From the Pastor's Desk



I am blessed with profound childhood memories of Easter. I still remember my blue and white stuffed Easter Bunny that Mamma would take out of storage the day before Easter and give us to enjoy on Easter Sunday and a few weeks to follow. We had a new Easter outfit every year, which would become our Sunday clothes for the rest of the year. We would have our Easter Basket filled with chocolate bunnies, jelly beans, Peeps, and decorated eggs (which we dyed in advance). After Easter Sunday Mass, we headed to my Grandmother's home for dinner with all the relatives (Grandmom, Aunts, Uncles, and Cousins). The adults sat at one table; the kids sat at the kids' table. The dinner always started with a cup of Fruit Cocktail, with half of a Maraschino cherry on top. After the appetizer, we would enjoy a cup of Skarol (escarole) soup, followed by the primi piatti (First plate) Ravioli, meatballs, and sausage, and then the secondo

piatti (second plate) complete with meat, salad, vegetables, and potatoes. My Mother and Aunts would do the dishes while the Uncles called the grandchildren outside for the highlight of our day, our annual Easter Egg Hunt in my Grandmom's backyard. It was always a day of incredible joy.

Today, as you celebrate Easter, what comes to your mind? Chocolate bunnies, fond childhood memories of brightly decorated Easter baskets, or coloring eggs with your kids? Maybe Easter feels like a family celebration to kick off the new life and hope that seems synonymous with Spring. In truth, Easter is so much more than these things. If you are unfamiliar with Christianity, you should know that Easter is the most important celebration on the Christian religious calendar. For centuries, Christians have celebrated Easter to commemorate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. While today, many families still enjoy the non-religious traditions of painting eggs and festive Easter candy, these modern traditions are simple ways to help us celebrate Easter Joy. The miracle of Easter ignites new possibilities, new hopes, and a profound joy that we never dreamed possible. The key to why Christians celebrate Easter is grounded in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. This is the Gospel, or Good News, for Christians. For believers, Jesus' death and resurrection made a way for those who follow him to experience eternal life after earthly death.

Ultimately, Christianity revolves around who Jesus Christ is and what He did. Scripture in the New Testament tells us that Jesus Christ is the Son of God (Matthew 3:17). When Jesus came to Earth, his radical teachings of grace, mercy, and forgiveness amazed Jewish culture. Jesus was the only man to live a sinless life, who then died a sacrificial death and, ultimately, rose from the dead. Jesus had been crucified on a Roman cross, and then on the third day after his death, eyewitnesses discovered that the tomb where Jesus was buried was empty. Many additional witnesses saw that he had risen, defeating death through the power of God (1 Corinthians 15:3-8).

Christianity revolves around the belief that humanity needed a savior. Maybe today, you are unsure about whether you need a savior. Perhaps you try to live a good life and hope your good deeds will be sufficient. However, in the New Testament (Romans 3:23), we are taught, "All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." This means we can not be made right before God without a mediator or a sacrificial Savior to save us from our sins (Ephesians 2:8-9). Catholics hold to the truth that we are saved through our faith (profession in our belief in Christ) and our works (the good deeds we do in the name of Christ).

In the face of sin, there is hope in Christ Jesus. By giving himself willingly to die on the Cross, Jesus sacrificed his life to save sinners like us. (Philippians 2:8). Jesus canceled the punishment of sin for those who believe and choose to follow Him (2 Corinthians 5:21). This is why Catholics and other Christians celebrate Easter!

We can have hope for new life because of what Jesus did at Easter. For Christians, Easter is an important reminder of why faith is so important. This reality struck close to home this past week through the sudden and very unexpected death of our beloved Father Michael Rush. Last Wednesday, Father Rush was supposed to assist us with our Wednesday Lenten Reconciliation program, "The Lights are On for You." You could set your watch by Father Michael's arrival every week because he always arrived 45 minutes before the start of Mass. When he did not show up at 7 PM, Deacon Aaron called his cell phone, which went to his voicemail. Father Infanti heard confessions for two hours that night, and when he arrived back at the Rectory, he informed me that Father Rush did not show up for Confessions. I called him, and again, the call went to his voicemail. I decided to text him and waited 15 minutes for his response. When he did not return the text message, Father Infanti and I drove to his home to do a wellness check on him. The house lights were

on, and his car was in the garage. When we entered the home, we found Father had passed away, most likely from a heart attack, just a few hours before. We found him sitting in his desk chair, working until the end.

While death often has a sting, sudden and unexpected death leaves people bewildered. Quite frankly, we are shocked. Last Tuesday, he celebrated Confirmation with us and joined us for dinner afterward. On Saturday, he joined us for dinner in the Rectory, which he was accustomed to doing, and on Monday, he stopped into the office to obtain a few addresses. Father Michael Rush was healthy, exercised regularly, and, during his recent vacation to Aruba, swam 1.5 miles every day. Jesus taught us that death might come like a thief at night; therefore, we should always be prepared.

I am comforted by several things. First, our belief in the meaning of Easter assures us that Father Michael Rush will have a most glorious Easter this year beyond our wildest imagination. I am confident that the gates of heaven flung open upon his arrival because of his holiness, how he lived his life, the gift of his priesthood, and his service to our parishioners and others throughout 50 years of priesthood. Second, I accompanied him to his car after dinner last Saturday night. Before he stepped into the car, I told him, Michael, I want to tell you something. I told him there were not enough words I have for the blessings he provides to me and the people of our parish. And then, I said to him that I loved him like a brother. He told me, Louie, you don't understand; the blessings have been all mine. I love this parish, the good people of St. Andrew's, and most especially you. These past three years have filled me with joy. We embraced, and he drove back to his home. Those were our final words to one another. While there is profound sadness in our hearts, our faith reminds us that Father Michael has run the race, finished the course, and now enjoys the crown that was waiting for him. And that, my dear Brothers and Sisters, is what Easter Joy truly brings.

So, let us remember Father Michael Rush in our prayers, along with his family, but let us hold to our belief in eternal life that Michael Rush is more thrillingly alive at this moment than he has ever experienced during this lifetime. May he rest in peace. May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen. For those who remain, let us celebrate the Joy that Easter brings. If Jesus had not embraced the Cross, we could not experience eternal life.


