brothers and sisters' unconscious on the church stairs. I will check to see if they are alright and carry on. I always feel rather empty after such an encounter. I am left to wonder what caused that individual – one of God's creations, to become addicted to alcohol or narcotics? I wonder what became of their parents, their siblings, and where their friends are. Yet, that is city life. In a few seconds you can realize great wealth, beauty, fun, and in the next second, misery and abject poverty. I love city life but sometimes I get sad about it. Looking at this Sunday's Gospel, I find myself asking "where are the Mary and Marthas in the lives of these people, laying on the streets of our city?"

I share my thoughts above as a side manner of throwing an ongoing compliment to our outreach program at St. Al's. I am truly proud of what we do for our community. Our beautiful church is nothing short of a respite and safe harbor amidst what can often be the most perilous of city storms. Alas, there is ever so much more to do and sometimes it sometimes seems like an impossible task, but we must always endeavor to help our sisters and brothers among us. After all, Christ tells us clearly in scripture what the final exam for getting into heaven, and in contrast, being sent to the other place, is: "I was hungry, did you feed me, I was naked ,did you clothe me, I was a foreigner, did you welcome me, I was unjustly in prison, did you visit me; that which you did to the least of my brothers, you did to me." This week...every week, let's keep the final exam question in mind.
