EVERYBODY'S CHURCH IN DOWNTOWN DETROIT

As we celebrate May Crowning, take time this month to have a special encounter with Christ through our Blessed Mother

Since medieval times, the month of May was considered the end of winter and the start of a new season of growth, a chance to begin with gratitude and devotion. And though we revere her throughout the year, May is a special month to honor Mary the Mother of God, the *Queen of Heaven*.

Mary is considered the *Queen of Heaven* for many reasons, the most significant being that she was a perfect follower of Christ, and so is considered the crown of creation. Being our Spiritual Mother, she is the most important woman of our faith. So how do we cultivate a relationship with our mother Mary? Here are some ways to bring Mary into our homes and hearts.

Pray

A good way to ask Mary for her intercession is by simply incorporating the Hail Mary with our daily prayers. And of course, pray the Rosary. When we meditate on the life of Jesus, we also ask Mary to intercede for us. The Rosary is a powerful and beautiful devotion. To start, you can pray one decade of the Rosary each day for five days, so by the end of the week you will have prayed an entire Rosary.

Ponder

One way to grow in a relationship with Mary is by pondering her presence in Scripture. While she does not say much, what she says (and does) is powerful. After reading a Bible verse, consider what it means to you. What can you learn from Mary? How can you emulate her words and actions in your own life? Here are a few Scriptural choices: The Annunciation: Luke 1:26-38, The Visitation: Luke 1:39-56, The Losing & Finding Jesus in the Temple: Luke 2:41-52 or The Wedding at Cana: John 2: 1-12.

Plant

Mary gardens have been part of Catholic culture for a long time. They can be elaborate or simple but should include specific flowers named after Our Lady. Typically, a Mary Garden also includes a statue of her. If you do not have a yard, you create a Mary Garden by planting flowers in large pots. Then, simply tuck a small statue or holy card of Our Blessed Mother among the flowers. Here are some traditional Marian flowers that are easy to find: Daffodil: Mary's Star, Hostas: Assumption Lily, Geraniums: Lady Beautiful, Impatiens: Mother's Love, Marigold: Mary's Gold, Pansies: Our Lady's Delight and Tulips: Mary's Prayer.
