From the Pastor's Desk



The Catholic Heart of All Souls' Day

Every year I make grave blankets for the Christmas Bazaar, and many people question the purpose. Italian Americans use "grave blankets" at Christmas to honor and symbolically warm the graves of loved ones during

the cold season, blending Catholic remembrance with seasonal tradition.

Grave blankets are not literal quilts but decorative arrangements of evergreen boughs, ribbons, and sometimes lights, placed atop graves during winter—especially around Christmas. While not originally an Italian tradition from Italy itself, this custom has become popular among Italian American communities, and quickly spread to other communities, particularly in the northeastern United States.

There is a symbolic meaning associated with the custom of bringing the blanket of greens to the grave of a loved one. First, it is a symbol of warmth and remembrance: The evergreen branches represent eternal life, and the blanket-like shape evokes the idea of covering the grave with love and warmth during the cold months.

Second, there is an obvious seasonal connection: Much like Christmas wreaths, grave blankets are made from winter greenery and often include festive decorations. They reflect the belief that even in death, loved ones remain part of the holiday season.

Third, it celebrates our Catholic devotion to our deceased loved ones: In Catholic tradition, praying for the souls of the departed—especially during Advent and Christmas—is a spiritual act of mercy. Grave blankets serve as a visible sign of that prayer and remembrance.

At St. Andrew the Apostle parish we have several ways that we commemorate our loved ones during this time of year. First, we begin with the Mass on/around November 2nd commemorating the Feast of All Soul's. At this very special Mass we invite the families who buried a loved one from our church to return to the church for a special Mass of Remembrance. Additionally, we invite parishioners to register their family members who may have died during the past year but were buried from another parish.

This year, the Mass will be celebrated at 6 PM on Sunday, November 2nd. To Register a loved one who was buried from another parish, <u>after November 2' 2024</u>, please complete the form in the bulletin or at the Parish Office.

The second method is through our Christmas Tree Memorial Garden. This is one of my favorite celebrations of the parish. Each year we reserve 50 outdoor trees (first come, first served) for families to decorate in honor of their deceased family members. We attempt to erect the Tree Garden before the end of the Thanksgiving Weekend (if they arrive by that date) so families can come together to decorate their trees and celebrate the eternal lives of their loved ones. It is a beautiful expression to see the creativity expressed by families. This year's Christmas Tree Garden will be lit on Saturday, December 5th immediately following the 4 PM Mass, where the trees and family members will be blessed in a special way.

The third method is to remember your loved ones by making a special gift to the Christmas Flower Memorial Fund. The names of our loved ones are kept on the Altar throughout the entire Christmas Season and published in the parish bulletin at the end of the Christmas Season.

Additionally, parishioners can PRE-ORDER a Grave Blanket which we sell at the Christmas Bazaar and families can bring to their family plots over the Thanksgiving holiday. These gestures are quite simple, but profoundly Catholic.

On November 2nd, the Church invites all the faithful to remember, to pray, and to hope. The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed—All Souls' Day—is not a day of despair, but of deep communion. It's the Church's way of saying: love doesn't end at death, and neither does our responsibility to one another. The readings for All Souls' Day (this weekend) are solace for grieving hearts. They speak not of finality, but of transformation.

Wisdom 3:1–9 opens with a line that has comforted mourners for centuries: "The souls of the just are in the hand of God, and no torment shall touch them." This passage affirms that death is not the end for those who live in righteousness. Though they may seem to perish, they are at peace. It's a vision of divine justice and mercy, where suffering is not wasted, and fidelity is rewarded.

Psalm 23 continues the theme of trust. "Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil." The psalmist reminds us that God does not abandon

us—not in life, not in death. The image of the Good Shepherd walking with us through darkness is a powerful metaphor for Christ's presence with the dying and the departed.

John 6:37–40 brings the Gospel promise into sharp focus. Jesus says, "This is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him on the last day." Here is the heart of our Catholic hope: resurrection. Not just survival of the soul, but the restoration of the whole person—body and spirit—in the fullness of God's Kingdom.

Together, these readings form a tapestry of consolation. They assure us that our prayers for the dead are not in vain, and that our love for them is not extinguished.

All Souls' Day is rooted in the Church's teaching on **purgatory**—a state of purification for souls who die in God's grace but still need healing from the effects of sin. It's not a punishment, but a mercy. As Pope Benedict XVI once said, purgatory is "the soul's journey toward full communion with God." Catholics believe that our prayers, sacrifices, and Masses offered for the dead can assist them on this journey. This is not superstition—it's solidarity. Just as we help one another in life, we help one another in death.

As we begin this beautiful season, permit me to propose some practical ways for parishioners to commemorate Loved Ones. Here are a few meaningful practices:

- Attend Mass on All Souls' Day and offer it for deceased family members, friends, or forgotten souls.
- **Light a candle at home or in church** as a symbol of Christ's light and your prayer for the departed.
- Visit a cemetery and pray the Rosary or Psalm 23. The Church grants a plenary indulgence to those who do so during the first eight days of November.
- Bring a framed photograph of your deceased loved

one to place around the Altar. Let their memory be part of the Church's prayer.

- Offer acts of charity or fasting in their honor. Every sacrifice becomes a bridge of grace.
- Reserve a Tree and/or Grave blanket for your loved one this year (see reservation form in bulletin) and teach children about praying for the dead. Let them help decorate the tree or draw a picture attached to the tree or blanket.

Contribute to the Christmas Flower Memorial Fund (a separate mailing will be forthcoming) so your loved one will be remembered at ALL the Christmas Masses and throughout the Christmas Season.

These practices are not morbid—they are expressions of love. They remind us that death is not a wall, but a doorway.

Years ago, a priest was asked to bless a grave of a young mother who had died suddenly. Her husband stood beside the grave, holding their toddler daughter. After the prayers, the little girl looked up and asked, "Is Mommy sleeping?" The priest knelt down and said, "She's resting in God's love. And one day, when Jesus calls, she'll wake up smiling."

That is our faith. That is our hope. All Souls' Day is not a day of endings—it's a day of longing, of prayer, and of love that reaches beyond the grave. May our prayers rise like incense, and may our hearts remain tethered to those we love, in Christ who conquered death.




