

## **Academic Pace & Sequence**

Classes are offered via Correspondence, Online/Zoom, or In-Person. A semester is equivalent to two 8-week terms.

Offering 8-week terms of 36 - 1.5 credit hours classes + 6 credits of Life Exp. for AA.

Offering 8-week terms of 12 - 3.0 credit hours classes + 30 credits of Life Exp. for BA.

Offering 8-week terms of 12 - 3.0 credit hours classes + 8 credits of Life Exp. for MA.

Offering 8-week terms of 24 - 3.0 credit hours classes for Doc.

#### **Promises**

KAU makes NO promises verbally or written that guarantees success.

#### **Tuition & Registrations**

This Operating Procedure applies to all Kingdom Ascending University (KAU) students. The purpose is to set out the process by which a student may obtain an exception to the Tuition Refund Policy and Registration.

No refund will be authorized except as provided in this Policy or in accordance with the Tuition refunds will be granted in accordance with the Tuition Refund Policy. A student wishing to be granted an exception to the Tuition Refund Policy, due to extenuating circumstances or a material change in circumstances, shall file a Tuition Refund Appeal as set forth below.

Registration is nonrefundable. Circumstances that will not be a sufficient basis for appeal include, but will not be limited to, the following:

- Dropping a course because of a low grade.
- Deciding that course is too difficult or there is not enough time to meet course objectives.
- Financial hardship or lack of financial aid.
- Academic or disciplinary dismissal.
- Known medical condition, injury or illness that has not changed materially since the time of enrollment in the course.

KAU accepts your degree from other institutions of higher learning. A one time transfer fee of \$500 is required for each degree transferred to KAU. Foundational classes and next level classes may be taken concurrently as directed by admission requirements.

The doctoral program requires a capstone course. The Doctor of Religious Education requires a dissertation capstone fee of \$750. The Doctor of Ministry requires a discourse capstone fee of \$200.

All correspondence courses will incur a \$100 fee per 8-week term. Unaccredited coursework will have a conversion fee applied at graduation based on the degree level being converted.



#### I. Tuition Refund Appeals for Credit Courses

Tuition Refund Appeals related to credit courses must be submitted in writing on the Appeal Form to Enrollment Services within 90 days of the student's initial enrollment in the course, unless good cause is shown for the delay. The appeal must specify the reason(s) the student should be given a refund and include sufficient supporting documentation. The written appeal and documentation will be reviewed by a Tuition Refund Appeal Committee selected by the Vice President of Student Success and Engagement to determine if the student has demonstrated sufficient circumstances warranting a refund. The decision of the Committee is final, and the student will be informed in writing of the decision.

#### **II. Refund for Credit Courses**

A student who has completed registration for credit courses and subsequently withdraws from a course will receive a 100% refund of tuition without fees paid if drop is completed within seven (7) calendar days of the official first day of the semester for a full semester course. Refund dates for a course may change upon the length of the class.

In the event a course is canceled, or the dates or times of a course are changed by KAU, a 100% refund of tuition and non-refundable less applicable fees pertaining to that course will be made to the student.

#### **III. Refund for Courses**

If a student who is registered for a course and requests a refund by email, and the request is received in the KAU registration office at least four (4) business days before the course begins, the student will receive a 100% refund less applicable required fees.

In the event a course is canceled, or the dates or times of a course are changed by the University, a 100% refund of tuition less applicable required fees pertaining to that course will be made to the student.

#### **IV. Refund Disbursements**

Students who change or withdraw from class the day before it starts will receive 100% refund less applicable required fees.

Students who change or withdraw from class after the first two weeks will receive a 50% refund less applicable required fees.

Students who change or withdraw from class after the third week will not receive a refund or less applicable required fees.

Students who are directed to report for active military duty during an academic term shall be entitled to an incompletion until reenrollment of the class (verify documentation of deployment). Students who volunteer for military services are subject to the provisions of this Policy.



**Students called to active military duty**. Enrolled students called into active service in the armed forces of the United States prior to the completion of the semester, whether voluntarily or involuntarily, but not including active service training, and unable to complete their course work, shall be eligible for an incompletion until reenrollment of the class (verify documentation of deployment). The options are implemented to assure that students called to active duty prior to the end of a term receive fair and just treatment, both financially and academically. Contact the Office of KAU for information.

**Students called to jury duty.** Students who are called to jury duty shall be eligible for an incompletion until reenrollment of the class (verify documentation) will be credited with an incomplete. The options are implemented to assure that students called to jury duty prior to the end of a term receive fair and just treatment, both financially and academically.

#### V. Refund in the event of a student death.

When a student dies prior to completing the current academic semester, a fulyl refund of or credit for tuition less applicable required fees will be made after the deduction of the following:

- a. Any required adjustments to scholarships or grants.
- b. Any other debts owed to KAU that occurred prior to the death of the student.

Any refund will be made payable to the student's beneficiary. If, after all adjustments are made, there still remains a debt to KAU, generally the KAU would not attempt to recover the debt from the estate of the deceased student.

#### Housing

KAU does not offer housing at this time.

#### **Dress Code Policy**

As a community dedicated to academic excellence and spiritual growth, Kingdom Ascending University expects all students to maintain a standard of dress that reflects respect for themselves, others, and the learning environment.

Our dress code is guided by biblical principles of modesty, professionalism, and order. While individual expression is valued, attire should reflect a commitment to integrity, purpose, and the values of the Kingdom of God.

#### **General Expectations:**

- Clothing must be modest, neat, and non-distracting in a classroom or ministry setting.
- Attire should be clean, appropriate, and free of offensive language, images, or symbols.
- Students should avoid overly revealing or excessively tight clothing.
- Head coverings may be worn for religious or cultural reasons, but should not obscure identity in instructional settings.
- Shoes must be worn at all times while on campus.

KAU reserves the right to address any clothing that is deemed inappropriate or inconsistent with the standards outlined above. Students may be asked to change or adjust attire if necessary.

This policy ensures that we maintain a respectful, focused, and unified academic atmosphere that aligns with our mission and spiritual identity.



#### Code of Conduct:

Every aspect of the believer should reflect awareness that he or she is a representative of the Kingdom of God. Therefore, it is expected that all participants will avoid practices and forms of entertainment that may be detrimental to their Christian witness and/or spiritual growth. Our participants agree to comply with the following "code of conduct", which will be strictly adhered to:

- 1. Recognize and follow the authority of God's Word in all areas related to personal conduct and moral standards.
- 2. Maintain a strong desire to walk in the "fruit of the Holy Spirit" by serving God and their fellow man.
- 3. Attend all classes as scheduled in a timely manner.
- 4. Pay fees and purchase all books and materials within 2 weeks of the start of class.
- 5. Respect the thoughts and opinions of others while exercising discipline and self control at all times.
- 6. Disruption of the class and disrespect of authority (administration and instructors) will not be tolerated.
- 7. Participants' life that is deemed immoral or unseemly by the administration may be considered as grounds for immediate dismissal.
- 8. Professional will conduct business in a way that does not expose students to unnecessary embarrassment or disparagement.
- 9. Participants will not exclude on the grounds of race, color, creed, or national origin from participating in, or deny him (or her) benefits under, any program, nor grant any discriminatory consideration or advantage.
- 10. Professionals will refrain from using relationships with students for personal or private advantage.
- 11. Participants will keep confidential information that has been obtained in the course confidential and not interfere with the constitutional rights of others.
- 12. The school will keep an on-going available list of schools/colleges or employers who have recognized and received credits, degrees or diplomas from the ACI member school.
- 13. The school will keep a telephone with an answering machine that will return all calls within 48 hours.
