

From the Pastor's Desk



Week 2 – Prepare the Way: The Advent of Repentance Gospel: Matthew 3:1–12

A family once prepared their home for a long-awaited guest—a beloved grandmother returning after years abroad. They didn't just tidy up. They deep-cleaned, rearranged furniture,

painted the front door, and even planted flowers in the dead of winter. "We wanted her to feel how much we missed her," they said. Their preparation wasn't just physical—it was emotional, relational, spiritual.

The second Sunday of Advent brings us to the wilderness, where John the Baptist cries out: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" (Mt 3:2). His voice is not gentle—it's urgent, fiery, and direct. He calls for conversion, not comfort. He warns of axes at the root and unquenchable fire. His message is clear: if you want to welcome the Messiah, you must prepare the way.

John's ministry echoes the prophets. He is not interested in appearances—he wants transformation. He challenges the Pharisees and Sadducees, and calls them a brood of vipers. He demands action, not just words. Repentance, for John, is not about shame—it's about readiness. It's about clearing the clutter so Christ can enter.

Last week, the liturgical theme was a call to "wake up." This week, it is a call to "clean house." The two themes are connected because "Watchfulness" leads to "Repentance"—a turning of heart, a clearing of space, a reordering of priorities. Advent is not just about preparing our homes—it's always about preparing our souls. So how do we live this repentance? First, go to Confession. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is not a burden—it's a gift. It is where we lay down our sins and receive mercy. The Sacrament is celebrated every Wednesday at 7 PM. Second, clean one physical space in your home as a spiritual act—your prayer corner, your dining table, your front door. Let that cleaning be a symbol of interior renewal.

In your Hope Journal, (see last week's article) add a "Repentance Reflection" each day: one thing you choose to let go of, and one virtue you choose to embrace. It could be impatience, gossip, distraction—or generosity,


silence, prayer. Ask the Holy Spirit to give you the grace and strength to embrace this new virtue.

Repentance is not about guilt, It is always about grace. It's about making room for the One who comes. It's about preparing the way—not just with garlands and gifts, but with humility and holiness.

The family who prepared for their grandmother didn't just clean—they transformed their home into a place of welcome. This week, do the same. Prepare the way—not just for a holiday, but for the Holy One.



LEGION OF MARY




