### FROM THE PASTOR's DESK...Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Mt 5:13-16) • World Marriage Day

One winter evening, a storm rolled through our area, knocking out power. A husband and wife—married nearly forty years—lit a single candle and set it in the middle of their kitchen table. As they waited for the lights to

return, they began to talk: first about small things (the groceries they should have bought, the squeaky hinge on the back door), then about deeper things (worries for a child, gratitude for a neighbor, memories of their wedding day). What struck them later wasn't the candle itself, but what it did: it made them draw closer. They leaned across the table to be seen. They listened more tenderly because every word mattered. That little flame didn't change the storm, but it changed the room—and, for a while, it changed them. Those private moments gave the couple the incentive to reignite their relationship. After all, Marriage is a vocation that consistently requires the renewal of the spark of love.

This weekend, we celebrate World Marriage Day. On World Marriage Day, the Church honors the vocation in which so many live out this identity most intimately: the sacrament of Matrimony, where spouses become, together, a sign of Christ's faithful love. How fitting it is that Jesus gives us the image of "Salt and Light" in today's Gospel, as both are great metaphors for reflecting on the vocation of Marriage.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us, "You are the salt of the earth... You are the light of the world" (Mt 5:13-16). He doesn't say, "Try to be salt" or "Work your way up to becoming light." He declares it as a fact of grace flowing from discipleship: in Him, we already are. Salt preserves, heals, and brings out flavor; light reveals what is true and makes it possible to find our way.

*Salt* is quiet but unmistakable. You know when it's there—food comes alive—and you know when it's missing. In a Christian marriage, "salt" looks like the small, steady practices that preserve and deepen love: the humble apology after a sharp word, the hand on the shoulder before sleep, the "How can I help?" when the day runs long. These are not dramatic gestures; they are the daily "commitments" that keep love from going flat. Salt also heals. As ancient people used it to cleanse wounds, so spouses apply the healing salt of mercy—truth told in love, patience shown in weakness, courage shared in fear. Mercy doesn't erase hurt but prevents it from infecting the heart.

*Light*, too, works in quiet ways. It's not just brightness; it's direction. In marriage, "light" is the shared vision that lifts two people above mere logistics into mission. When a husband and wife pray together, even briefly, they lift their shared life into God's light. When they serve together—a meal delivered to a neighbor, a ride for a parishioner, a word of encouragement to a discouraged friend—their home becomes a lamp on a stand, not hidden but gently illuminating a corner of the world.

Let us also notice Jesus' warning: salt can lose its taste; a lamp can be hidden under a basket. In marriage, the baskets are familiar—busyness, screens, grudges, comparison, fatigue. None of these are evil, but left unchecked, they smother the flame. The good news is that the Lord never asks couples to manufacture light on their own. He invites them to receive it anew from Him, the Light of the World, and to share it generously.

On this World Marriage Day, I invite our married couples to remember the first candle lit in your story—perhaps your marriage unity candle, perhaps a small flame at a simple dinner table. Ask the Lord to fan that flame. Your witness matters. Children and grandchildren learn the Gospel not only in classrooms but by watching you forgive, laugh, endure, and begin again. Our parish grows not only through programs but also through the light of homes that practice faithful love. When you live your vows, you make the love of Jesus visible. People taste and see the goodness of the Lord in the way you

treat one another.

Here are a few simple, home-based practices to keep the "salt" fresh and the "light" shining. Try one this week; add another next week. Small acts done consistently can transform a home.

**The 10-Minute Daily Check-In.** Sit together—no phones—and ask three questions: *What was one good thing in your day? What was hard? How can I pray for you?* End with a brief prayer or a simple sign of the cross. Ten minutes, real presence.

**A Weekly Gratitude Note.** Once a week, exchange a small card or text naming one concrete thing you appreciated about your spouse: *"Thanks for handling that phone call,"* or *"Your smile at dinner lifted my spirit."* Gratitude preserves love's flavor.

**Sunday Coffee (or Tea) for Two.** Choose a regular time—Sunday afternoon, perhaps—to share a quiet drink together. No agenda except to enjoy each other's company. This simple ritual re-centers the week around relationship, not just tasks.

**The Reconciliation Phrase.** Agree on a short phrase that signals *"I want to make peace"*: *"Can we start over?"* or *"I love you; can we try again?"* Use it quickly during or after conflict. The phrase lowers defenses and opens a path to mercy.

**Pray the Marriage Minute.** Hold hands and pray one Our Father, one Hail Mary, and one Glory Be for your spouse by name. If praying aloud feels new, start with silence and a shared *Amen*. God blesses the desire.

**Serve Together, Simply.** Choose one small act of service each month to do side-by-side: write notes to the homebound, straighten a pew after Mass, bring soup to a neighbor. Shared mission brightens love's lamp.

**The Screen-Free Meal.** Once a week, eat without devices or TV. Light a candle. Ask one good question: *"Where did you see God today?"* Even if the answers are ordinary, you will notice grace more often.

If your marriage is in a season of strain, please hear this: you are not alone, and the Church is for you. Ask for help early. A trusted friend, mentor couple, or counselor can help you rediscover the salt and light that may feel faint right now. Jesus does not shame flickering wicks; He gently fans them back to flame.

#### The Story of Sinulog

Sinulog is one of the Philippines' grandest and most colorful festivals. Held annually in Cebu City, it honors the Santo Niño, or the Child Jesus, and is deeply rooted in Filipino Catholic traditions. #### Historical Background

The Sinulog Festival traces its origins to the arrival of Portuguese explorer Ferdinand Magellan in 1521. According to historical accounts, Magellan gifted an image of the Santo Niño to Rajah Humabon and his wife, Hara Amihan, upon their baptism into Christianity. The image became a symbol of faith and is believed to be miraculous, sparking a deep devotion that has lasted for centuries.
