

From the Parochial Vicar's Desk



Parochial Vicar's Message

When I entered the seminary in August of 2003, I was invited to a meeting with the other Camden Seminarians to hear Father Tom Barcellona present information to any seminarians who would like to go on pilgrimage to World

Youth Day 2005 in Germany. The first question I asked myself when I went to this meeting was, "What is a pilgrimage and what is World Youth Day?" Yes, I was not well versed in either event, yet now I am! Thus, my first pilgrimage was to World Youth Day 2005 in Germany with roughly 100 pilgrims (priests and laity) from the Diocese of Camden. This was my first pilgrimage and first time I traveled outside the USA to visit two major Marian Pilgrimage sites at Fatima, Portugal and Lourdes, France. Years later, I desired to return on pilgrimage to those same Marian sites and 18 years later this past October 2023 I retraced my first pilgrimage steps to Fatima and Lourdes with 20 other pilgrims.

For anyone who may have been in the same position as me, your first question when asked to go on a pilgrimage or hear someone is going on pilgrimage may be, "What is a pilgrimage?" A pilgrimage is an ancient way of deepening one's spirituality by traveling to a place associated with a holy person or holy site or a jubilee year. It can be a deeply moving and powerful religious encounter. Pilgrims are not tourists, pilgrims are people on a journey designed to take them outside their everyday, familiar lives into an unfamiliar environment, where they can encounter the extraordinary, and thereby experience God in a new way. Some pilgrimages may be in coordination with a theme such as the Year for Priests (2009-2010) or the Year of Mercy (2015-2016) or the Year of Saint Joseph (2020-2021).

A Jubilee year has its roots in Judaism, when the ram's horn called a *yobel* was used to proclaim the Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur). This celebration was announced each year, yet the announcement takes on a special tone during a Jubilee year. In the beginning, the Jubilee year was announced every 50 years to mark a special time for the people to re-establish a proper relationship with God, one another, and with all creation

by forgiving debts, returning misappropriated lands, and a fallow period for fields.

Today when a Jubilee year is proclaimed, the Holy Father issues a special letter called a "Bull" or public decree to the universal Church to mark a special celebration of a momentous year for the faithful to pray. The first Jubilee year, also known as a "Holy Year," was proclaimed by Pope Boniface VIII in the 1300's. Afterwards, Jubilee years were called every 100 years, later Pope Clement VI reduced them to every 50 years, and later Pope Paul II reduced them to every 25 years. Involvement in a Jubilee year is an opportunity to receive an indulgence, which is a concrete manifestation of God's mercy, which goes beyond and transforms the boundaries of human justice. The Jubilee indulgence allows the faithful to free their hearts from the weight of sin because the reparation due for our sins is given freely and abundantly.

There are several ways to prepare to go on pilgrimage. Praying about whether God is calling you to go on a pilgrimage to a location is the best way to prepare for pilgrimage. Choosing a particular saint, whose remains you may venerate while on pilgrimage, that saint can be your spiritual companion on the journey. Bringing intentions from your parish community or youth group or family to pray for at the various holy sites. Prepare yourself to be flexible for any changes or conditions that could challenge you during your pilgrimage. Most important is to allow yourself to be open to God to speak to you and through you while you are on pilgrimage.

The next Jubilee year has been proclaimed by Pope Francis from December 24, 2024, to December 24, 2025. Many priests from around the world and in our own diocese will be working with various agencies to lead a pilgrimage to Rome, Italy for the Jubilee year and walk through the Holy Doors. Father Ray Gormley and I decided we would like to lead a pilgrimage together for anyone wishing to visit Rome for the Holy Year 2025 along with several other pilgrimage sites in Italy. Dear Parish Family,

As we continue to foster a welcoming and safe environment for all who come to worship and gather here at St. Andrew the Apostle , I'd like to make a gentle but important request regarding smoking on church property. Out of care for the health and well-being of our parishioners—especially our children, elderly, and those with breathing sensitivities—we ask that **smoking not take place anywhere on church grounds**, including entrances, walkways, and gathering areas. Many individuals must pass through these spaces, and even brief exposure to smoke can pose serious health risks.

Additionally, we kindly ask that cigarettes not be extinguished in mulch, grass, or near landscaping. These areas are highly flammable, and even a single ember can pose a risk of fire. Hamburger Noodle Casserole
1 lb. hamburger
15 oz. can or jar tomato sauce
1 medium chopped onion
1 cup of green pepper

1 cup cottage cheese1 cup sour cream12oz. egg noodles2 cups Shredded Monterey Jack Cheese

- -Combine the hamburger, green pepper and onion and sauté until meat is cooked. Salt and pepper to taste. Add to-mato sauce and simmer for 20 minutes.
- -Cook noodles according to package directions.
- -In another bowl combine sour cream and cottage cheese.
- -Blend cottage cheese and sour cream mixture with the cooked noodles.
- -Salt and pepper to taste.
- -In a lightly greased aluminum pan spread the hamburger mixture. Next, layer the noodle mixture. Top casserole with shredded Monterey jack cheese.

Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until thoroughly heated.

NOTE: Please freeze the casserole, cover with aluminum foil, date and label



Religious Education Classes for Children

Catholic religious education programs, often referred to as CCD or PREP, aim to deepen children's understanding of the Catholic faith and prepare them for sacraments like First Communion and Confirmation and to live out their Catholic faith. Our program includes classroom instruction, prayer, and liturgical celebrations, with a focus on scripture, doctrine, and living out one's faith. Parents play a vital role, with the Church assisting in their responsibility to nurture their child's faith.

It is time to enroll your child in our Religious Education program for September!

The registration form can be found on our website or in the church vestibule for your convenience. Please complete the registration form and return it to the religious education office or parish office as soon as possible. Information about the various class options we offer can be found on the church website under the Religious Education tab.

Please give us a call if you have any questions about our program or if you have any questions about how to register. We're here to help!

We are always in need of catechists, substitute catechists and classroom assistants throughout the school year. If you have an hour or two to assist us, we would be most grateful for additional volunteers for our religious education program.

Sacramental Catch Up Program for Children

The Sacramental Catch-Up program is designed for families with children in grades 3 - 12 who have been baptized Catholic but have missed the usual window for receiving the Sacraments of Initiation. Through the Sacramental catch up program, we can assist your children to continue their faith formation and receive the sacraments appropriate for their age and stage of faith formation.

Over the course of the year, children and parents (at least one of the parents) will go through formation for First Eucharist, First Reconciliation, and/or Confirmation together to help the whole family prepare the child to receive the sacraments. Classes meet on alternate Sundays from 9:00 AM to 9:50AM in the St. Andrew's Parish Hall from September through May.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults

The OCIA distinguishes between several groups:

Catechumen: A non baptized person desiring all three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.


Candidate for Confirmation and Eucharist: A person already baptized either in the Catholic Church or a Christian denomination whose baptism is valid and desires to receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist.

Candidate for Confirmation only: A person who is already baptized and has received the Sacrament of Eucharist but needs to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to complete his/her Sacraments of Christian Initiation.

Formal classes will begin in September! Please call or email if you are interested in participating in the OCIA classes! Our next Inquiry meeting will be held on Monday, September 8th at 7:00 PM in the Upper Room of the Parish Hall.




