

From the Pastor's Desk



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK. 22nd Sunday In Ordinary Time Gospel: Luke 14:1, 7–14

"For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

Years ago, I was invited to give a Lenten Mission at a small poor parish tucked into the hills

of Appalachia. The church was simple; wooden beams, faded hymnals, and a sanctuary that bore the fingerprints of generations. They even built a wooden ramp for me to access the church and the sanctuary. After the liturgy, the community gathered for a shared meal in the parish hall, which was nothing more than a tent—located next to the church.

Amid the bustle, I noticed a woman named Clara quietly moving from table to table, refilling cups, clearing plates, emptying trash, and offering gentle smiles to children and elders alike. She never sat down. She ne ver made a speech. She never asked for thanks. Later, I learned Clara had been the backbone of that parish for decades; organizing food drives, teaching catechism, caring for the sick, running the food pantry. When I thanked her, she simply said, "I just like making sure everyone's fed. I like doing it for others, but I love doing it for my Jesus." Clara didn't need a place of honor. She created one for others. In my opinion, the message she delivered with her actions, was more powerful than any words I offered during the parish mission.

In today's Gospel, Luke 14, we see the action of Jesus that I like to call "The Divine Reversal". Jesus was invited to dine at the home of a prominent Pharisee. He watched as guests jockeyed for the best seats—those closest to prestige and power. Then He told a parable that upended the social script: "When you are invited, go and sit in the *lowest* place." This was more than etiquette—it was a revelation about the Kingdom of God. Jesus was speaking to a culture obsessed with hierarchy and recognition, and He offered a radical alternative: *humility is the path to honor.*

In biblical tradition, meals were sacred spaces of communion and covenant. To choose the lowest seat was to trust that God—not status—would lift you up. It is a posture of surrender, of quiet dignity, of faith in divine justice. To emphasize his point, Jesus then turned to the host and said, "Invite the poor, the crippled, the lame,

and the blind." In doing so, He redefined hospitality, not as a transaction, but as grace. He taught them, and us, that the table of the Lord is not reserved for the powerful, but open to the forgotten.

This Gospel challenges us to examine our own tables, literal and metaphorical. It challenges us to put our humility into action. We should ask, who do **we** invite into our lives? Do I seek *recognition*, or do I seek *to serve*? We might apply this to our lives in the following ways:

- In our families: Let us honor the quiet sacrifices; those who cook, clean, and care without applause.
- In our parish: Let us recognize the unseen laborers; the volunteer sacristans, (those who arrive early and leave last), our compassionate outreach volunteers (those behind the scenes that coordinate and implement our charitable efforts), and all the "Clara's" in our parish that evidence hospitality in unique ways.
- In our hearts: Let us ask not, "What's in it for me?" but "Whom can I lift up?"

Humility is not self-deprecation, it is self-giving. It is the courage to let others shine, and the grace to rejoice when they do.

As we approach *Labor Day* on Monday, the Gospel offers a timely reflection. Our society often celebrates the visible—the titles, the promotions, and the accolades. But Jesus reminds us that the Kingdom of God honors the *hidden labor*: the "Clara's" of our parish who work behind the scenes to make other people's lives better. Labor Day is not just a civic holiday—it is a spiritual invitation to recognize the *dignity of work*, especially the kind that goes unnoticed. It is a chance to thank those who take the lowest seat so others may rise.

Today's Gospel can be summarized this way:

"The highest seat in God's Kingdom is reserved for those who never asked for one."

Why not cut this phrase from the bulletin and tape it to your dashboard, desk, or refrigerator. This will help you carry the spirit of humility into your homes, workplaces, and hearts. Let us remember, as Christians, let us labor not for recognition, but for love—and trust that in God's time, and in His Kingdom, we will be lifted up.

A Request for Care on Church Grounds

Seven Sisters Apostolate



Parochial Vicar's Message

Four years ago, in my first parish assignment, I was offering spiritual direction to a woman in the parish. After one of our meetings, she made a request that would change my life as a priest and the life of priests in our diocese. She sought to fulfill a prayerful

desire to pray for priests and was unsure of the best means to be successful. At the time, I was reading a book called Praying For Priests by Kathleen Beckman and in the book, she spoke about groups that pray for priests. After some research, I presented several options for her to choose, and God led her to choose the Seven Sisters Apostolate, which at the time was in its early stages. At the time, there was only one group listed in our diocese, which may have been inactive.

In March 2020, my directee and I undertook the next approach to ask other women in the parish to join. It was challenging and it took at least 1 ½ years to find enough women to form the first full group. Although it was a challenge, I followed the Holy Spirit's lead directing me to ask only two other women. To my surprise, both agreed, telling me later they shared the same desire as my directee, and this was the answer to their prayer. This was vulnerable and scary for me to form a new ministry in the parish and with Covid shutdowns having just begun not long before the first meeting, I feared the apostolate would not be successful. After a few months, these three women had a fourth member join, all making their first commitment prayer in a simple ceremony in June of 2021. Today, Incarnation has two thriving groups with several substitute women to fill in on days the women are unable to pray.

You may be asking, what is the Seven Sisters Apostolate? The Seven Sisters Apostolate is a group or several groups of seven women who pray for the success of the vocation and role of the pastor/priest(s) in the parish. An anchoress is assigned to oversee a group, coordinating and guiding her group of seven women as a loving spiritual mother. Each of the seven women is assigned a separate day to offer one holy hour on that day with prayers completely offered for the priest assigned to the group. When there is a transfer, the new priest in that office, whether pastor or parochial vicar, etc. is the recipient of the prayers of the group.

All this being shared, when I arrived at Saint Andrew's in September 2023, Monsignor Marucci and I spoke about the apostolate. He asked if I would start the group here, yet I was hesitant because I saw too many ministries offering prayer for priests. At the Seven Sisters Commitment Prayer Mass in June, Bishop Williams asked me, "Are these the women from Saint Andrew's Seven Sisters group?" Although I was talking with the women from Incarnation at the event, I knew the Holy Spirit was speaking to me. In future holy hours, I prayed and felt God calling me to begin the apostolate at Saint Andrews. With Monsignor Marucci's approval, I have asked three women in the parish to help form and lead three groups of seven women to pray for each of the priests in the parish.

If you have had the same desire to pray for priests and would like to pray for the priests at Saint Andrews through the Seven Sisters Apostolate, I ask you to contact me by email or speak to me after Mass and I will be happy to explain more and help in the success of the apostolate at Saint Andrews.

Will pause for the 8:00 am Mass followed by the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament .


Benediction and reposition conclude the prayer devotion.
