From the Pastor's Desk



Years ago, a priest visited a woman named Teresa who had spent the last decade caring for her husband after a debilitating stroke. She bathed him, fed him, lifted him, prayed with him. She missed weddings, vacations, even Sunday Mass at times—not because she didn't care, but because he

needed her. When the priest asked how she was holding up, she simply said, "I'm not doing this to be noticed. I'm doing this because I promised."

That line—"I'm not doing this to be noticed"—echoes through today's Gospel.

Jesus tells the parable of two men who go up to the temple to pray. One is a Pharisee, the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stands tall, listing his spiritual résumé: fasting, tithing, moral superiority. He's not just praying—he's performing. The tax collector, meanwhile, stands at a distance, eyes downcast, beating his chest and whispering, "O God, be merciful to me, a sinner."

And Jesus says, "It was the tax collector who went home justified."

This parable is not just about humility—it's about posture. The Pharisee stands apart, confident in his own righteousness. The tax collector stands apart, aware of his need for mercy. One prays to be seen. The other prays to be healed.

It's tempting to read this and immediately side with the tax collector. But the moment we say, "Thank God I'm not like that Pharisee," we become him. That's the trap. The parable is not asking us to choose sides—it's asking us to examine our hearts.

Do we serve to be seen? Or do we serve because we've been loved?

Last week, our parish was invited to commit to a ministry for one year. Many of you signed up to lector, to visit the homebound, to teach religious education, to help with hospitality, music, or maintenance. That's beautiful. But today's Gospel reminds us that ministry is not a stage—it's a sanctuary. It's not about being noticed. It's about being faithful.

The Pharisee's mistake wasn't his fasting or tithing. Those are good things. His mistake was using them as proof of superiority. He turned spiritual practices into spiritual pride. The tax collector, on the other hand, had no résumé to offer—only a heart open to grace.

And grace, as we know, is not earned. It's received.

In parish life, we sometimes fall into the trap of comparison. "I do more than she does." "I've been here longer." "Why don't they recognize me?" But the Gospel calls us to a different posture—not one of entitlement, but one of surrender.

The ministries we commit to—whether public or hidden—are not badges of honor. They're acts of love. They're ways of saying, "Lord, I'm yours. Use me." And sometimes, the most powerful ministry is the one no one sees: the quiet caregiver, the behind-the-scenes volunteer, the person who prays daily for the parish without ever stepping into the spotlight.

Jesus ends the parable with a reversal: "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted." That's not just a warning—it's a promise. God sees what others overlook. God honors what others ignore.

So whether you're teaching a class or folding bulletins, whether you're singing in the choir or sweeping the floor, whether you're leading a committee or simply showing up—do it with the heart of the tax collector. Do it with humility, with gratitude, with love.

And if you ever feel unseen, remember Teresa. She didn't serve to be noticed. She served because she promised. And in that promise, she became a living parable of grace. Let us go home justified—not because we were perfect, but because we were honest. Not because we were noticed, but because we were faithful.

What is All Saints Day?

All Saints Day is typically a holy day of obligation in the Catholic Church that falls on November 1st each year. However, in 2025, the Holy Day of obligation is suppressed since it falls on a Saturday. The day is dedicated to honoring all of the saints in heaven, both the canonized and those whose holiness is known only to God. All Saints Day also serves as a powerful reminder of the communion of saints in which all of the faithful, both those in heaven and those on earth, are spiritually connected.

Three Ways to Honor All Saints Day

On All Saints Day, we enjoy connecting with the saints through Mass, prayer, and reflection.

1. Attend Mass

We will joyfully gather for Mass at 8:00 AM to thank God for the example of the saints and ask for their intercession.

2. Pray the Litany of the Saints

This beautiful and ancient prayer invokes the names of saints from different periods in the Church's history, asking for their prayers. It is especially appropriate to pray on All Saints Day to connect ourselves with the great cloud of witnesses in heaven.

3. Reflect on the Lives of the Saints

Read about the saints who inspire you and seek their guidance in your daily life. You might begin with your Confirmation saint or explore the life of Venerable Bruno Lanteri, founder of the Oblates of the Virgin Mary. Though not yet canonized, Ven. Lanteri lived a life of heroic virtue, making him one of the many unrecognized saints we celebrate on this day.

What Is All Souls Day?

All Souls Day, observed on November 2nd, is a day set aside to pray for the souls of the faithful departed, especially those who are in purgatory, undergoing purification before entering the fullness of heaven. It is an act of mercy and hope, trusting in God's promise of eternal life. While we hope and believe that our loved ones are in heaven, we also recognize that many may still be on their journey toward the pearly gates. Our prayers, sacrifices, and Masses offered on this day assist those souls in their journey toward the fullness of God's presence.

Three Ways to Honor All Souls Day

Mass, prayers, and Novenas are excellent ways to honor the day.

1. Attend Mass

Though not a holy day of obligation, attending Mass on All Souls Day is a beautiful way to pray for the souls of the deceased. The Mass is the highest form of prayer we can offer, and it's especially powerful when offered for the repose of the souls in purgatory.

2. Pray for Those Who Have Passed

One of the most traditional practices on All Souls Day is visiting the graves of deceased loved ones and offering prayers for their souls. Many choose to light a candle at their loved ones' resting place, symbolizing the hope of eternal life. Consider saying these prayers for the faithful departed:

"Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen." — Eternal Rest Prayer

3. Offer a Novena for the Departed

Another powerful way to honor All Souls Day is to pray a novena, offering it for the souls in purgatory. We invite you to enroll in the All Souls Remembrance , where we celebrate daily Masses for all enrolled during the entire month of November.

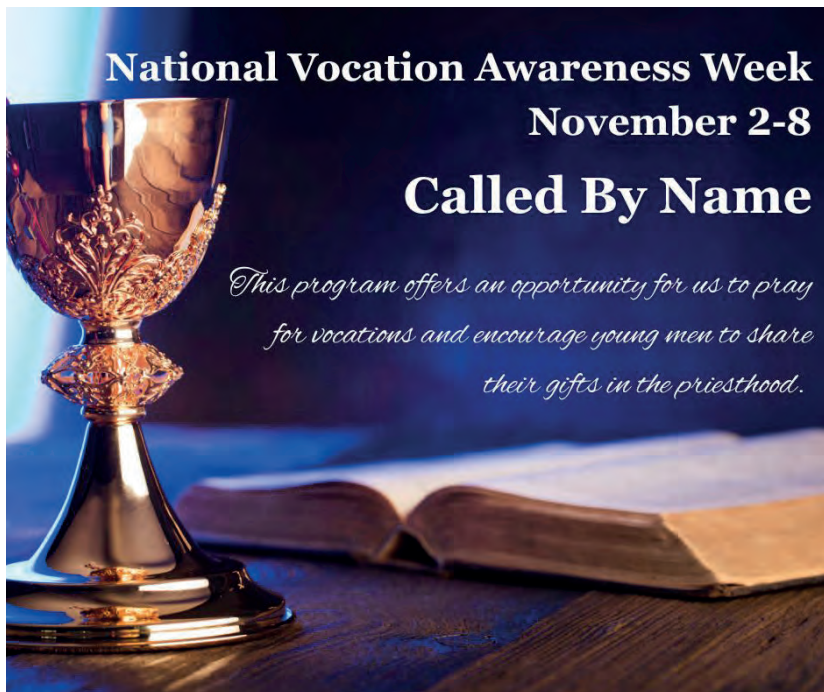
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WOMEN OF JOY PRAYER BREAKFAST

Last month we collected 35 casseroles for Joseph's House. A big thank you to our volunteers!!!! We appreciate your commitment to this ministry. Hamburger Noodle Casserole

1 lb. hamburger	1-cup cottage cheese
15 oz. can or jar tomato sauce	1-cup sour cream
1 medium chopped onion	12oz. egg noodles
1 cup of green pepper	2 cups Shredded Monterey Jack Cheese

Combine the hamburger, green pepper and onion and sauté until meat is cooked. Salt and pepper to taste. Add tomato sauce and simmer for 20 minutes. Cook noodles according to package directions. In another bowl combine sour cream and cottage cheese. Blend cottage cheese and sour cream mixture with the cooked noodles.

Salt and pepper to taste. In a lightly greased aluminum pan spread the hamburger mixture. Next, layer the noodle mixture. Top casserole with Shredded Monterey Jack Cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until thoroughly heated. NOTE: Please freeze the casserole, cover with aluminum foil, date and label "St. Andrew's- Hamburger Noodle Casserole."

Holy Cross Cemetery, Mays Landing

On Saturday, December 13th, Bishop Williams will deliver the opening prayer at this year's ceremony for Wreaths Across America. The ceremony will begin in the parking lot of St. Vincent de Paul Church and end with Christmas Remembrance wreaths placed on the graves of veterans at Holy Cross Cemetery and Lincoln Cemetery in Mays Landing. Please note the wreaths are for placement on ground burial plots.
