From the Pastor's Desk



FROM THE PASTOR's DESK:

Every year, on the Sunday after Christmas, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. It is a reminder that the Incarnation did not take place in isolation, but within the context of family life. Jesus was born into a household, nurtured by parents, and raised in the ordinary rhythms of human existence.

The Gospel for this feast (Matthew 2:13–15, 19–23) recounts one of the most difficult moments in the life of the Holy Family: the flight into Egypt. Joseph is warned in a dream to take Mary and the child Jesus and flee, because Herod seeks to destroy the child. They become refugees, forced to leave behind home, security, and familiarity. Later, after Herod's death, they return, but even then Joseph must discern carefully where to settle, choosing Nazareth to protect his family.

This is not a story of ease or comfort. It is a story of struggle, uncertainty, and resilience. And it is precisely here that the Holy Family becomes a model for our families today.

The Holy Family faced challenges that resonate with us. First, they experienced **economic hardship**: They were poor. Jesus was born in a stable, not a palace. Their resources were limited. Second, they experienced **political danger**: Herod's violence forced them to flee. They lived under threat, navigating the dangers of power and oppression. Third, they experienced **displacement**: They became migrants, strangers in a foreign land, far from home and kin. And last, they experienced **daily uncertainty**: Joseph had to discern God's will through dreams, making decisions that carried enormous weight for his family's safety.

These struggles remind us that holiness does not mean *freedom from difficulty*. Holiness means *faithfulness amid difficulty*.

Today, families experience their own set of challenges: There are **economic pressures**: Rising costs, job insecurity, and financial stress weigh heavily on households. There are **social and cultural pressures**: Families navigate a

world of conflicting values, where faith can be marginalized. Some experience **displacement and mobility**: Many families move frequently for work, education, or safety, often far from extended family support. And several live in **uncertainty and fear**: Illness, broken relationships, and global instability create anxiety about the future.

Like the Holy Family, our families are not immune to hardship. Yet the Feast of the Holy Family reminds us that God is present during these struggles. The Gospel today shows us how Jesus, Mary, and Joseph dealt with their struggles: First, they placed their total **trust in God's guidance**: Joseph listened to the angel in his dreams. He trusted that God was speaking, even when the path was unclear. *Families today are invited to listen for God's voice*—in prayer, in Scripture, in the wisdom of the Church—and to trust that God will guide them.

The Holy Family became a family committed to **sacrificial love**. Joseph protected Mary and Jesus at great personal cost. Mary embraced the uncertainty of exile to safeguard her child. Their love was not self-centered, but self-giving. Families today are called to love sacrificially—to put the good of one another above convenience, to forgive, to serve, to protect.

We learn from the Holy Family how to be **resilient during hardship**. The Holy Family did not give up when faced with danger. They adapted, moved, and persevered. Families today must cultivate resilience, finding strength in faith, community, and hope, even when life is difficult.

The Holy Family models for us **faithfulness in the ordinary**. After returning from Egypt, they settled in Nazareth. There, Jesus grew up in the ordinary rhythms of family life—work, meals, prayer, community. Holiness is not only in dramatic moments, but in daily faithfulness. Families today are called to sanctify the ordinary—meals shared, prayers offered, chores done with love.

The Holy Family teaches us several lessons about family life: First, **God is with us in struggle**. Holiness is not about escaping difficulty, but about finding God in it. Second, **Family life is a vocation**. Just as Joseph and Mary embraced their calling, so too are families called to live their vocation with courage and love. And third, **Faith is practical**. Listening, trusting, loving, and persevering. These are not abstract ideas, but daily practices that sustain family life.

From the Pastor's Desk

To help sustain our own families, **consider this story for reflection:** Imagine Joseph, weary from travel, holding the reins of the donkey as Mary cradles the infant Jesus. They are entering Egypt, tired, uncertain, and afraid. Yet at that moment, they are together. Their love for one another and their trust in God carry them forward.

Now imagine a modern family, perhaps a mother working two jobs, a father caring for aging parents, children navigating school pressures. They too are weary. Yet when they gather at the dinner table, share a prayer, or support one another, they are living the same faithfulness as the Holy Family.

The struggles are different, but the response is the same: trust, love, resilience, and faith.

The Feast of the Holy Family is not about idealized perfection. It is about real people facing real struggles with faith

and love. Jesus, Mary, and Joseph show us that holiness is possible amid hardship.

As we celebrate this feast, let us ask: How can we **listen more attentively** to God's guidance in our family decisions? How can we **love more sacrificially**, putting others first? How can we **cultivate resilience**, finding strength in faith when life is hard? How can we **sanctify the ordinary moments of family life**, making them places where Christ dwells?

If we follow the example of the Holy Family, our families too can become places of holiness, joy, and peace. With a loving and grateful heart,


MSGR. MARUCCI'S HUMOR BOX
