Notes From the Vestry

Ingathering for our stewardship pledges is this Sunday, November 23rd . This has been an exciting fifteen months where we have seen so many projects completed, our food ministry take off in ways we never could have imagined, Altar of Hope increase our Thanksgiving baskets, Christian Education reimagined, and supply priests who love and respect us and walk our journey with us. You have responded to this year's campaign in an amazing display of generosity totaling \$304,620 to date. The vestry is grateful that you have supported our efforts throughout this time and trust us to prepare the way for the calling of a new rector during 2026. Trinity is blessed beyond measure and to quote the words from the song John taught us on Sunday, "I am the church, you are the church, we are the church together".

There have been numerous discussions regarding improving security at Trinity. Back in August, Pat Cobb presented measures that were going to be put in place to keep our staff and congregation as safe as possible. The new doors, the keypad entry, more security cameras, lights and sensors are all steps we have taken in this endeavor. Beginning on November 30, we will be locking the doors shortly after the services start. Numerous churches in our area have been doing this for several years. A doorbell will be at the Florida Room and sanctuary doors. If you are running late, just ring the bell and you will be let in. The sanctuary bell is light activated so there will be no noise disrupting the service. Ushers will let you in. If you come to the Florida Room door, Lisbeth will be available to welcome you inside. We know that this is going to take some getting used to, but the feeling from those who attended the forum in August was very supportive of our efforts to improve safety for everyone. If you need to leave during the service, we ask that you use the side aisle closest to the piano and go out that door into the narthex. We have spoken with other churches that lock during the service and this seems to be the easiest way to handle people needing to leave and return. As we implement this change, we will see how things go and make adjustments as necessary. I appreciate your patience as we work our way through this new protocol.




This gift can be in honor or memory of someone and can be filled by an individual, family, office, team, club, class or neighborhood. All will be blessed.

Escaping from an abusive marriage, seventeen-year-old Lakshmi makes her way alone to the vibrant 1950s pink city of Jaipur. There she becomes the most highly requested

henna artist--and confidante--to the wealthy women of the upper class. But trusted with the secrets of the wealthy, she can never reveal her own...

Known for her original designs and sage advice, Lakshmi must tread carefully to avoid the jealous gossips who could ruin her reputation and her livelihood. As she pursues her dream of an independent life, she is startled one day when she is confronted by her husband, who has tracked her down these many years later with a high-spirited young girl in tow--a sister Lakshmi never knew she had. Suddenly the caution that she has carefully cultivated as protection is threatened. Still she perseveres, applying her talents and lifting up those that surround her as she does.

Vivid and compelling in its portrait of one woman's struggle for fulfillment in a society pivoting between the traditional and the modern, The Henna Artist opens a door into a world that is at once lush and fascinating, stark and cruel.


