



From the Pastor's Desk



The Exaltation of the Holy Cross – A Sign of Mercy, Mission, and Meaning

In a refugee camp outside Aleppo, a young boy named Sami lay feverish and barely breathing. His mother, having lost everything in the war, clutched him to her chest and whispered prayers she barely

remembered. A volunteer nurse arrived with medicine and a wooden crucifix around her neck. She knelt beside the child, administered the dose, and said softly, "Look up, little one. You are not forgotten." Sami survived. Years later, he said that he didn't remember the medicine—but he remembered the cross. "It was the first time I saw hope," he said. "It was the first time I believed someone was still watching over me."

Within this Sunday's readings Jesus draws a direct line from the wilderness of Sinai to the hill of Calvary. In Numbers 21, the Israelites—impatient, rebellious, and despairing—are bitten by serpents. God instructs Moses to mount a bronze serpent on a pole: "If anyone who has been bitten looks at it, he shall live." It's a strange image—one that seems almost magical. But it is not the bronze that heals—it is the act of looking up in faith, of turning toward mercy.

Centuries later, Jesus invokes this very moment in John 3: "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up." Here, the cross becomes the new pole, and Christ the new healing. But this time, the poison is not venom—it is sin. And the cure is not metal—it is mercy.

John 3:16, perhaps the most quoted verse in Scripture, follows immediately: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever would believe in Him would find everlasting life." This is not sentimental love—it is sacrificial. The Cross is not a decoration—it is a declaration: that no matter how far we fall, God will descend further to lift us up.

This weekend, we celebrate the *Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross*—a day that honors not just the wood of the Cross, but the victory it represents. It is a feast of paradox: suffering that leads to salvation, death that births life, shame that becomes glory.

It is also a principal feast for the **Knights and Dames of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem**,

who will be present, along with Bishop Joseph Williams, at our 10 AM Mass. This Papal Order traces its roots to the earliest Christian pilgrims and exists today to support the Church in the Holy Land, protect sacred sites, and promote the dignity of all people in the land where Christ walked.

Their presence among us is not ceremonial—it is a living witness. They wear the Jerusalem Cross not as ornamentation, but as a sign of service. Their mission reminds us that the Cross is not just to be venerated—it is to be carried.

The Cross we exalt this weekend is not only a symbol of salvation—it is a lifeline for the Christians of the Holy Land, whose presence is rapidly vanishing. In Bethlehem, the birthplace of Christ, Christians once made up 86% of the population in 1950. Today, they account for barely 10%. In Gaza, the Christian population has plummeted from 5,000 before Hamas took control in 2007 to fewer than 1,000 as of late 2023. These are not just numbers—they are families, parishes, and centuries-old traditions gasping for breath under the weight of war, persecution, and economic despair. Without our solidarity, the land where Jesus walked may soon be devoid of those who still walk in His name. This would be a tragedy.

This is why the presence of the Knights and Dames of the Holy Sepulchre at our 10 AM Mass is so significant. Their mission is not nostalgic—it is urgent. They support schools, hospitals, and parishes in Jerusalem, Bethlehem, and beyond, ensuring that the Christian voice is not silenced in the land of its birth. They support the work of the Latin Patriarch who shepherds Israel, Palestine, Jordon, and Cyprus. This unique ecclesiastical jurisdiction serves as the spiritual and administrative center for Latin-rite Catholics across these regions who face significant challenges due to political instability, economic hardship, and emigration pressures.

The Patriarchate's mission includes pastoral care, education, humanitarian outreach, and the preservation of Christian presence in the Holy Land. Its work is supported by several vicariates and deeply intertwined with the efforts of the Knights and Dames of the Holy Sepulchre, who help sustain Christian institutions in these territories.

But they cannot do it alone. As we gaze upon the Cross this weekend, let us remember that its shadow still falls over the Holy Land—and that we are called to be its light. The Cross is not just to be lifted—it must be carried. And today, it is theirs to bear—but ours to share.

So what can we do, as parishioners, to live this feast? I • suggest the following:

- Look up: In moments of despair, turn your gaze to the Cross. Let it remind you that suffering is never the end of the story.
- **Lift up**: Find someone who is struggling—emotionally, spiritually, financially—and lift them with a word, a gesture, a prayer.
- **Carry forward**: Make a commitment this week to *live* sacrificially. Whether it is forgiving someone, giving generously, or serving quietly—let your life reflect the mercy of the Cross.

 Prayerfully consider joining the Order. If interested, please contact Msgr. Marucci directly.

And if you feel unworthy, remember this: the Cross was never meant for the perfect. It was meant for the broken, the bitten, the weary. It was meant for us. Let us keep in mind that **The Cross is not where the story ends—it is where love begins.** May this feast renew our courage, deepen our compassion, and remind us that every time we look up, mercy is waiting.


Dear St. Andrew Parish Family,

Hamburger Noodle Casserole

1 lb. hamburger beef1 cup cottage cheese15 oz. can or jar tomato sauce1 cup sour cream1 medium chopped onion12 oz. egg noodles

1 cup of green pepper 2 cups shredded Monterey Jack Cheese

Combine the hamburger, green pepper and onion and sauté until meat is cooked. Salt and pepper to taste.

Add tomato sauce and simmer for 20 minutes.

Cook noodles according to package directions.

In another bowl combine sour cream and cottage cheese.

Blend cottage cheese and sour cream mixture with the cooked noodles.

Salt and pepper to taste.

In a lightly greased aluminum pan spread the hamburger mixture. Next, layer the noodle mixture. Top casserole with shredded Monterey jack cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until thoroughly heated.





You accepted with trust to be stripped of your youth to dedicate yourself in heaven, with Jesus


and Mary, to a mission of boundless love.
