

### FROM THE PASTOR's DESK: The Five Kings of the Christmas Story: An Epiphany Reflection

On the Feast of the Epiphany, the Church invites us to linger a little longer at the manger—not simply to admire the beauty of the scene, but to contemplate the deeper mystery unfolding before us.

The Gospel for this feast, Matthew 2:1–12, introduces us to the Magi, those mysterious visitors from the East who followed a star to Bethlehem. Tradition has long referred to them as “kings,” and over the centuries their names—Melchior, Caspar, and Balthazar—have become familiar to Christian imagination.

But the Epiphany story actually contains **five kings**. Three arrive bearing gifts. One sits on a throne in fear. And one lies in a manger, the true King of the Universe. Each reveals something about the human heart, and each invites us to respond to Christ in our own lives.

**Melchior, Caspar, and Balthazar are known as the “Seeking Kings.”** The Scriptures tell us very little about the Magi. Matthew does not name them, number them, or call them kings. Yet from the earliest centuries, Christian tradition filled in the details—not to replace the Gospel, but to help us meditate on the mystery of God drawing all nations to Himself.

Tradition describes **Melchior** as an elderly king with a long white beard, coming from Persia. He is said to have brought **gold**, the gift offered to a **king**. Gold symbolizes dignity, authority, and honor. Melchior represents the human longing to find a ruler worthy of our trust—a king who governs not by force, but by love.

**Caspar (or Gaspar)** is often portrayed as a young man from India. His gift is **frankincense**, the aromatic resin burned in worship. Frankincense symbolizes prayer rising to heaven, acknowledging the **divinity** of the Christ Child. Caspar reminds us that every human heart is made for worship, and that our deepest peace comes when we bow before the One who made us.

**Balthazar** is traditionally depicted as a king from Arabia or Ethiopia, who brings **myrrh**, a burial ointment. Myrrh foreshadows the **suffering and death** of Jesus. It is a startling gift for a newborn, yet it reveals a profound truth: **the child in the manger came not only to live among us, but to die for us.** Balthazar represents the human con-

frontation with mortality—and the hope that God has entered even death to redeem it.

Whether these details are historical or legendary matters less than the spiritual truth they convey. The Magi are symbols of every person who seeks God with sincerity. They remind us that faith often begins with a question, a longing, a star that stirs the heart. They show us that God meets us where we are and leads us, step by step, to the place where He reveals Himself.

The **fourth king** in the Epiphany story is **Herod**, a man whose name has become synonymous with paranoia and cruelty. Yet Herod was not without strengths. He was a capable administrator, a builder of cities, a protector of trade routes, and a shrewd political survivor. He rebuilt the Temple in Jerusalem with breathtaking grandeur. But Herod’s strengths were overshadowed by his deepest flaw: **fear**. He feared losing power. He feared rivals. He feared the judgment of others. And when the Magi arrived asking, “Where is the newborn king of the Jews?”, Herod’s fear turned deadly.

**Herod teaches us that the greatest obstacle to encountering Christ is not ignorance, but fear—the fear of losing control, the fear of change, the fear that God’s plan might not match our own.** Herod knew the Scriptures. He consulted the chief priests. He even told the Magi to search diligently for the child. But he never went to Bethlehem himself. Fear kept him from taking the five-mile journey that could have changed his life. Herod stands as a warning: the same Christ who draws the humble can unsettle the proud. The same light that guides the seeking can expose the shadows we cling to. Epiphany asks us: **Do we approach Christ like the Magi—with openness—or like Herod—with resistance?**

And then there is the fifth king—the only true king in the story—**Jesus Christ: The King of the Universe.** . He reigns not from a palace but from a manger. His throne is a feeding trough. His courtiers are shepherds. His first visitors are foreigners. Everything about His kingship overturns human expectations. Jesus is the King who comes not to take, but to give. Not to dominate, but to serve. Not to demand gifts, but to offer Himself as the greatest gift of all.

The Magi knelt before Him because they recognized what Herod could not: that true kingship is found in humility, mercy, and love. The Epiphany reveals Jesus as the Light of the Nations, the fulfillment of every longing, the One who draws all peoples to Himself.

## From the Pastor's Desk

One of the most beautiful Epiphany traditions is the blessing of homes by marking the door with blessed chalk. You will see it written like this above the doors of the church as you exit.

**20 + C + M + B + 25** Many assume the letters stand for **Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar**, but the Church teaches that they actually represent the Latin phrase: **Christus Mansionem Benedicat - "May Christ bless this home."**

The numbers mark the year. The crosses remind us of Christ's protection. The letters proclaim that every household is meant to be a place where Christ is welcomed, honored, and loved.

This simple ritual is a powerful reminder that the journey of the Magi continues in us. Just as they opened their treasures to Christ, we open our homes and hearts to Him. Just as they followed the light of a star, we follow the light of faith. Just as they returned home "by another route," we too are changed when we encounter the living God.

The Feast of the Epiphany invites us to reflect on which king we resemble. Are we like the Magi—seeking, open, generous? Are we like Herod—fearful, resistant, clinging to control?

Or are we striving to be like Christ—the King who reigns through love? May this Epiphany renew our desire to seek the Lord, to welcome Him into our homes, and to let His light guide our steps. And may the blessing written on our doorposts be written even more deeply on our hearts: **Christus Mansionem Benedicat. May Christ bless this home—and every soul within it.**


