From the Pastor's Desk



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK: Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Blessed Are the Merciful: The Beatitudes and the House of Charity Appeal

A few years ago, a parishioner told me a story I've never forgotten. She was driving home from work on a bitterly cold January evening when she noticed a man sitting on a curb outside a convenience store. He wasn't holding a sign.

He wasn't asking for anything. He was simply sitting there, shivering, with a thin jacket pulled tightly around him. She drove past—but something tugged at her heart. She said, "Monsignor, I heard a voice inside me say, 'That's someone's son.'" She turned the car around, bought him a hot meal, and sat with him for a few minutes. When she handed him the food, he looked up and whispered, "Thank you for seeing me."

That line has stayed with me: **Thank you for seeing me.** Not "thank you for the food," but "thank you for seeing me." In today's Gospel, Jesus goes up the mountain and begins the Sermon on the Mount with the Beatitudes—those beautiful, challenging declarations of what it means to belong to the Kingdom of God. And at the heart of the Beatitudes is this truth: **God sees the ones the world overlooks. The poor in spirit. The meek. The sorrowing. The persecuted. The hungry. The forgotten. And if we want to be His disciples, then we must see them too.**

This weekend, our Diocese invites us to do precisely that through the **South Jersey Catholic Ministries Appeal**, formerly known as the **House of Charity – Bishop's Annual Appeal**. This appeal is not simply a fundraiser; **it is the Church's concrete way of seeing the people who are most easily unseen**—the poor, the vulnerable, the sick, the elderly, the disabled, the addicted, the grieving, the struggling. It is our **diocesan expression of the Beatitudes**.

Every year, the House of Charity (SJCMA) supports ministries that no single parish could sustain alone:

- Care for the poor and homeless
- Support for Catholic Charities outreach

- Assistance for struggling families
- Care for retired and infirm priests
- Hospital chaplaincy
- Support for seminarians and vocations
- Specialized ministries for those with disabilities

And countless quiet acts of mercy that never make headlines but change lives.

These are not luxuries. These are Gospel imperatives. And so today, as we hear Jesus proclaim, "Blessed are the merciful," we are invited to respond with generosity that reflects the heart of Christ.

A Word of Clarity and Love: Over the past months, we have also been engaged in our parish's **Building Up the House of the Lord Capital Campaign**, which supports the future of our parish community. Many of you have already made sacrificial pledges to that effort, and I am deeply grateful. But I must repeat what I have said from the beginning: **The House of Charity Appeal is not optional, and it must not be funded by transferring our regular offertory or our House of Charity gifts to the capital campaign.**

As I shared in my homily and letters about the Capital Campaign, if we simply shift our giving from one campaign to another, we do not increase generosity—we only move the burden. And when that happens, **it is the poor who suffer. It is the vulnerable who lose services. It is the ministries of mercy that are weakened.** **And that cannot be what we choose. The Beatitudes call us to a higher standard.** They call us to a generosity that costs something, a compassion that stretches us, a love that mirrors Christ's own.

A Season of Mercy Approaches: In just two weeks (Believe it or not), we will enter the holy season of Lent—a time when the Church invites us to pray, fast, and **give alms**. Almsgiving is not simply "charity"; it is a spiritual discipline. It is a way of loosening our grip on the things of this world so that God can loosen the grip they have on us.

In my opinion, **supporting the House of Charity is one of the most powerful ways to live the Lenten call to almsgiving.** It is a way of saying: I see the poor; I see the suffering; I see the forgotten; I see Christ in them. And I will not look away.

A Parish That Sees: When Jesus proclaimed the Beatitudes, He wasn't giving us a list of virtues to admire. He

was giving us a blueprint for discipleship. He was telling us what the Kingdom of God looks like when it takes flesh in the lives of His followers.

A parish that lives the Beatitudes is a parish that sees the ones who sit on the curb, shivering in the cold. It sees the single mother who is overwhelmed. It sees the elderly man who has no family. It sees the teenager struggling with mental health. It sees the family facing eviction. It sees the seminarian preparing for priesthood. It sees the retired priest who spent his life serving others. It sees the immigrant, the refugee, the addict, the grieving, and the lonely.

A parish that lives the Beatitudes is a parish that sees. And a parish that sees is a parish that gives.

Your Gift Matters: This weekend, I ask you—humbly, sincerely, and with great hope—to make your annual pledge to the House of Charity. Not out of guilt. Not out of obligation. *But out of love. Out of gratitude. Out of a desire to live the Gospel in a way that transforms lives.*

Your gift is a profound blessing. A blessing for someone who needs to know that **God sees them.** A blessing for

someone who needs to know that the **Church sees them.** A blessing for someone who needs to know that **you see them.** All I ask is that you simply offer what you gave to last year's Bishop's Annual Appeal. If you are not sure of the amount of your gift, please call the office or simply write "Please Repeat Last Year's Pledge" on your pledge card.

May we be a parish that hears the Beatitudes and responds with hearts full of mercy. May we be a parish that sees. And may our generosity this weekend be a sign of the Kingdom Jesus proclaims. Once again, I thank you for your profound generosity. St. Andrew the Apostle Parishioners are among the most generous in our Diocese. Thank you for helping to change people's lives.



Catechism of the Catholic Church

Discipleship: To Bear Witness to the Truth

2470 The disciple of Christ consents to "live in the truth," that is, in the simplicity of a life in conformity with the Lord's example, abiding in his truth. "If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not live according to the truth."

2471 Before Pilate, Christ proclaims that he "has come into the world, to bear witness to the truth. "The Christian is not to "be ashamed then of testifying to our Lord." In situations that require witness to the faith, the Christian must profess it without equivocation, after the example of St. Paul before his judges. We must keep "a clear conscience toward God and toward men."

2472 The duty of Christians to take part in the life of the Church impels them to act as witnesses of the Gospel and of the obligations that flow from it. This witness is a transmission of the faith in words and deeds. Witness is an act of justice that establishes the truth or makes it known. All Christians by the example of their lives and the witness of their word, wherever they live, have an obligation to manifest the new man which they have put on in Baptism and to reveal the power of the Holy Spirit by whom they were strengthened at Confirmation.
