November is Black Catholic History Month

In 1990, the **National Black Catholic Clergy Caucus** designated November as **Black Catholic History Month**, a time to honor the contributions of Black Catholics worldwide to the Church.

Why November?

Nov 1/2 - All Saints and All Souls Days: Honoring saints and ancestors in the African diaspora.

Nov 3 – Feast of St. Martin de Porres: A humble servant of God who loved all people.

Nov 13 – Birthday of St. Augustine of Hippo: A brilliant theologian and Doctor of the Church.

Nov 20 – Death of Zumbi of Palmares: A Brazilian freedom fighter and Catholic leader.

Models of Holiness: Black Catholic Witnesses of Faith, Courage, and Service

Pierre Toussaint (1787–1853): Haitian-born layman, philanthropist, and servant of the poor. Attended daily Mass and is buried at St. Patrick's Cathedral in NYC.

Mother Mary Lange (1789–1882): Founder of the first Black Catholic school and religious order for women of African descent in the U.S., dedicated to educating Black children in Baltimore.

Father Augustus Tolton (1854–1897): The first openly African American priest in the U.S., known for his holiness, preaching, incredible singing voice and inclusive ministry.

Henriette Delille (1813–1862): Founder of the Sisters of the Holy Family, serving the sick, poor, and free and enslaved children. Credited with opening the first Catholic home for the elderly in the U.S.

Julia Greeley (c.1835-1845 –1918): Born into slavery and disabled by abuse, Julia became known as *Denver's Angel of Mercy*, quietly serving the poor with food, clothing and love despite her suffering.

Father Martin De Porres Maria Ward, OFM (1918–1999): A convert and compassionate confessor. He brought many back to the Church through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Sister Dr. Thea Bowman, FSPA (1937–1990): A dynamic educator, speaker, and advocate for Black Catholics. She traveled the country sharing the joy of the Gospel and calling the Church to address racial injustice, embrace diversity and promote unity.

Mother Theresa Maxis Duchemin (1810-1892): At 19, Theresa helped found the Oblates of Providence, the first congregation of women religious of color, later serving as superior general. In 1845, she co-founded the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary in Monroe, Michigan.
