A few years ago, a story appeared in a local newspaper with a photograph showing a rotting field of strawberries. The article described a dire situation for the need of migrant workers and the urgency farmers had to salvage their crops because of the reduced number of laborers. The article quoted the text from

today's Gospel: "The Harvest is Rich, but the workers are few." This is the image Jesus gives us in today's Gospel, reminding us that the mission of spreading God's kingdom is urgent and requires willing laborers.

Today's readings call us to **mission and discipleship**. **Psalm 123** reminds us to keep our eyes fixed on the Lord, seeking His mercy and guidance. **Galatians 6:14-18** teaches us that our true boast is in Christ's cross, not worldly achievements. And in **Luke 10:1-12, 17-20**, Jesus sends out seventy-two disciples, instructing them to proclaim the coming of God's kingdom, bringing peace and healing wherever they go.

Additionally, as we celebrate Independence Day this weekend, we reflect on the freedoms we enjoy—the freedom to worship, speak, and live according to our values. But freedom is not just about independence from oppression; it is about the **responsibility to serve**. The founders of this nation understood that liberty must be accompanied by *virtue*, that freedom is not simply about personal gain but about building a society rooted in *justice* and *truth*.

In the same way, Jesus calls His disciples to a **mission of service**. He sends them out with nothing but faith, instructing them to rely on God's providence. They are to bring peace, heal the sick, and proclaim that the kingdom of God is near. Their mission is not about personal comfort but about **sacrificial love**, just as the sacrifices of those who fought for our nation's independence were not for themselves alone but for the generations to come.

Jesus' words remind us that **true freedom is found in serving others**. The disciples were sent out with no money, extra clothing, or guarantees—only the assurance that God would provide. This is a powerful lesson for us today. We may not always feel equipped for the mission God calls us to, but He asks us to trust Him, to step forward in faith, and to be **workers in His harvest**. Like those who built this nation, we are called to build the kingdom of God—not with weapons or political power, but with **love, mercy, and truth**. We are called to be peacemakers, bring healing to those who suffer, and proclaim God's presence in our midst. As we reflect on our mission, we also remember the **mercy of God**, which sustains us. In His final moments, Jesus showed mercy to the repentant thief on the cross, promising him paradise. And in His revelations to St. Faustina, He assured us that those who trust in His mercy will not be abandoned.

This past week, I was called to the bedside of my Godfather, who was in his final stage of life. His health began to decline within the past 30 days, most probably from a slight stroke. After anointing and granting the Apostolic Pardon,\*\* I sat around his bed, with my Aunt and Cousins, and we prayed the **Divine Mercy Chaplet** together, entrusting my Uncle Jimmy to God's infinite compassion. Jesus promised that those who pray this chaplet at the hour of death will receive great mercy. My Godfather was a veteran, and this weekend, as we honor those who have gone before us—both in faith and in service to our country—we trust that God's mercy embraces them, welcoming them into eternal peace.

Private James Carter once wrote home to his mother from the battlefield: *"Freedom isn't just a word, Mom. It's the faces of the people we protect, the prayers we whisper before every mission, and the sacrifices we make so others don't have to."* James never made it home. But his words remind us that freedom is not just something we celebrate, it is something we *honor*, something we *safeguard*, and something we must *never take for granted*.

This Independence Day, let us remember those who gave everything so we could live in peace.

\*\* The **Apostolic Pardon** is a special blessing given by a priest to a dying person, typically after the Sacraments of Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and Viaticum. It does not forgive sins directly but grants a plenary indulgence, which removes the temporal punishment due to sins that have already been forgiven through confession. # "He said to them, 'The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few...'" LUKE 10:2

As Catholics we are all called to Stewardship. Each of us has been given "charisms" otherwise known as gifts from the Holy Spirit to help build God's Church. Our charisms can only be used for good. We know that we are using them in the right ministry when we are filled with joy and we want to share stories about our charitable works. Discern how God is calling you to use your charisms. Say "yes" to what God is calling you to do and then do it! Share your joy and invite others to do the same.



Preparing for Mass is more than getting in the car mindlessly and finding a pew. From the moment you start getting dressed in your finest, you are preparing your hearts for communion with your Savior, which calls for your utmost reverence.

### What Not To Wear To Mass

**1.** Flip-flops and beachwear – Keep these items for fun in the sun, not worshiping the Son.

**2.** T-shirts and jeans – Great for hanging out with friends, but keep it classy when you are in the presence of God.

3. Revealing or too-tight shirts, skirts, and pants
4. Sweatpants, yoga pants, pajama pants, and gym shorts – Our culture loves to be comfy, but Mass is not for lounging. We suggest saving these items for when you return home.
