# From the Pastor's Desk



Week 3 – Are You the One?: The Advent of Joyful Expectation

Gospel: Matthew 11:2–11

A child once asked his mother, "Will Christmas come faster if I smile more?" She chuckled at the question, but the boy was serious. "Because I think Jesus likes

Joy," he said. His words, simple and sincere, carried wisdom beyond his years. In that moment, he wasn't just anticipating presents or parties—he was longing for something deeper. He believed that Joy could hasten the coming of Christ.

This third Sunday of Advent is Gaudete Sunday—"Rejoice!" The rose candle is lit, the vestments this week are also rose (not pink, please), and the Church pauses in its penitential waiting to breathe in Joy. But this Joy is not shallow. It's not the glitter of sentiment or the distraction of holiday noise. It's the Joy that comes from knowing that God is near—even when life is hard.

The Gospel opened with a surprising scene. John the Baptist, the fiery prophet who had boldly proclaimed the coming of the Messiah, is now imprisoned. His voice, once booming in the wilderness, is now muffled behind stone walls. And he sends messengers to Jesus with a question that trembles with vulnerability: "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" (Mt 11:3).

This question is startling. John had baptized Jesus. He had seen the heavens open and heard the voice of the Father. Yet now, in the darkness of confinement, he wonders. Has he misunderstood? Is Jesus truly the One?

Jesus responds not with rebuke, but with reassurance. "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them." (Mt 11:4–5). These are not just miracles—they are signs that the Kingdom is breaking in. Jesus doesn't offer a theological treatise. He offers evidence of grace. (Note: Many of the prophets prophesied that when the Messiah comes, the blind will see, the lame will walk, etc).

After, Jesus turned to the crowd and praised John: "Among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist." (Mt 11:11). He affirmed John's role, his courage, his prophetic mission. Even in doubt, John is honored. Even in weakness, he is beloved. This Gospel is tender and powerful. It reminds us that Joy is not the absence of struggle—it's the presence of Christ. John's question didn't disqualify him. It drew him deeper into the mystery. And Jesus met him there—not with condemnation, but with compassion.

This week builds on the two previous themes of watchfulness and repentance. In Week 1, we lit the candle of vigilance and made a commitment to awaken ourselves to God's presence. In Week 2, we cleared space through repentance, to make room for grace. Now, in Week 3, we rejoice—not because the waiting is over, but because the waiting is holy. Joy is the fruit of a heart that has been awakened and cleansed. It's the song that rises when we realize that God is near—not just in Bethlehem, but in our brokenness, our questions, our longing.

So how do we live this Joy? First, choose one Joyful act each day. It could be singing a favorite hymn, writing a note of encouragement, sharing a meal, or simply smiling at someone who needs it. Joy is contagious. It multiplies when shared.

Second, wear or display something rose-colored this week. Let it be a visible sign of your interior celebration. Let it remind you that Joy is part of your spiritual wardrobe. Don't forget, Father Infanti and I will be watching.:) Third, continue your Hope Journal. This week, add a "Joy Entry" each day: one moment of beauty, laughter, or grace. It could be a sunrise, a child's giggle, a Scripture verse, or a moment of peace. These entries become a litany of light—a record of how Joy breaks into our lives. Fourth, reflect on where you are tempted to despair. Like John, we may have questions. We may feel imprisoned by circumstances, grief, or fear. Bring those places to prayer. Ask Jesus, "Are You the One?" And listen for His answer—not in thunder, but in tenderness.

Finally, remember that Joy is a discipline. It's not always spontaneous. Sometimes it must be chosen, cultivated, and protected. It requires silence, gratitude, and trust. It grows in the soil of prayer and service.

January. Thank you for sharing your gifts and talents throughout the year by making casseroles for the homeless. Your kindness makes a lasting difference.


#### THE GIVING TREE




