From the Pastor's Desk



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK... This weekend we celebrate Stewardship of Time and Talent Sunday at St. Andrew the Apostle Parish. People often speak of the "vibrancy" of our parish and "dynamic" and how "engaged" the parishioners Visitors are often are. amazed at the number of

Ministries and programs our parish offers, particularly those focused on support for the poor and needy. I often hear parishioners express their gratitude for the golden opportunities they have to grow in their faith and/or spiritual lives. As the Pastor, I delight whenever people tell me they are visiting the parish and felt such a "welcoming" spirit when they came to worship at our parish.

I am confident that the parish is "vibrant" and "dynamic" because the parishioners are so engaged as missionary disciples. You might recall that when I first came to the parish (fifteen years ago) I asked every parishioner to make a commitment to the Lord in gratitude for blessings received. In this regard, I encouraged you to become a Christian Steward and to transform our parish into a "Total Stewardship Parish." To live as a Christian Steward means making a planned commitment to give your time, talent, and treasure to the Lord.

To do this I asked everyone to commit to participating in at least one ministry or program for one year. If the ministry or program was not life-giving, I asked you to select a different ministry the following year. Every Parishioner is asked to participate in a ministry or offer their talent to serve the Lord and His church.

Last week our bulletin was designed as the 2025-2026 Parish Ministry Directory which identified the numerous ministries and programs available at St. Andrew's. You were asked to prayerfully review the Ministry Directory during the past week and to come to Mass prepared to commit to at least one Ministry or Program, and/or to offer your specific talent to support the Church. This weekend, I ask you to make your commitment and to bring it to the Lord's Altar.

Our Holy Father has called everyone in the church to live as "Missionary Disciples" To commit to living as a Christian Steward is a perfect way to respond to God's call to live as a Missionary Disciple. It is important to recognize that we do not do this because the Holy Father invited us to do so. More important, we do this as a response in gratitude to the gifts that God lavishly pours upon us.

If people are authentically committed to live a spiritual life let me remind you that there are two ways God wants you to use your Talents? First, God wants you to enjoy what He has given you. He did not gift us with talents just for our own benefit. He gave them to us with the expectation that we share them in justice and charity in the world around us.

So, let me ask you? What are you good at doing? Painting? Designing? Flower arranging? Computers? Serving? Baking? Cooking? Cleaning? Fixing things? Organizing events? Volunteering? Singing? Music? Reading? Proofreading? Gardening? Bookkeeping? Praying? Talking? Listening? Typing? Teaching? Cooking? Electrical Work? Carpentry? Cement work? Fixing Cars? Helping Others? Driving? Laundry? Ironing? Etc.

Whatever your talent or skill is, God wants you to use it for good. God wants you to steward those gifts for Him! If you really desire to please God—if you want to hear Him say, "Well done good and faithful servant" when you meet Him in heaven—then you must faithfully use your talents the way God wants you to. You can accomplish this best when you use your talents and skills for the benefit of others.

Here is something to think about. Perhaps you recently retired and have time to offer as a gift. Did you ever think about offering to drive an elderly parishioner to dialysis, a cancer patient for an infusion, or offering to help parishioners who have a lot on their plate, especially those known as the "sandwich generation," (Those who have a responsibility to care for a young family and elderly parents). Such families are often pulling their hair out trying to figure out how to manage everyone's need. Perhaps you might offer to help unburden their load by volunteering to help such a family one day a week or month.

It is most important to remember this...Commitment to being a Christian Steward begins with prayer and discernment. Last week I asked you to reflect on my article, the ministries and programs in our Directory, and your specific skillset. This week I ask you to offer them to the Lord.

What ministry or program would you like to engage in this year? All I ask is that you participate in at least one

To all Parishioners: An Important Update re: Immigration Laws Affecting Foreign Priests and Religious Workers

An increasing number of priests, religious sisters and brothers, and others serving the Church throughout the United States will be forced to abandon their ministries if policymakers do not act soon. Unfortunately, many parishes, schools, and other Catholic institutions have already had to part with men and women who served them for years because of challenges with the Religious Worker Visa Program.

Below is a link to the USCCB Voter Voice website. Please take a few moments to clink on the link to electronically send letters to your US Senate & Congressional representatives in support of legislation to allow religious workers permission to remain in the USA while they wait for the processing of their Permanent Residence (Green Card) approval.

Currently, an international priest must return to his country for 18 months or longer, waiting for the completion of the Green Card process. FYI, when I started as Vicar for Clergy the entire Green Card process took a little over a year and

the priest received approval while ministering in the USA. Now it takes 4 years. Note: this legislation would only assist religious workers in obtaining a Green Card. It will not affect the wait time for any other category. Please visit the link below and help us to voice our concern to Congress about this new immigration policy and how it is impacting our Church.

Last month we collected 35 casseroles for Joseph's House. A big thank you to our volunteers!!!! We appreciate your commitment to this ministry. In addition to casseroles, we will continue collecting individual snack bags for Joseph's House clients. The next drop off for casseroles will be Thursday, October 22nd, 2025, from 10-11 AM. Hamburger Noodle Casserole

1 lb. hamburger 15 oz. can or jar tomato sauce 1 medium chopped onion 1 cup of green pepper 1-cup cottage cheese1-cup sour cream12oz. egg noodles2 cups Shredded Monterey Jack Cheese

Combine the hamburger, green pepper and onion and sauté until meat is cooked. Salt and pepper to taste. Add tomato sauce and simmer for 20 minutes. Cook noodles according to package directions. In another bowl combine sour cream and cottage cheese. Blend cottage cheese and sour cream mixture with the cooked noodles.

Salt and pepper to taste. In a lightly greased aluminum pan spread the hamburger mixture. Next, layer the noodle mixture. Top casserole with Shredded Monterey Jack Cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until thoroughly heated. NOTE: Please freeze the casserole, cover with aluminum foil, date and label "St. Andrew's- Hamburger Noodle Casserole."


