Last Saturday AARP sponsored a shred event with the only requirement that people bring nonperishable items for Trinity's food ministry. What an amazing and overwhelming response from the community at large. A special thanks to Marian Patey for coordinating this event with AARP. As we continue to meet the challenge of an increase in people who desperately need food, we saw God's hand at work in filling our cupboards.

In our never- ending reorganization efforts, Samantha and I moved the coatrack that had been previously used by the Altar Assistants to the Garth and hung the coats that have come in so far. We are often asked if we have socks since that is an item our unhoused friends find difficult to obtain. The coat rack has bins that allow for socks, gloves, scarves and hats to be stored so those in need can access them as the weather turns cold.

The letters we sent out for our Stewardship Campaign included an information sheet that shows how your money is being used to fulfill our responsibilities to our parish and our commitment to be a source of hope in the community. We, as a vestry, are grateful for your faithfulness and support during the past year. We have accomplished many things we never imagined were possible and we look forward to what God has in store for us in the year ahead.

These are very difficult and concerning times that we are living in. Everything that we were taught and believed in can seem like it is slipping away. It is at times like this, that we must remember Jesus is still walking the way with us and his commandment to "love one another" is not some random slogan but the way through this darkness to light.



Stewardship Drive

Welcome to Stewardship season! Our theme this year is "We walk in faith not by sight" from 2 Corinthians.

There have been many upgrades to the building and grounds in 2025, thanks to all our generous Trinity members. **Your pledges have helped fund the following improvements**.

- The Florida room's carpeting was replaced with vinyl flooring
- The Narthex doors were replaced
- The Sanctuary doors were replaced with the very generous donation from Byron and Elaine Speice
- New boiler was installed
- A new HVAC system was installed in the basement
- Outside lights were installed along the back walkway
- More Ring cameras were installed for better church security
- The building's brick has been repaired.

There is still more to be done! Replacement Florida room doors have been ordered, the outdoor sump pump needs to be repaired, electrical repairs are needed, more masonry work is required, and we are looking at quotes to update the sanctuary lighting.





Trinity is collecting food and funds to provide Thanksgiving meals for families in our area.

We are collecting the following items until **Thursday**, **November 13**. *All listed sizes* are the minimum size requested:

Canned Green Beans (29 ounce)
Canned Sweet Potatoes (40 ounce)
Instant Mashed Potatoes (13.75 ounces)
Stuffing Mix (such as Stove Top) (6 ounces)
Cranberry Sauce (14 ounces)
Gravy (18 ounces)

As John Baker reminded us Sunday this is not the biggest, flashiest, well stocked food pantry but it meets needs and feeds the souls of all who come to both share and receive.


Please prayerfully consider your pledge to this church that it will continue to be a place of refuge and resource to all. Peace be with you.

Escaping from an abusive marriage, seventeen-year-old Lakshmi makes her way alone to the vibrant 1950s pink city of Jaipur. There she becomes the most highly requested

henna artist--and confidante--to the wealthy women of the upper class. But trusted with the secrets of the wealthy, she can never reveal her own...

Known for her original designs and sage advice, Lakshmi must tread carefully to avoid the jealous gossips who could ruin her reputation and her livelihood. As she pursues her dream of an independent life, she is startled one day when she is confronted by her husband, who has tracked her down these many years later with a high-spirited young girl in tow--a sister Lakshmi never knew she had. Suddenly the caution that she has carefully cultivated as protection is threatened. Still she perseveres, applying her talents and lifting up those that surround her as she does.

Vivid and compelling in its portrait of one woman's struggle for fulfillment in a society pivoting between the traditional and the modern, The Henna Artist opens a door into a world that is at once lush and fascinating, stark and cruel.


