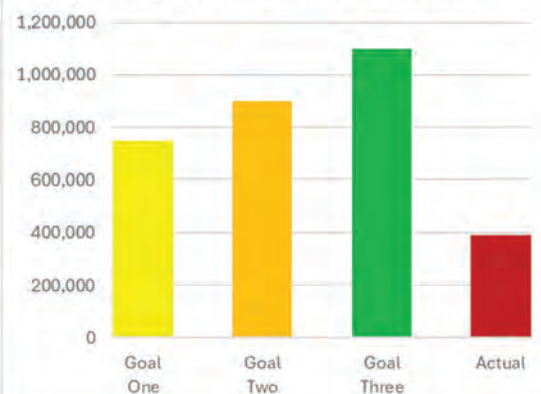

**FROM THE PASTOR'S
DESK: Feast of the
Baptism of the Lord
Gospel: Matthew 3:13–17**

This weekend we celebrate the **Feast of the Baptism of the Lord**, the final feast of the Christmas Season and the doorway into Ordinary Time. It is a moment in the liturgical year that often passes quietly, yet it carries profound meaning for our spiritual lives.

Christmas has filled our hearts with the wonder of the Incarnation—God becoming one of us. **Epiphany** revealed Christ to the nations. And now, *in the waters of the Jordan River*, Jesus steps into public ministry, revealing not only who He is, but who we are called to be.

In today's Gospel from Matthew, Jesus approaches John the Baptist at the Jordan and asks to be baptized. John is understandably confused. "I need to be baptized by you," he says, "and yet you are coming to me?" But Jesus insists: "Allow it now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." And so, John consents. As Jesus rises from the water, the heavens open, the Spirit descends like a dove, and the Father's voice proclaims: **"This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."**

This moment is not simply a historical event; it is a revelation. Jesus, who is without sin, does not enter the waters for His own sake. He enters them for ours. He steps into the muddy river to sanctify the waters of baptism for all generations. He identifies Himself with humanity so that humanity may be united with God. In this single moment, the Trinity is revealed, the mission of Christ is inaugurated, and the path of discipleship is illuminated.

The Baptism of the Lord also marks a shift in the rhythm of our liturgical life. With this feast, the Christmas Season officially concludes. The decorations come down, the nativity scenes are carefully packed away, and the familiar green of Ordinary Time returns to our sanctuaries. But "ordinary" in the Church never means "unimportant." Ordinary Time is the season in which we walk with Christ through His ministry—His teachings, His miracles, His encounters with the poor, the sick, the lost, and the searching. It is the season in which we learn what it means to follow Him day by day, step by step, in the ordinary mo-

ments of our lives.

This year, Ordinary Time will continue until **Tuesday, February 17**, the day before Ash Wednesday, when we will enter the penitential season of Lent. These weeks between Christmas and Lent are a gift—an opportunity to reflect on our own baptismal identity and to prepare our hearts for the journey toward Easter.

The Baptism of the Lord invites us to remember our own baptism—not as a distant event recorded in a family photo album, but as a living reality. At our baptism, the same words spoken over Jesus were spoken over us in a spiritual sense: **"You are my beloved."** We were claimed for Christ, sealed with the Holy Spirit, and welcomed into the family of God. Our baptism was not simply a ritual; it was a calling. It marked the beginning of our mission as disciples.

And so this feast challenges us to ask: **How am I living my baptism today?**

Do I remember that I am God's beloved? Do I allow the Holy Spirit to guide my decisions, my relationships, my priorities? Do I bring Christ into the ordinary moments of my life—my work, my family, my conversations, my choices?

Jesus' baptism also teaches us something essential about humility and obedience. He did not need baptism, yet He chose it. He aligned Himself with sinners, not because He shared their sin, but because He shared their humanity. He entered the waters to show us that God meets us where we are—not in perfection, but in our need. And He shows us that holiness begins with surrender: "Let it be so now." These are words we can carry into the new season ahead.

As we move into Ordinary Time, we are invited to embrace the quiet, steady work of discipleship. **Christmas** dazzles us with angels and shepherds, **Epiphany** shines with the brilliance of the star. But **Ordinary Time** teaches us how to live the Christian life in the everyday—how to *pray* when life is busy, how to *love* when it is difficult, how to *forgive* when it feels impossible, how to serve when no one is watching. It is in these ordinary moments that holiness takes root.

This weekend is also a wonderful time for families to talk about baptism. Parents can share the story of their children's baptism—who was there, what it meant, why it matters. Godparents can reach out to their godchildren with a note or a prayer. Adults can reflect on the promises

made at their own baptism and renewed at every Easter Vigil: to reject sin, to believe in God, and to follow Christ. These simple acts help us reconnect with the grace that continues to shape our lives.

May these weeks before Lent be a time of quiet growth, steady faith, and renewed purpose. And may the words

spoken by the Father at the Jordan echo in our hearts throughout the season ahead: **"You are my beloved."**

Building Up the House of the Lord: Now Is the Moment to Respond

As we continue our ***Building Up the House of the Lord*** Capital Campaign, I want to express my heartfelt gratitude to the 75 parish families who have already stepped forward in faith. Their generosity has brought us to **\$375,650 in pledges**—a remarkable testament to their commitment and love for our parish. This means we are now **halfway to our Tier I goal of \$750,000**, the level that will enable us to begin the essential first phase of our project, namely, the expansion of the gathering space and the addition of a community center to the church.

But to move forward, we truly need *every household* to participate.

Two weeks ago, on the Fourth Sunday of Advent, I invited all parishioners to prayerfully consider their pledge and to return their commitment before Christmas and the New Year. Many have done so, but many pledge cards are still outstanding. If you have not yet responded, I kindly request that you take a moment this week to complete your pledge. Your response will make a real and measurable difference.

This campaign is not simply about buildings. It is about mission, hospitality, accessibility, and strengthening the spiritual home that forms us in Christ. When each of us offers a sacrificial gift, we join our efforts with those who built this parish before us and with those who will inherit it after us.

Now is the time for us to rise together. Now is the time to build. If parish families could repeat the pledge they made during the Catholic Strong Campaign a few years ago, that would be extraordinarily helpful. Please refer to the gift-giving grid on the brochure to determine the sacrificial gift that is right for your circumstances before God.

Joseph's House Monthly Casserole Recipe

Happy New Year!!! The management team at Joseph's House asked me to wish you all a BLESSED New Year!!!! Thank you volunteers for your continued commitment to this ministry. In addition to casseroles, we will continue collecting individual snack bags for Joseph's House clients. The next drop off for casseroles will be Thursday, January 29, 2026 from 10-11 AM. Drive up to the parish hall and a volunteer will be there in the parking area. We will hand deliver to Joseph's House later in the day. If this day and time do not work for you, we can make other arrangements. Call or text Chris Parry at 856-906-5127 with any questions and/or to confirm you will make a casserole. Prepare one or more casseroles. All donations are deeply appreciated. We will continue to use the same recipe.

Hamburger Noodle Casserole

1 lb. hamburger beef	1-cup cottage cheese
15 oz. can or jar tomato sauce	1-cup sour cream
1 medium chopped onion	12oz. egg noodles
1 cup of green pepper	2 cups Shredded Monterey Jack Cheese

Combine the hamburger, green pepper and onion and sauté until meat is cooked. Salt and pepper to taste. Add tomato sauce and simmer for 20 minutes. Cook noodles according to package directions. In another bowl combine sour cream and cottage cheese. Blend cottage cheese and sour cream mixture with the cooked noodles. Salt and pepper to taste. In a lightly greased aluminum pan spread the hamburger mixture. Next, layer the noodle mixture. Top casserole with shredded Monterey jack cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until thoroughly heated. NOTE: Please freeze the casserole, cover with aluminum foil, date and label St. Andrew's- "Hamburger Noodle Casserole."


