

From the Pastor's Desk



Years ago, a young seminarian visited a remote village in the Andes. The people were poor, the chapel crumbling, and the priest overburdened. Yet every morning, an elderly woman arrived early to sweep the chapel floor with a handmade broom. She never missed a day. When asked why she

did it, she smiled and said, "I want the Lord to find His house ready, even if no one else comes." That chapel, once forgotten, became a thriving center of worship. The seminarian later said, "She moved more than dust—she moved hearts. She moved mountains."

This Sunday's Gospel reminds us that faith, even as small as a mustard seed, can uproot mulberry trees and cast them into the sea. But Jesus quickly shifts the focus: faith is not about spectacle—it's about humble service.

The apostles pleaded with Jesus, "Increase our faith!" This plea was uttered in response to Jesus' prior teaching on radical forgiveness. He responded not with a formula, but with a paradox: even the tiniest faith can achieve the impossible. Yet He followed with a parable about a servant who, after fulfilling his duties, did not expect praise. "We are unworthy servants; we have only done what was our duty."

This comparison revealed three key insights:

- Faith is not quantity but quality: A mustard seed's power lies in its potential. Faith is not measured by size but by surrender.
- Faith expresses itself in obedience: The servant's humility was not self-deprecation but clarity—he knew his place in the divine economy (relationship with God).
- Faith is relational, not transactional: We do not earn God's favor through duty; we respond to His love with fidelity.

We see the same expressions of faith in the feast days celebrated this past week. They illuminate the Gospel beautifully:

On Wednesday, October 1st, we celebrated the Feast of St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus. St Thérèse is one of my favorite saints. My mother taught me the Novena to Saint Thérèse when I was a little boy, and I have prayed it my

entire life. St. Thérèse never fails me. Her "Little Way" is the embodiment of a mustard-seed faith. She embraced hidden acts of love, trusting that small sacrifices offered with great love move the heart of God. Her spiritual boldness—asking for all the graces others refused—echoes the apostles' cry: "Increase our faith!"

On **Thursday**, **October 2**nd, we celebrated the Feast of the **Holy Guardian Angels**. These celestial companions remind us that God entrusts each soul with divine protection. They serve without recognition, guiding us silently. Like the servant in the Gospel, they fulfill their mission without seeking reward. They act with pure obedience born for love of God. I remember when I was a little boy in the second grade, I had a terrible habit of kicking my heel against my desk. When Sister Vincent told me to stop making that noise, I told her that it wasn't me, it was my Guardian Angel . Perhaps you should not throw your Guardian Angel under the bus, but pray for strength and protection.

Likewise, on October 4th, we celebrated the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi. I just returned from Assisi this past week where I visited the resting places of SS Francis, Clare, and Carlo Acutis during our parish pilgrimage. Assisi has a special place in my heart because 43 years ago I made the decision to re-enter the Seminary, while praying outside of the Basilica of St. Clare. There is a simplicity about Assisi that every pilgrim recognizes. Francis renounced wealth to live as a servant of all. He saw creation as kin, calling the sun "brother" and the moon "sister." His humility was not weakness but strength. He placed a radical trust in God's providence. Like the servant in the Gospel, Francis lived the joy of duty without demand for praise or reward.

If we wish to apply this Gospel to our daily living this week, let us imitate the saints and angels in the following ways:

- Offer one hidden act of love daily—a kind word, a silent prayer, a small sacrifice.
- Pray to your Guardian Angel—not just for protection, but for guidance in humility.
- Embrace your duties with joy, like Francis and Thérèse—whether in ministry, family, or work, do what is needed without seeking applause.

Let us always remember that faith is not a spotlight, it is a candle in the dark. When lit with love, even the smallest flame can set the world on fire.

Considering Cremation: A Thoughtful Decision for Your Final Resting Place

While you may be considering cremation rather than traditional full-body burial, it's important to thoughtfully choose a final resting place for cremated remains. The Church earnestly recommends the pious custom of burying the bodies of the deceased. However, it does not forbid cremation -- unless it has been chosen for reasons which are contrary to Christian teaching. Cremated remains are the body of the deceased in a changed form, and as such, they should be treated with same respect and dignity as a full body. The Church teaches that cremated remains must be reverently buried or entombed in a sacred place reserved for the burial of the dead. When choosing cremation, several respectful and meaningful options are available, including:

> Ground Burial / Granite or Glass Niches / Private Family Cremation Estates Placement in an Existing Family Lot, Crypt or Niche


Liturgical Celebrations Scheduled for October and November




November 2025
