Notes From the Vestry

This coming Sunday, September 7th, marks the beginning of Launch Pad, our Christian Education program for the children and youth at Trinity. We invite everyone to join us for one worship service at 11:00 AM and a picnic to follow. There will be games and the infamous dunk tank, as well as football on the monitors in the Parish Hall. We look forward to seeing all of you and celebrating the beginning of many exciting things to come for our parish.

Our first set of doors has been installed in the narthex and looks amazing! Many thanks to Carrie Rainoff, our Junior Warden, who is handling this enormous project to replace doors in the sanctuary and Florida Room. This is part of our ongoing efforts to increase church security and complete many deferred maintenance projects that we are addressing prior to the arrival of a new rector.

Pat Cobb, one of our parishioners with an extensive security background, led our Adult Forum on Sunday. He shared key points from the Prince William County Police Department on security for houses of worship. He also reviewed a number of the things we have been doing over the past several months to increase safety both on Sunday mornings and during the week as people work and attend different programs at Trinity. It is a blessing to have Pat lead our security efforts at Trinity. We will continue to update the congregation on security protocols as they are finalized and put into practice.

Bible study, Men's Group, Yoga, the Quilters, Prince William Little Theatre, Drew Robinson Music Studio, Food Ministry, and the Greek class, are just some of the events that take place on a regular basis at Trinity. We are an active and I believe a thriving parish once again. The one thing that stands out about our beloved Trinity, is the resilience shown through challenging times that have brought us together in ways we could not have imagined a year ago. We are a people determined to become who God has imagined us to be. Carrie and I are excited to continue to lead this amazing parish into the year ahead and look forward to what new opportunities we will have to follow the commandment of Jesus to love one another.



The Trinity Book Club continues to meet on the final Wednesday of each month at 6:00 PM. All lovers of literature are more than welcome. Our September meeting will find us reading The Book of Joy: Lasting Happiness in a Changing World by Dalai Lama XIV.

Two great spiritual masters share their own hard-won wisdom about living with joy even in the face of adversity.

The occasion was a big birthday. And it inspired two close friends to get together in Dharamsala for a talk about something very important to them. The friends were His Holiness the Dalai Lama and Archbishop Desmond Tutu. The subject was joy. Both winners of the Nobel Prize, both great spiritual masters and moral leaders of our time, they are also known for being among the most infectiously happy people on the planet.

From the beginning the book was envisioned as a three-layer birthday cake: their own stories and teachings about joy, the most recent findings in the science of deep happiness, and the daily practices that anchor their own emotional and spiritual lives. Both the Dalai Lama and Archbishop Tutu have been tested by great personal and national adversity, and here they share their personal stories of struggle and renewal. Now that they are both in their eighties, they especially want to spread the core message that to have joy yourself, you must bring joy to others.

Most of all, during that landmark week in Dharamsala, they demonstrated by their own exuberance, compassion, and humor how joy can be transformed from a fleeting emotion into an enduring way of life.

Yet labyrinths transcend denomination, welcoming anyone to walk their path as a cross-cultural practice for well-being. One might enter the labyrinth to quiet the mind, restore balance, deepen meditation and insight, or mark a moment of celebration or thanksgiving.




