

From the Pastor's Desk



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK (ADVENT Week 4) DO NOT BE AFRAID: The Advent of Trust Gospel: Matthew 1:18–24

A young couple once shared the story of their adoption journey. After years of infertility and prayer, they received a call: a newborn

baby girl was waiting for placement. But there was a catch—the birth mother had changed her mind twice already. The couple was told not to get their hopes up. Still, they drove across the state, prepared a nursery, and waited. "We didn't know what would happen," the wife said, "but we knew we had to say yes to love, even if it broke our hearts."

That posture—saying yes without guarantees—is the heart of this final week of Advent. This week we focus on the theme of trust. The Gospel brings us to Joseph, a man caught in a moment of crisis. He learns that Mary, his betrothed, is pregnant—and not by him. In a culture where betrothal was legally binding, this news would have felt like betrayal. Joseph, described as "a righteous man," decides to divorce her quietly, sparing her public shame.

But the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, and said: "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her." (Mt 1:20). The angel revealed the divine plan—and Joseph responded not with words, but with obedience. He took Mary into his home. He named the child Jesus. He trusted, even when he didn't know what would happen.

This Gospel is the hinge of Advent. It moves us from preparation to incarnation. Joseph's trust opens the door for Emmanuel—God with us. His "yes" was quiet but decisive. He certainly did not understand everything, but he believed enough to act. His obedience allowed the mystery of the Incarnation to unfold.

So, let us reflect on how this fits into our Advent journey. In Week 1, we were called to watchfulness—to stay awake and alert to God's presence. In Week 2, we embraced repentance—clearing space in our hearts for grace. In Week 3, we rejoiced—choosing joy even in

uncertainty. Now, in Week 4, we are invited to trust—to surrender our plans and embrace God's plan for us.

Trust is the culmination of Advent. It's the fruit of vigilance, repentance, and joy. It's not blind optimism—it's faithful surrender. It's the decision to say yes to God, even when the path is unclear. Joseph's trust didn't make the situation easier—but it made it holy. His obedience didn't remove the mystery—but it welcomed the Messiah. He didn't speak—but his actions proclaimed faith.

So how do we live this trust? First, reflect on one area of your life where God is asking for trust. It might be a relationship, a decision, a grief, or a hope. Bring that area to prayer. Ask for the grace to say yes, even without full understanding.

Second, place a small image of St. Joseph near your Advent wreath or prayer space. Let his silent strength guide you. Let his example remind you that holiness often looks like quiet courage.

Third, continue your Hope Journal. This week, add a "Trust Entry" each day: one place where you chose faith over fear. It might have been a moment of patience, a step of generosity, or a decision to forgive. These entries remind you that trust is not abstract—it is lived.

Fourth, pray a daily "Fiat" prayer: "Let it be done to me according to Your word." This prayer, echoing Mary's response, becomes your own posture of surrender. It's a way of saying, "I don't have all the answers, but I trust the One who does."

Finally, prepare for Christmas not just with decorations, but with devotion. Let your home reflect the trust of Joseph and Mary. Let your heart be open to the unexpected ways Christ may come.

The couple who adopted the baby girl didn't know how the story would end. But they chose love over fear. They chose trust over control. And when they held their daughter for the first time, they said, "This is what grace looks like."

This is your invitation this week...Trust that grace is coming. Believe that Emmanuel is not just a name, but a reality. God is with us—in our questions, our waiting, and our surrender.

MEN'S PRAYER GROUP




Breakfast Bags for St. Joseph's Winter Shelter **Atlantic City**

A Message about Waiting from the Sisters of Life

Waiting for God by Sr. Lumen Gloriae, SV

One place where it can be difficult to let God love us is in waiting: waiting for something to change, waiting for suffering or difficulty to pass, waiting to understand what God is about in our lives. Our hearts have been made for God, to be filled by Him.

Each of us have been created with a need for God that we cannot satisfy ourselves. We radically encounter this in our waiting. We each have the capacity for big desires, big hopes and dreams, both for ourselves and those around us. When our desires seem to go unfulfilled — especially our good desires for ourselves and those we love — the waiting itself can be a suffering. The world we live in tends to reject suffering as meaningless, hopeless, useless.

So it might come as a surprise to us that the Spanish word for "to wait" ("esperar") is the root of the word "hope" ("esperanza"). Hope is the "sure and steadfast anchor of the soul...that enters... where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf"; "it affords us joy even under trial: 'Rejoice in your hope, be patient in tribulation'" (The Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1820). God wants to be with you in the waiting, to love you right there. And His presence with us is what instills meaning and hope in that very place, because it helps us to keep our eyes fixed on our end, which is the joy of heaven, forever. Sometimes, though, we cannot easily perceive His presence with us; He seems silent. When He doesn't seem to be responding, when He doesn't seem to be moving, it doesn't mean He isn't close to us.

In the Old Testament, even though Israel waited on the Lord for hundreds of years to free them from the grip of Egypt and slavery, God had never abandoned them. He wanted Moses to tell the people of Israel about His care for them: "I am concerned about you and about the way you are being treated in Egypt; so I have decided to lead you up out of the misery of Egypt into...a land flowing with milk and honey" (Ex 3:16-17).

And today He cares for you just as He cared for Israel. Mary can teach us how to wait, how to keep our hearts and hands open to receive what God desires to give, when He desires to give it. His timing can seem mysterious to us, just as it was mysterious to Mary, who "kept all these things, pondering them in her heart" (Lk 2:19). But she believed in God's promises, that He would do great things for her, even as she waited for His plan to be revealed in time. God's love casts out all fear (cf. 1 Jn: 4:18). He brings about redemption and makes all things new.

Today, we can make an act of trust in God's goodness and care for us, even if we don't yet see what He is doing. Little acts of faith, hope, love, and trust in God pave the way for even greater graces in our lives. They may not "solve the problem" of the suffering we encounter in waiting, but they open up a greater capacity for receiving God's presence with us, and they increase our capacity for joy when we do encounter God's work in the midst of suffering.


Wherever you are, whatever you're going through, the Lord is calling you to something new, and says, "Take courage!" You are made for God; you are made to be with Him in all things. Place all your hope in God, because He alone can satisfy.

The Secret of Marian Waiting by Sr. Mary Grace, SV

It's easy to be discouraged in times of waiting, to dread the wait — or to waste the wait worrying. But Mary shows us waiting isn't time wasted — it's the secret to her life.

- Mary waited upon His Word, which directed the course of her entire existence.
- God promised a Son, and she waited for Him to come.
- He came, and she waited for Him to grow.
- Growing, He went off on mission, and she waited for Him to return.
- Going off, He went to His death, and she waited upon His last breath.
- Upon His death, she waited to be reunited at the Resurrection.
- After the Ascension, she waited for the Spirit to be poured out at Pentecost.
- Mary taught the disciples to wait, and the fire of His Spirit fell.
- The Church was born and grew by waiting for the Spirit's directives.
- Mary waited for the final reunion with her Son forever.

Would we dare wonder whether the life of the most spiritually powerful woman in the world was wasted in waiting? In the waiting, God is doing His deepest work. Do not underestimate the power of pondering His plans unfolding, pondering what He is about. Do not be afraid to wait on the Lord. In waiting, God is doing His deepest work.
