At the vestry meeting, we approved a proposal by AceBase Technologies to upgrade the WiFi system. We hope to have the work start within the next two weeks. It will take approximately 4 days to complete and all three floors of the building will finally have reliable WiFi access. This is necessary not just for everyday functionality, but also for groups who use our building, the new offerings in our Christian Education program and the next phase of calling a full time rector.


The vestry appreciates your support and looks forward to the exciting days ahead. As always, it is a privilege and a blessing to be your Senior Warden.

Food Ministry News

The whole congregation is invited to celebrate the Food Ministry Promise Campaign Kickoff and Breakfast August 10 in the parish hall after the 8:30 service. Promoting Food security and the history of this ministry will be shared. You will meet our amazing Molly, food drive conductor extraordinaire and learn how to conduct your own successful food drive.

Promise forms will be available for you to become or continue to be a dedicated supporter of this outreach.

This year's goal will be \$14,000. Your generous donations last year along with Thornton Trust funds allowed all goals to be reached.

The need is so great this summer. All 35 dinner bags and more than 70 lunch bags have been shared at each of summer distributions. Well over a third of this week's

guests were new to the Food Ministry. Unsheltered neighbors have steadily arrived to receive backpack foods. The incidental groceries you have shared have all been passed along and once again the shelves are ready to receive more.

CHANGES:

We have a food scale that will be used to quantify the amounts of food received and shared. Please place your generous unexpired donations on the counter in or beside the marked bag in the parish hall or basket in the sanctuary. We will handle weighing and storing them in the cabinets.

The new freezer arrives Monday and the remaining balance of the Bishop's Appeal Grant will be used to stock it with frozen options.


Trinity is blessed by all of this.


